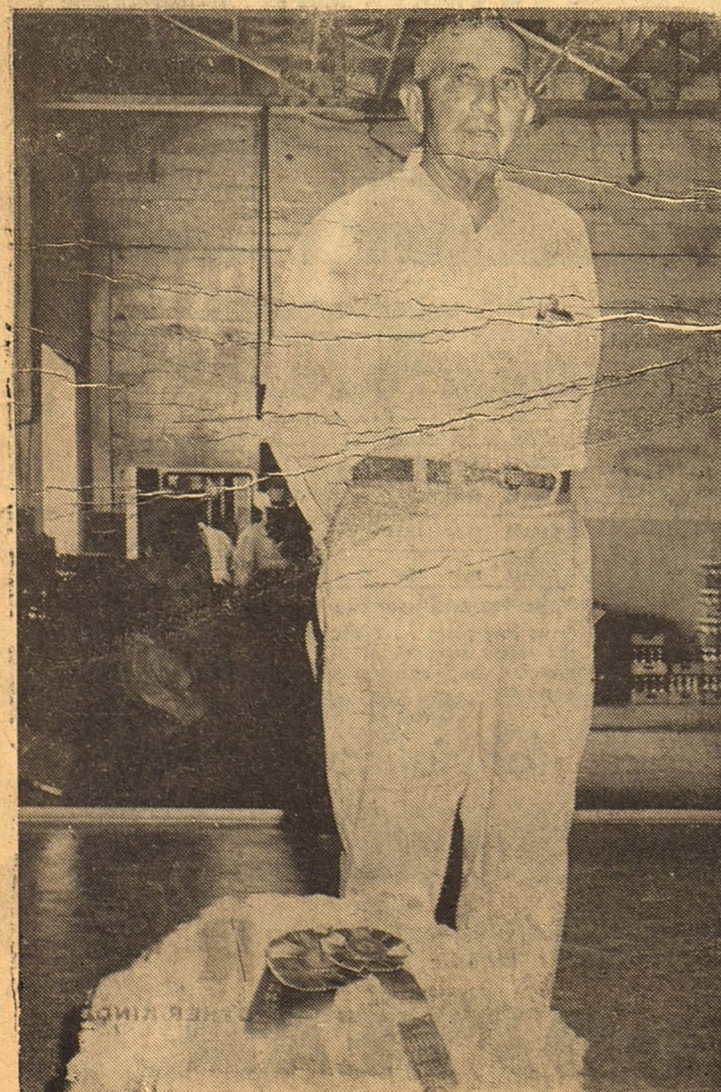

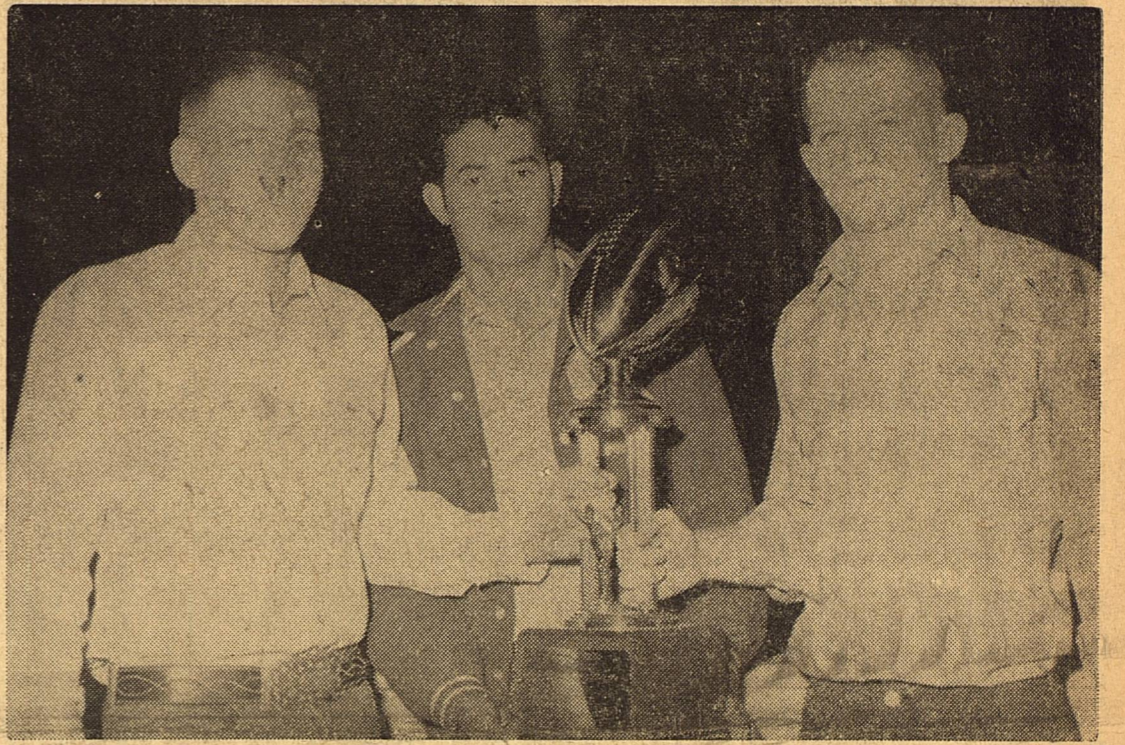
Alber Ward posed in October as construction was still underway on his radio station KCKG which will give radio service within a radius of about 40 miles.

