At the age of "about" 12 , When you talk to Ralph and Ruben, who will both be 70 years old in the next couple of years (and don't look like it), their facts get a little cloudy. fighting fires, they had a 1928 open cab fire truck and hauled the irehose on a trailer. "Back then", says Ruben, the siren, you just The volunteer fire departmen had one set of a coat, helmet, and boots. In 1954-55, the women's auxiliary, led by ladies like Stell went up and down the streets of Friona collecting money for the fire department.

Back then, the fire siren could be heard for a block and one-half Ralph. Ruben Taylor was Fire Chie from 1959-61. Ralph Shirley was Fire Chief from 1961-1988, wenty-seven years.

When they start remembering hings, just sit back and listen.
The meat locker fire up he city square, "what, Ralph, wenty or more years ago?".
That thing burned for three ays and nights because the walls
were two-foot thick, with redwood were two-foot thick, with redwood
sawdust in between. When that sawdust in between. When that
stuff caught fire, you couldn't put it out". It was in January and Ralph said that they couldn't put the
firehoses up because as soon as fhey stopped using them, they froze straight out. Couldn't roll them up.
Then there was the lumber yard fire in the summer. Burned hot for fire two different times.
A feedyard had a dreaded "burrfire" that burned for two days and nights too. They couldn't put n fire too. How.
Store fire, or the "cafe". Ralph and Ruben can't remember all the details, they just remember the ires. And the rescues. See, the
volunteer fire department doesn't just squirt water at flames. They get calls for rescue.
Like the time that Ralph and Ruben had to dig a body out of an
elevator cave-in. "We must have shoveled 200,000 pounds "hominy", Ralph said, trying to ge that guy out."
Another time, a guy was buried in loads of corn, and they couldn't pull him out, so they managed to him to safety.
Still another time, a man was buried to his waist in the corn. Ruben grabbed his belt, another guy grabbed Ruben's arm, someone else grabbed his arm, and so on
until they got enough people to pull the man free. "Everybody was shoveling com and pulling people", says Ruben as he leaned back in the chair, looked
at Ralph for approval, and Stella at Ralph for approval, and Stell

around with these "good old boys" again and listen to their storie he next time I won't ask any Ralph and Ruben? Well, they got a lot of stories to tell. Mostly to each other. After all, they have been good friends for more than

is practicable, skin-damasing radiation. Persons who will be out
in the sun should wear protective clothing, such as a hat, and apply
sunscreen with a protective (SPF) of at least 15 to all exposed skin who would normally begin to burn in ten minutes of sun to remain
exposed for up to 150 minutes exposed for up
without burning.
For persons at high risk for
skin cancer, sunscreen should be a part of daily hygiene. People
should also be discouraged from using artificial sources of
ultraviolet light such as those used in tanning salons.
Sunscreens come in a wide Sunscreens come in a wide
range of sun protective factors. It

peopple should use sunscreens with
