Care Urged In Water Activities Swimming and water sports are
popular with all age groups. The Texas Panhandle offers an extended season in which swimming can be enjoyed. From early May to midSeptember, temperatures permit
many hours of enjoyment for sunworshipers.

Many precautions must be exercised when swimming, especially in unfamiliar waters. One must
always be sure of the depth, always be sure of the depth,
undercurrents, and wildlife in the particular recreational areas.
Always provide adequate adult supervision for all children while they are enjoying the water. Eigthy per cent of all accidental drownings in
children occur from lack of supervision. In adults, ninety per cent of all accidental drownings occur from one of five categorized dangers: 1. Excessive use of alcohol prior to swimming.
2. Failure
2. Failure to observe weather 3. Excess operating boats and water crafts. 4. Failure to use flotation devi while water skiing or rafting.
5. Failure to observe warn J. Failure to observe warning signs
about environmental hazards such as undercurrents and rocky terrain under the water line.
Preventive measures can help
assure your family an accident free assure your family an accident free amer. given to all children who do not know how to swim and are likely to participate in water sports,", says Jo Moore of the Panhandle Emergency

## Farm

 El lear beetles are now elm trees, said Seth Reaction Farmer County Extensio Agent: This insect is a serious Texas. insect Feeding from this premature defoliation and trees can occur. This weakens the trees and can be particularly important in dry years like this one.While timely i While timely insecticide applications for this pest
should have been made this spring, it's still not too late to help those trees which are being excessively defoliated. The adult beetles are oval long. They are yellowish to olive-green in coloration with a black stripe along each side of the wing covers.
The female beetles lay eggs worms in a few days. The worms are nearly black in coloration and are covered with short black hairs. To protect the foliage of damage of the elm lea beetle, trees may be sprayed vith Bevin or Orthene. Mix and apply sprays according o manufacturer's direction on the label of the chemical Thorous
Tees with coverage of the spray is necessary to obtain satisfactory control of this insect
To To secure additional height and better coverage of