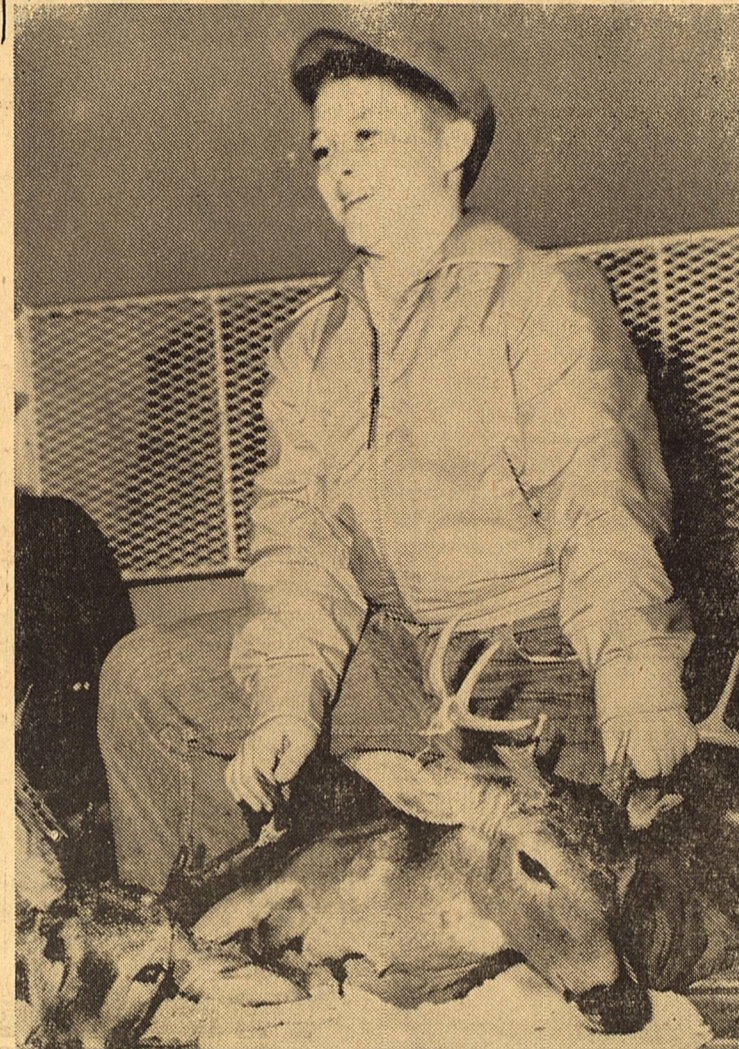

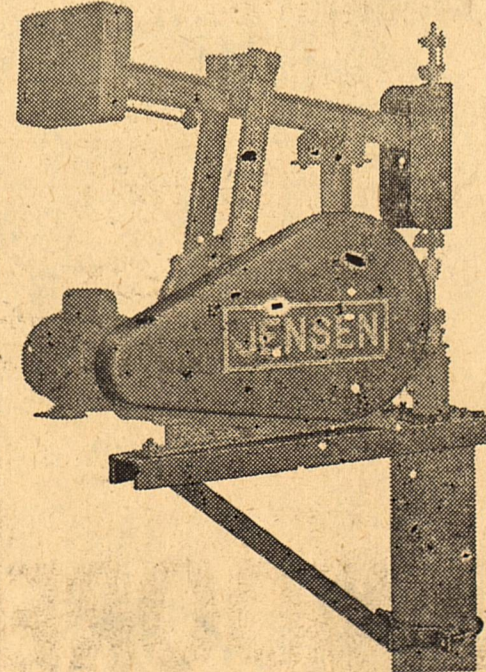

Hunters Have A Good Year For Doe Deer

Just about anyone can kill a deer this year if he is willing to spend \$3.15 for a resident hunting license, and a small fee for permission to hunt an antlerless deer. The Edwards Plateau Game Management Area alone will have 71,118 permits available for hunters. It's a year for deer, according to A. J. Springs, wildlife coordinator for the Game and Fish Commission.

