SD conducted its third biennia student survey of drug and alcoho abuse. The survey is administered Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, in conjunction with the Public Policy Research Institute at Texas A \& M Universtiy. A total of 193 students in
grades seven through he secondary survey and 120 students in grades four through six took the elementary survey.
