## Exhibitors Excel At County Show

Young showmen, FFA and 4-H Club members from Bovina were much in evidence at the annual Parmer County Junior Livestock Show February 15-16 in Friona.

Although they did not figure in one of the show's grand championship awards, Bovina area showmen once again won their share of ribbons and honors, and had a good percentage of their animals in the auction sale on Saturday afternoon.

Tim Garner had the highest placing animal, taking Reserve Champion Lamb trophy and ribbon with his 126-pound medium wool entry.

Jon Riddle also excelled in the lamb show. His lightweight fine wool cross entry was named reserve champion, and he had a second place animal in the medium wool, light heavyweight class.

Doyle Garner was a class winner in the lamb show. His first place in the medium wool medium heavy division gave Bovina entries a 1-2 finish.

Matt Howell had the breed champion Chester White in the barrow show, and Sharlet Johnson had a class winner.

Miss Johnson exhibited the champion Berkshire, as Bovina entries won both classes in the breed judging. Brad Heflin won in the lightweights.

Other class winners in the highly competitive barrow show from Bovina were Scott Johnson and Jim Rhodes, crossbreeds, Greg McClaran, Duroc, Ryn Rains, Hampshires, and Jim Rhodes, Polands.

In the steer show, Doug Roming's 1004-pound Angus won the lightweight class, and his 1114-pound animal was second in its class to the show's grand champion.

Lazbuddie exhibitors ran off with all three of the show's grand championships.

Scotty Windham, vo-ag instructor at Lazbuddie, said it was the first time since the grand champion sheep award was re-instated that exhibitors from Lazbuddie had swept all three of the championships awarded in the show.

Vandi Tarter captured the most competitive championship--the barrow award, with a 244-pound Duroc entry which was champion of its breed. There had been a total of 312 entries in the barrow show, a record number, and judging took a total of eight hours, from 8 a.m. Friday until 4 p.m.

Miss Tarter's win gave her community its 18th barrow title in the past 20 years, and 21st in 33 county shows. The win by the Duroc knotted up the standings once again for individual breeds. Durocs and Hampshires have each won eight county titles.

Reserve champion barrow was exhibited by Mark Petchinsky, Friona FFA member, who had the champion crossbred barrow.

The judge, Marcus Phillips of Hereford, complimented the Parmer County showmen on their projects. "I tried to evaluate each animal in the show. You have all done well," Phillips said. He indicated his final choice was a close one between the Duroc and the Crossbred barrows.

Sean Mason of Lazbuddie exhibited the grand champion sheep, a medium wool entry which had earned breed champion honors in preliminary judging.

Reserve champion lamb was exhibited by Tim Garner of Bovina, whose 126-pound lamb had been reserve champion in the medium wool division behind Mason's animal.

Phillip Jesko gave Lazbuddie their "sweep" in the show, when his 1156-pound Angus was tapped for Grand Champion honors in the steer show Friday night.

Other class winners were Holly

Tatum of Friona and Doug Roming of Bovina.

Other breed champion honors in the barrow show were won by Tommy Mesman of Farwell, Yorkshire; Matt Howell of Bovina, Chester White; Sharlet Johnson, Bovina, Berkshire; Russell Windham, Lazbuddie, Hampshire, and Sherrie Seaton, Lazbuddie, Poland China.

Showmanship awards were won by Charles Johnson of Bovina in the barrow division; Ben Landrum of Friona in the lamb show, and Phillip Jesko of Lazbuddie for steer judging. Herman Boone, vo-ag teacher at Spearman, judged the steers, and Denny Belew of Anton judged the lambs.

Saturday's auction sale was held despite the snowfall of six to eight inches. Workmen cleared off the parking lot at the community center-showbarn, and an excellent crowd of buyers and spectators attended, despite the snow. Virtually every year since the show facility has been completed, it has proven invaluable due to weather extremes.

Buyers paid out a total of \$142,484.29 to the young showmen. This included \$88,792.03 paid by buyers of floor animals, and \$53,692.26 in premiums.
