

WTRTC Annual Meeting Set For Tuesday, March 23 The 45th annual meeting





Officers Arrest Four In Farwell Drug Bust

information from the Parmer County Sheriff's office, county law enforcement officers made two drug busts in Farwell approximately 10:20 p.m., last weekend.

approximately 3:30 p.m. a white male was stopped by Sheriff Yerger on a suspicious traffic violation. A Parmer

Yerger said the car took three to four blocks to stop. The booking process uncovered over \$5,600 in cash on the driver who was from Clovis.

After being placed in jail, he complained of being ill and was rushed to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo where he told doctors he had ingested approximately 5-7 grams of methamphetimine just prior to being stopped.

He was treated and returned to jail pending arraignment on drug charges. The vehicle and cash were 774-8477.


