THE "HOLY WARS" by the television evangelists are providing a real-life soap opera this summer for those following the antics of former PTL leaders Jim and Tammy Faye Bakker.

There are those who feel that the much-publicized sex scandal in which Bakker was involved, along with the ensuing media debate, may have set the work of Christianity back by decades.

It is a definite fact that the scandal has had a big effect on contributions to TV ministries. The PTL itself announced that it was filing for protection from creditors under Chapter 11 of the bankruptcy law, in an attempt to come to grips with the organization's financial woes.

Other ministries also have been suffering. Pat Robertson's CBN ministry has laid off 500 workers, and predicted a drop of \$28 million in contributions. A spokesman for CBN called their revenue loss "Guilt by association."

The Rex Humbard Foundation of Akron, Ohio, reports a \$250,000 loss. "The evangelic public is in a state of shock," said Rex Humbard, Jr.

It was reported that radio evangelist James Dobson, who has one of the country's most widely-syndicated radio shows, had suffered losses in contributions of \$200,000 in April and \$100,000 in May.

Not all aspects of organized Christianity are hurting. Billy Graham says he has seen no drop-off in his \$60 million ministry.

But the PTL remains at the center stage of the TV-evangelist "circus," especially with the return of the Bakkers to Heritage Center, and the announcement this week that they had employed noted attorney Melvin Belli to represent them.

The addition of Belli might indicate that the Bakkers and their opponents may bring what has been a media debate into the courtroom.

Whether or not they actually go to court, it is virtually assured that the beleaguered PTL along with its current leader, Jerry Fallwell, will continue to be in the limelight for a while longer.

In spite of the scandal, the Bakkers appear to have a lot of followers in their former flock. This really has set the stage for what could be a disruptive fight involving the PTL.

Hopefully, the Bakker-PTL squabble will not be a big blow to the cause of Christianity, although it has been shown that contributions to several TV ministries have suffered greatly.

