

- 1 can (15 ounces) tomato sauce 1 cup water 1 tablespoon Worcestershire

sauce Mix beef, rice, milk, onion and seasonings. Shape mixture into small balls. In skillet, brown meatballs in hot shortening, turning frequently. Stir in to-mato sauce, water and Wor-cestershire sauce. Cover and simmer 45 minutes. If necessary, add small amount of CELERY CRESCENTS
