You won't even have to leave good old Texas to visit some pretty exotic spots. For instance, your home state has such famous cities as Moscow, Paris, Tokio, Athens, Dublin, Iraan, Palestine, Riviera, and Italy.

But then, you can stay in the USA and still manage to visit some world-renowned places like: Cairo, Illinois; Frankfort, Maine; Syria, Virginia; Venice, Utah; Monticello, Iowa; Arab, Alabama; Zurich, Montana and Switzerland, South Carolina.

If you enjoy the excitement offered by some of the larger cities of Texas, then you might want to compare notes in Galveston, Indiana; Houston, Arkansas; or Dallas, South Dakota.

The Alamo holds a place of high regard in the hearts of all true Texans. But did you know there are towns named Alamo in eight other states? New Mexico, Indiana, Nevada, Georgia, Tennessee, Idaho, California and North Dakota.

There is a place called Pleasant Hill or Mount Pleasant in nearly every state except Hawaii. In that particular state it is called "Volcano."

Perhaps you might cool off a bit from the summer's heat in such places as Santa Claus, Indiana; Santa Claus, California; North Pole, Colorado; Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, or Christmas, Florida.

If you enjoy animal life you might want to plan a trip to Bear, Delaware; Antelope, Montana; or Chicken, Alaska.

All across the country, the little towns with double names seem to have the most character. Jack Pot, Nevada; Free Soil, Michigan; Burnt Corn, Alabama; Hungry Horse, Montana; Cut Off, Louisiana; Oil Trough, Arkansas; Dry Run, Pennsylvania; Sweet Home, Oregon; Fair Play, South Carolina; Gnow Bone, Indiana; Bedlam Corner, Connecticut; Bell Buckle, Tennessee; Overlook, Ohio; Bowlegs, Oklahoma; Mouth of Wilson, Virginia; Hot Coffee, Missouri; and of course, let us not forget Muleshoe, Texas.

These colorful names are self-explanatory for the most part, but others leave you wondering just what bit of historical (or hysterical) nonsense lies behind the naming of such places as: Peculiar, Missouri; Poverty, Kentucky; Nameless, Tennessee; Uncertain, Texas; Loco, Oklahoma; Overall, Virginia; Lovely, Kentucky; Maiden, North Carolina; Climax, Kansas; Eek, Alaska; Reform, Mississippi; Plain Dealing, Louisiana; Ho Ho Kus, New Jersey; and Passadumkeag, Maine. These are all legitimate places and can be found on the state road maps, Rand-McNally Atlas, and the Post Office Zip Code Book.

A recent travel article in the *Ford Times* publication quotes Donald Orth, of the U.S. Board of Geographic Names. "The names on maps are the language with which the nation's biography is written," Orth says. "These names paint all kinds of pictures of what has happened across the United States as it was settled."

When it comes to descriptive name of places, Texas outshines them all with: Rising Star, Veribest, Cut and Shoot, Dime Box, Pep, Energy, Bigfoot, Cross Plains, Lone Oak, Shiner, Roaring Springs, Paint Rock and Zephyr.

But I guess if you really want to get away from it all and go some place different, you can pack up and go to Hell, Michigan. Be sure to send us all a post card.

Black Belt who is the founder of the World's Martial Arts Federation. Clark is certified by the World Martial Arts Federation and World Tae Kwon Do Union.

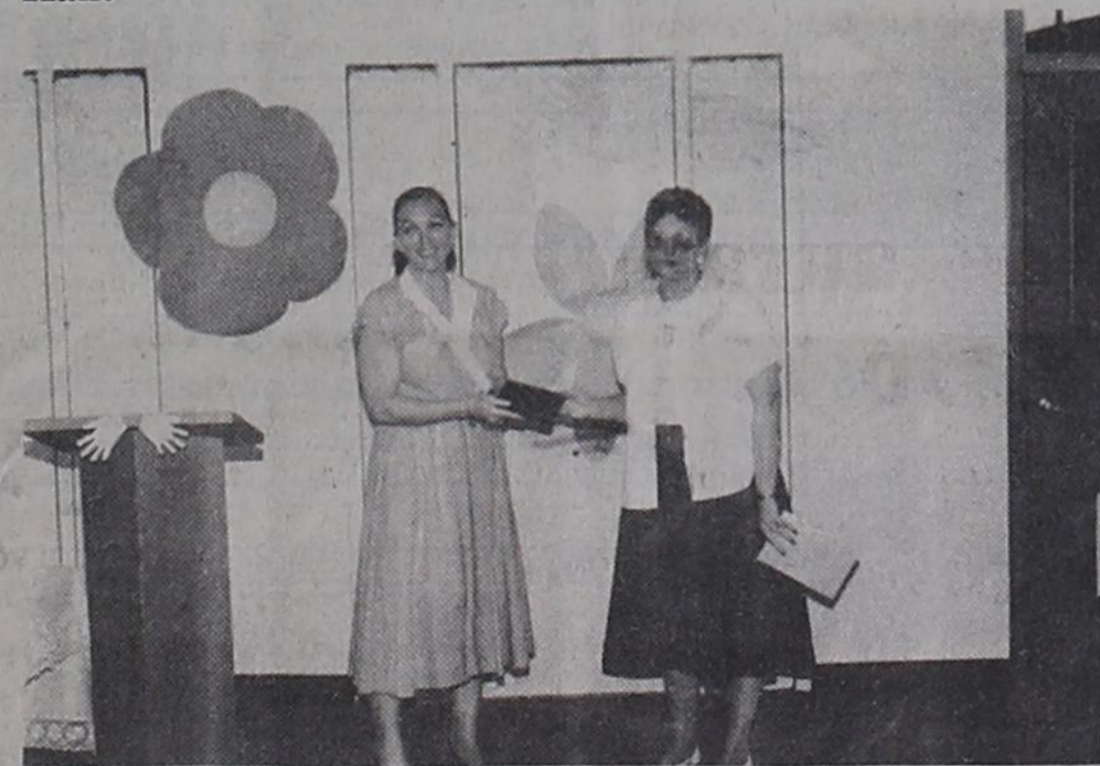

She said she had not made plans following retirement, but would be moving to Lubbock to be closer to some of her children.

