The new red brick building located on the corner of Oak and Water Streets has a total of 3,300 square feet of floor space as compared the 1,980 in the present building. It contains 850 postal boxes, an increase of 160 over the 690 in the old location. The new postoffice will contain all new equipment with the exception of three units which are being moved from the present building and has office space available.

New type postaal boxes have been installed. They are of the single dial type with combination locks. Several boxes remain employees Thursday or Friday.

The move culminates slightly over ten years spent in the present location, Trainer said. The office was moved to the Vander-Stucken building in August 1969.

A date for official dedication the building has not been set at the present time, Trainer said, but it is expected that the date will be scheduled for mid-January.