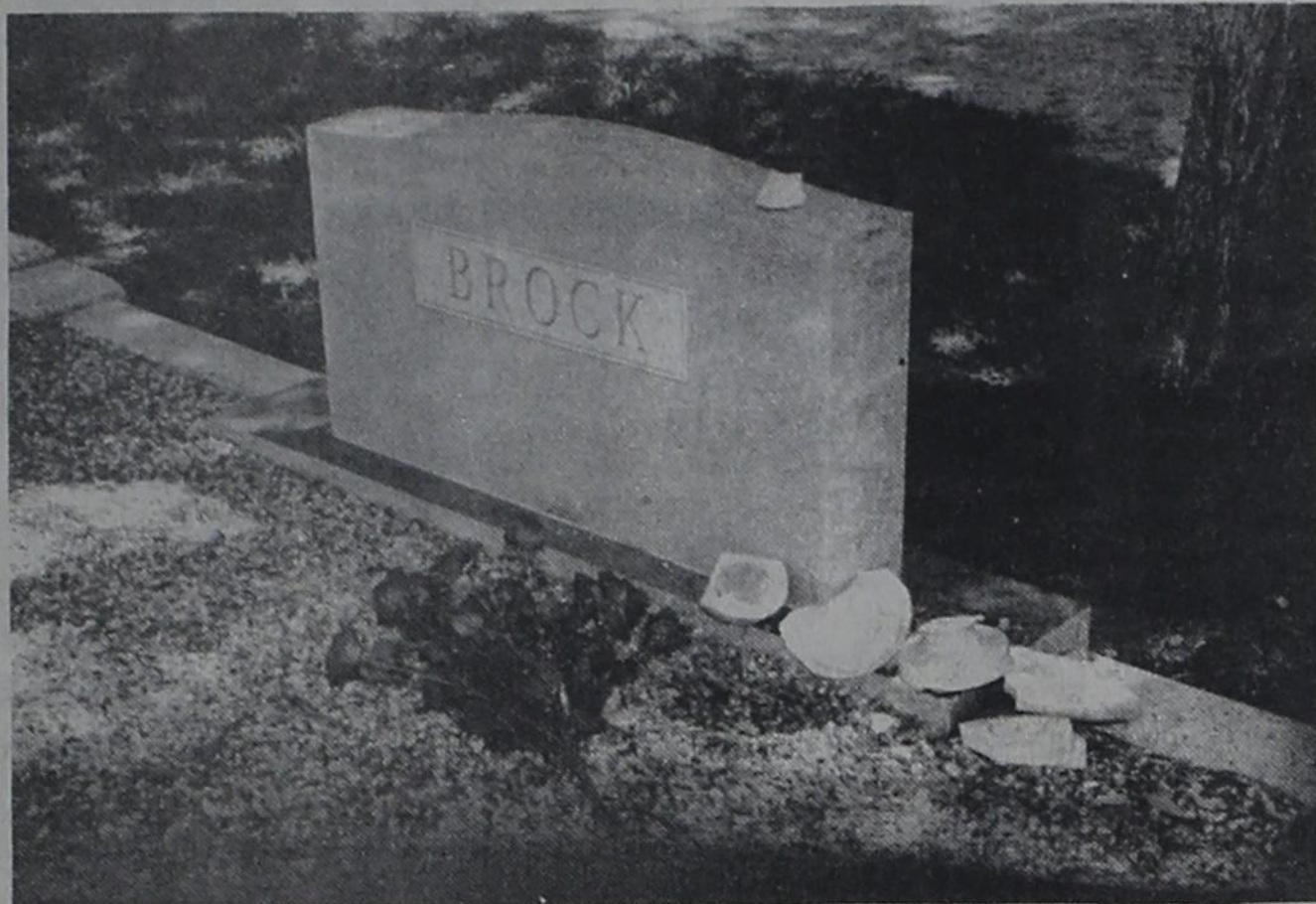

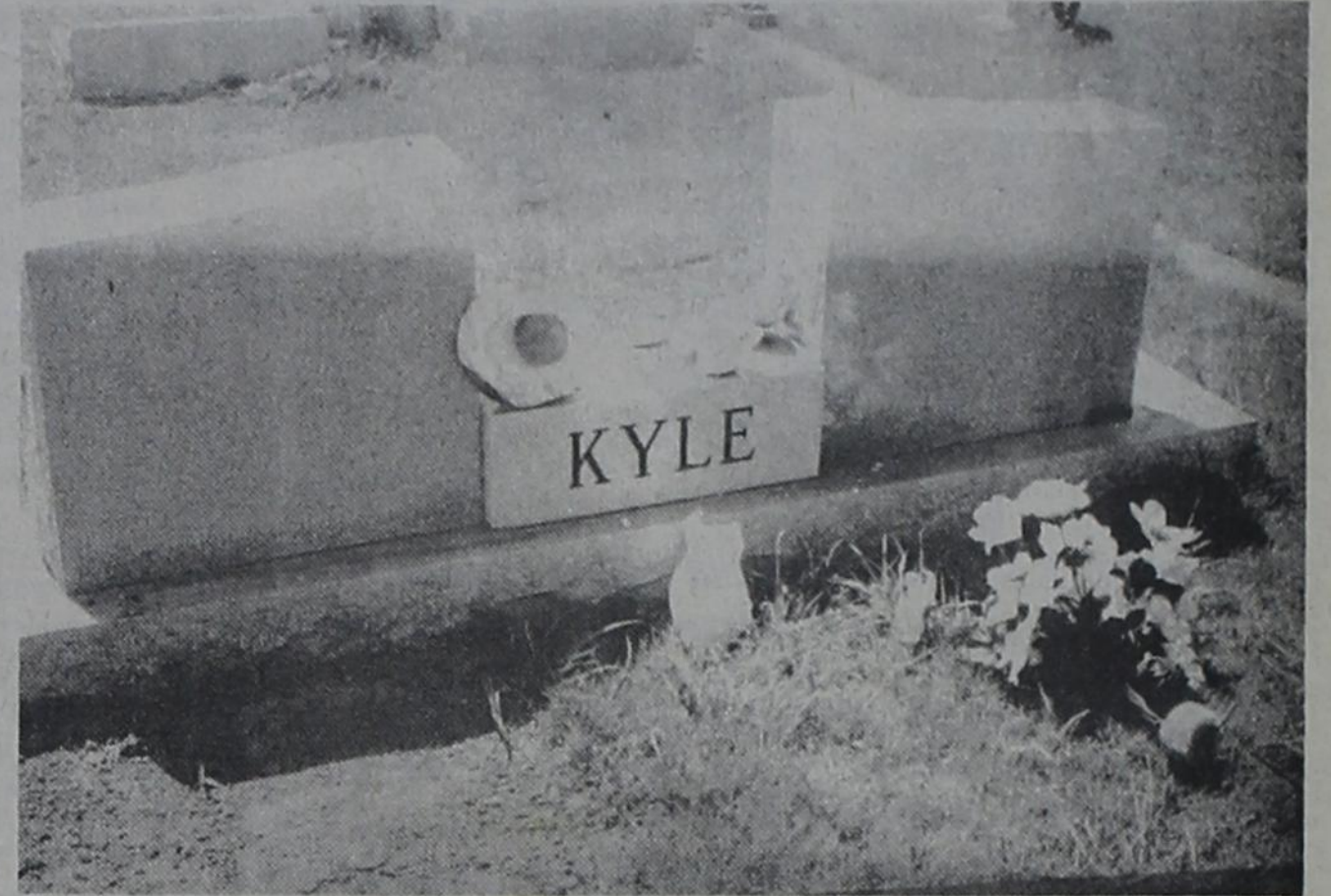
## Flags Are Taken Here

## 9-Year-Old Child Is Killed At Lazbuddie

Funeral services for David Dale Seaton, nine years old, of Lazbuddie, were held Saturday, June 20, at 3 p.m. in the Lazbuddie Methodist Church with Andy Rogers of the Church of Christ in Antlers, Oklahoma, and Rev. Larry Reed-Farris, pastor, officiating.

Burial was in the Lazbuddie Cemetery under the direction of Ellis Funeral Home of Muleshoe.

Born February 17, 1978 in Muleshoe, David was a fourth grade student at Lazbuddie. He was a member of the Methodist

Church and a life-long resident of Lazbuddie. He died Thursday, June 18, in Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona, following an accident on the family's farm at Lazbuddie. It was reported that the youngster fell from a pickup.

Survivors include his parents, Jimmie Dale and Rickie Seaton of Lazbuddie; two sisters, Sherrie Nichols of Lazbuddie and Barbie Seaton of Amarillo; one brother, Jeffery Seaton of Amarillo; his grandparents, Jimmie and Tink Seaton of Lazbuddie and Dixie Barnes of Friona.

## Fireworks Safety Urged By Group

Keep the sparkle of July Fourth celebrations in your child's eyes this year—attend a local fireworks celebration rather than risking an explosive accident that might blind, maim, or kill when fireworks are used incorrectly.

The Texas Safety Association reports that more than 8,000 persons are treated annually in hospital emergency rooms across the U.S. for fireworks-related injuries.

"Although the Texas Department of Health notes the good news that Texans avoided any deaths due to fireworks injuries in 1984 and 1985, we still need to stay doubly alert and aware of the dangers that accompany fireworks," urged Edward M. Stratton, chairman of the board for the Texas Safety Association.

"Improperly used by other than professional pyrotechnicians at

organized displays, fireworks can result in second and third degree burns, partial or total loss of sight, lacerations and fractures. The Fourth of July holiday recalls the joy of our independence as a country—it would be tragic to lose any freedom of movement due to blindness or loss of a limb through careless use of fireworks."

Stratton and professionals from other safety organizations warn that small children should not be permitted to handle any kind of fireworks. National Safety Council statistics show that approximately 45 per cent of fireworks related injuries occur among children aged 14 and younger.

Texas Safety Association urges that families enjoy the fireworks displays presented by their communities throughout the state. Celebrate the Fourth with family and friends, and keep the holiday fun and safe at the same time.

Donation for the plates will be \$4.50 and take-out plates will be 25¢ extra.

