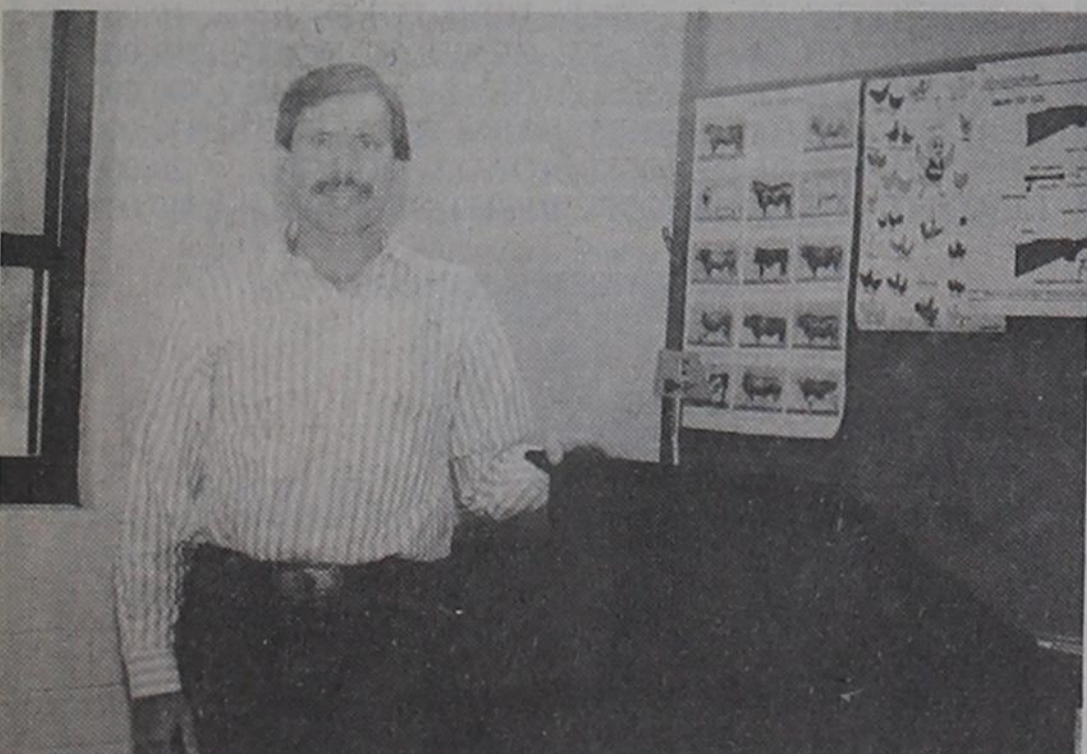

## Bovina Man Reports From Saudi Arabia

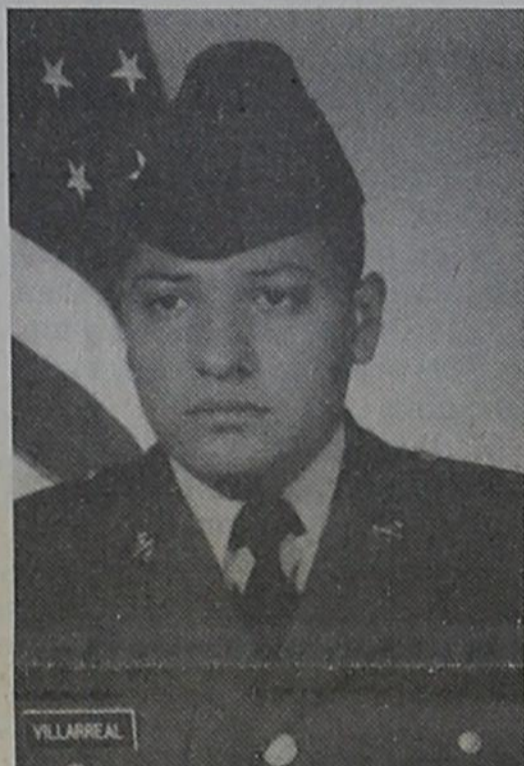

He says he is fine physically and the main problem there for the service boys is the heat, as the temperature was 130 degrees when he arrived in August but has "cooled off" to 100 degrees now.

He said the wind is always blowing and sand is hard to take. It is blowing when they go to bed and when they wake up.

The scorpions are in the sand so they have to be careful of them. It is very uncomfortable having to wear the chemical suits for their training because they are totally enclosed and very hot.

## TEAMS Test Dates Are Announced

For the past five years the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) has measured minimum basic skills in mathematics, reading and writing for students in grades three, five, seven, nine and exit.

Beginning in October, 1990, the TEAMS testing program will continue for exit level only, and a new testing program, the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS), will be implemented.

The TAAS program measures a broader range of essential elements than the TEAMS program. It also better addresses the academic goals of the 1990s, which stresses the importance of teaching students higher-order thinking skills.

As required by the Texas Education Agency, the tests in mathematics, reading and writing will be administered for grades three, five, seven, nine and exit level in all school districts in the state. For all levels the writing test will be administered on October 16, the reading test on October 17 and the mathematics test on October 18.

Students who are eligible to take the TEAMS will be administered the English language arts test on October 17 and the mathematics test on October 18. No make-up sessions will be allowed for any TAAS or TEAMS test.

## Commodity Distribution Is Slated

Commodity distribution for those qualifying will be held on Thursday, October 18 at the County Barn at North and Boyce Streets, according to Commissioner Tom Ware.

Distribution will begin at 8 a.m., with the elderly and handicapped to be served first. Those receiving the items are asked to bring their own paper sacks.

This is the first distribution of commodities in the county since last June.

## Fire Department Gives School Demonstration

This is "Fire Prevention Week" in Texas and in Texas alone, there were 300 lives lost and more than \$1 billion dollars in property damages during the calendar year 1989.

"Fire continues to be a major threat to all Texans, particularly the very young and the very old," according to chairman of the State Board of Insurance.

Much of the tragic loss could have been prevented. We have the knowledge and technology today to prevent much of the needless loss of lives and property in our town and state. All of us are urged to practice fire prevention every day to help conserve our resources.

The Bovina Fire Department members were busy Monday of this week teaching the youngsters about how fire extinguishers on the fire trucks work. They gave a demonstration at Ridgelea and again for the third and fourth graders at Bovina School.

# Saturday Rites Set For Luella Maurer

Funeral services for longtime Friona resident Luella Maurer, 89, will be held Saturday, October 13 at 11 a.m. at the Union Congregational Church in Friona. Mrs. Maurer passed away October 10 at Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo.

Officiating will be Rev. Skip Sircic of Weimar, Texas. Burial will be in Friona Cemetery, under the direction of Ellis-Blackwell Funeral Home.

Born September 24, 1901 in North Dakota, Mrs. Maurer moved to Parmer County in 1908 with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Gischler, who operated the first general store in Friona for a number of years. Gischler also opened the first grain-handling station in the area.

Luella married Carl Maurer October 10, 1924, in Amarillo. He preceded her in death in 1974.

She had attended Greeley College in Colorado and taught school several years.

An active member of the Union Congregational Church since a child, she had served as organist, choir director, Sunday School teacher and president of the Women's Fellowship.

She also had been a member of the Friona Woman's Club for over 50 years, serving as its president twice, and held district offices.

Mrs. Maurer had lived in Denver since 1982.

Also preceding her in death were two sisters, Viola Treider and Constance Walker, and a brother, Elwin Gischler.