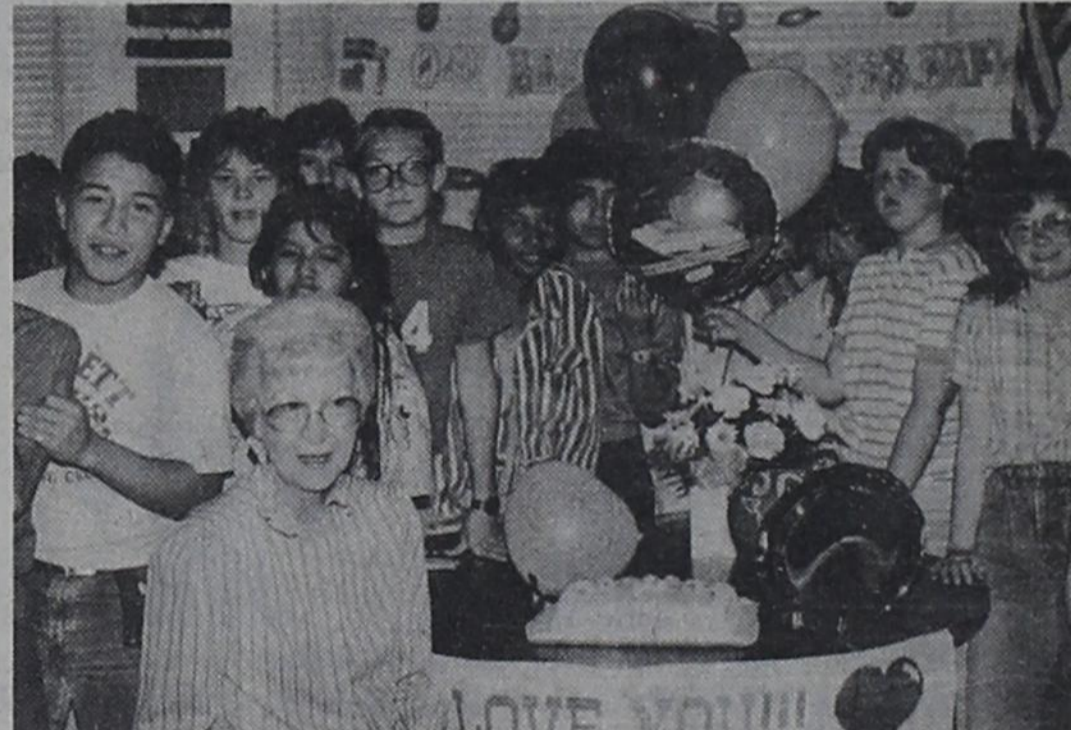
## Restaurant Is Open

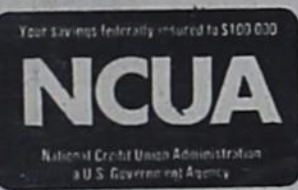

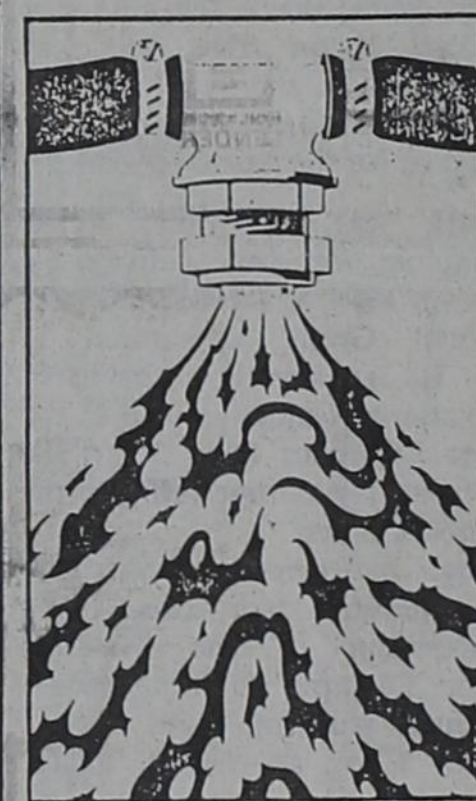

## Deadline Nears For FmHA County Committee Nomination

Parmer County farmers interested in election to the Farmers Home Administration county committee have until May 19 to get their nominating petitions signed and turned in, FmHA County Supervisor Weldon Rainey said.

One person will be elected for a three-year term to the three-person committee at the June 30 election. Rainey said anyone who has an interest in a farm in Parmer County as owner, tenant or sharecropper is eligible to run for the committee seat and to vote in the election. A spouse of an eligible

farmer also is considered to be a farmer for those purposes.

Nominating petitions, which must be signed by the nominee and two eligible farmer voters, and other information can be obtained at the FmHA county office at P.O. Box 196, Farwell, Texas, Rainey said.

FmHA county committees perform a variety of duties, including making decisions on applicants' eligibility for FmHA farm loans. Two committee members are elected by county farmers, and the third is appointed by FmHA.
