## Dwarf Apple Trees Are New Farming Enterprise <br> By JIM STEIERT

growing conditions prior expanding their acreage prior to trees of varieties acreage. Apple Ginger Gold, Carousel Braebui, and Gala are grafted to hardy root and Gala are grafted to hardy root
stocks to obtain plants small in height but long on productivity. Their test plot was covered with netting to exclude hailstones,
and small trees were and small trees were planted in
alternating rows in a $V$-trellis alternating rows in a $V$-trellis
system so that they are supported by a series of six wires anchored on pipe end posts. The idea of grafting
onto dwarf rootstock is to onto dwarf rootstock is to keep the
trees short and manageable, so that trees short and manageable, so that
fruit can be picked from ground fruit can be picked from ground
level without the need for ladders.

While full production isn' reached until about five or six years
after planting, most of Vick's trees after planting, most of Vick's trees
are carrying fruit in only their are carrying fruit in only their
second year. Fuji variety apples second year. Fuji variety apples
look especially promising for this area. Plants of that variety are surprisingly loaded with fruit. We have the right climate here, and we might be able to grow a really good apple. They are able
to withstand extreme temperatures. Early plantings in southern Texas fell victim to cotton root rot, but that's a problem we don't have here. It's possible we could grow apples with our water instead of wasting it
on growing something that we on growing something that we
don't get paid much for--like corn," says Vick.
Potentially, dwarf apples could yield three to six tons of fruit an acre only a couple of years after
planting, and up to 40 tons per acre planting, and up to 40 tons per acre
of fruit per acre at the high end of of fruit per acre at the high end of
full production. If the apples were full production. If the apples were
of sufficient quality to command $\$ 1$ a pound on the fresh market, and
yields were good, the crop could yields were good, the crop could

Vick and Todd visited Michi-
gan, Washington and Kerrville to an, Washington and Kerrville to
study apple production methods before deciding on the technique they wanted to use. They settled on V -trellis system that allows planting up to 1,200 trees per acre watered via a drip irrigation system. Rigging up to grow so many trees under an acre of netting-a virtual necessity in the hail-prone High
Plains---doesn't come cheaply. A Plains--doesn't come cheaply. A
deluxe setup including $V$-trellis, hail nets, drip irrigation system and dwarf trees, can run $\$ 20,000$ an acre. At those prices, development of the industry is understandably
slow.
Still, expansion is coming. Vick says he'll be adding 2,200 dwarf apple trees in January and February, so he will be busy this fall and winter installing pipe end
posts, trellis wires and hail netting posts, trellis wires and hail netting,
and planting the root stock that is obtained from Oregon and Washington.

"In three years, there may be 75 acres of apples in the FarwellClovis area," Vick predicts. Christian has joined several other farmers in looking ahead to a