Llano County landowners were issued 12,059 antlerless deer permits for the 1961-62 hunt. Gillespie County has 12,067 permits; Mason County, 11,760; Burnet County, 5,430; Menard County, 950; McCulloch, 5,670; Kendall, 8,283; Sutton, 1,187; Edwards, 1,507; San Saba, 5,922; Kerr, 5,309; Bandera, 882, and Crockett, 92. Bonus deer tags were issued to landowners in all these counties, in conjunction with the antlerless deer permits. The landowner can issue the hunter a bonus deer tag with the antlerless permit, if he so desires.

The wildlife coordinator said there were approximately 60,000 antlerless deer permits available to hunters in the remaining counties of the state.

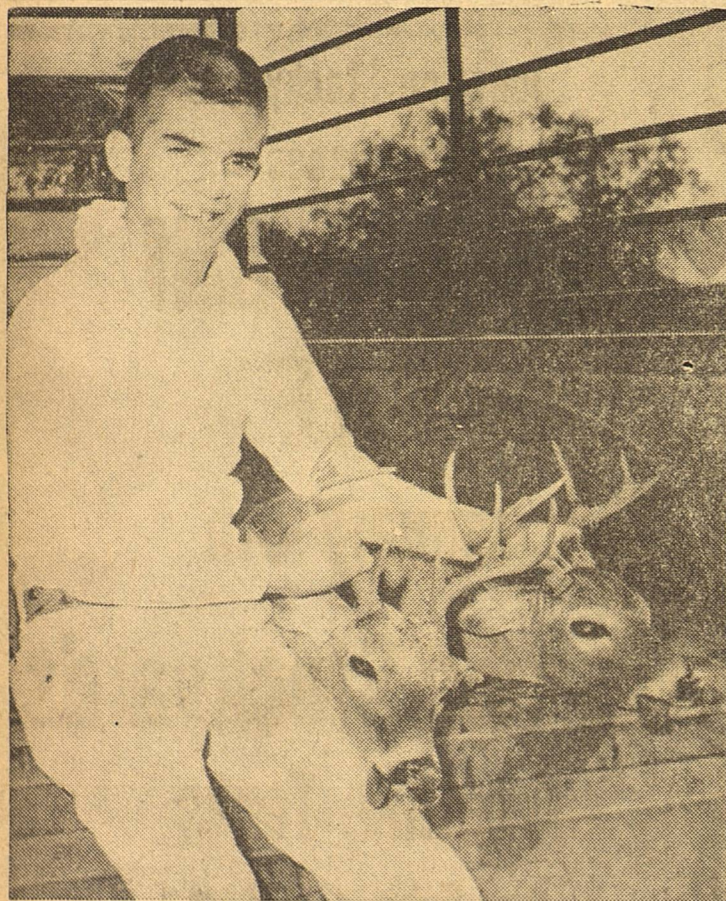

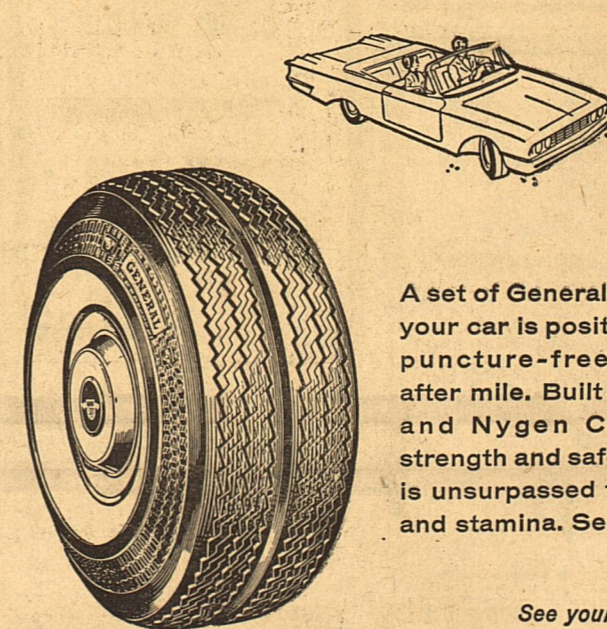


Jerry Shurley, Jr. made a hunting record that will make a good story for years to come. Jerry shot one deer, the bullet struck its mark and flew on to kill a second.
