A good voter turnout for the Democratic runoff election was in evidence in Bovina, as seen by the fact that over 100 people had cast ballots before 10:30 a.m. on election day Tuesday
The total voter turnout in the Bovina precinct in the March 13 primary was 272, and 1633 people voted countywide
Under normal circumstances, only about half as many people vote in the runoffs as vote in the first primary, but with a hotly-contested judge's race in Parmer County, oters were taking exception to the rule
Bonnie Warren Howard said that the absentee vote for he runoff election in Parmer County was 157, an increase from the 95 who cast absentee votes last month.