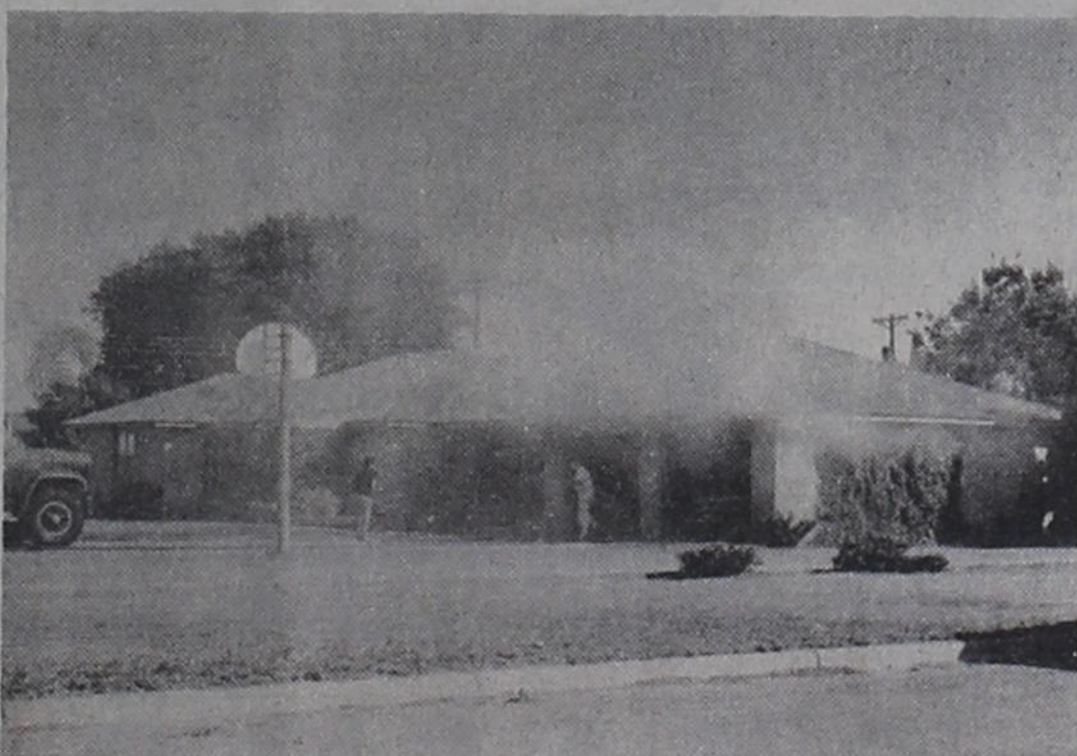
The menu will consist of beef ribs, potatoes, beans, cole slaw, bread, dessert, tea and coffee.

## Vandalism Seen At Cemetery

Officer Donnie Brown reported that he had investigated incidents at the Bovina Cemetery where several items were broken or moved. There have been four headstones turned over and four vases broken off the tombstones and one taken, which was valued at \$75.

The vandalism took place probably in the early hours on Monday morning, according to Brown. Those responsible can be arrested and convicted for destroying city property.

Brown said if the people in Bovina have relatives and loved ones buried in the cemetery, please check their graves to see if damage has been done and if so, report it.

The gates are being closed at night and those who were responsible for the mischief did so on foot. He asked that if you see anyone in the cemetery that looks suspicious, please give him a call.

## 1987 Wheat Looking Good

The 1987 wheat harvest is well underway, according to Harry Johnson of Sherley Grain.

Johnson said that so far the moisture content in the new crop has been very low, and yields have been good. He said that yields were ranging from 63 bushels to 83 bushels to the acre.

Dryland wheat is even making 50 bushels to the acre in some cases, which is exceptional.

However, the yields have varied this year, since some areas experienced freeze damage to their wheat, which affected the growth and yields.

Johnson said that yields have been better than he expected them to be, and predicted that the harvest would not last too long, since some farmers do not have as many acres as they have in the past.

The CRP program took out some wheat acres, and some farmers opted to graze their wheat out.

The main drawback, as usual, is the price of wheat, which has bounced between \$2.30 and \$2.45.

However, most farmers have not had to irrigate their wheat much during the past growing season, thanks to the good moisture last fall and the good snows during the winter.
