IN 1958, Ye Editor, as well as the writer of "My Turn" were students at Texas Tech. That was the year the Southwest Conference members voted their approval to invite Tech into their group—an idea that had been a dream of Tech's leaders and boosters practically since its beginning in 1925.

Tech's "Victory Bells" were tolled for hours heralding the achievement. A parade was held on Broadway. We journalists published an "EXTRA" edition of The Toreador (Tech's Student Newspaper), to headline the event. We recall being up all night to help produce that issue.

Longtime Texas Tech leaders said it was the greatest day in Tech's history since the college was first granted to the South Plains.

This past week, Texas Tech, along with two or three of its "bigger brothers" in the SWC, the University of Texas, Texas A&M and Baylor, announced plans to leave the conference to join the Big Eight Conference—in the name of a bigger football television stake.

So much for tradition, loyalty, sentiment, ethical values and sportsmanship.

The Cotton Bowl, and their former colleagues are being forsaken for a better TV deal!

The Big 8 Conference has a lower academic requirement for its athletes than the Southwest Conference has had, so these four SWC members will be sacrificing academic standards in making their new conference.

Besides the fact that trading institutions such as Rice University, T.C.U. and S.M.U. automatically leaves a big void in the academic realm.

One of the college officials speaking for the new alliance stated last week that he wished the news that they were spreading had to do with greater academic achievements. Amen to that!

The bad part of this deal is that in 1958, Tech's leaving the old Border Conference to join the Southwest Conference proved to be the death knell for that league.

For you newcomers, we'd point out that Tech competed in the Border along with rivals West Texas State, Texas Western (now U.T.E.P.), Hardin-Simmons University, New Mexico, New Mexico State, Arizona and Arizona State—a pretty fair "country athletic conference" in itself.

As a freshman and sophomore student at Tech, it was possible as a sports fan, to attend many of Tech's out-of-town games. We recall seeing the Raiders play West Texas at Canyon's "Box", and Eastern New Mexico at their old field house. You could go to some "away" games like we did in our old '48 Pontiac. You'd have a tougher time driving to Tech's out-of-town games today.

We've said it before, and we'll say it one more time: you lose some things by becoming "bigger."

And not all of those things, such as loyalty and tradition, should be swept under the rug, just to fatten your athletic budget.

THE NEW METHOD of renewing your vehicle license is slightly flawed, in that the new sticker goes on your windshield, above the state inspection sticker.

We have already heard of several citizens who have been pulled over and told "Your license has expired," when they had the new sticker on their windshield.

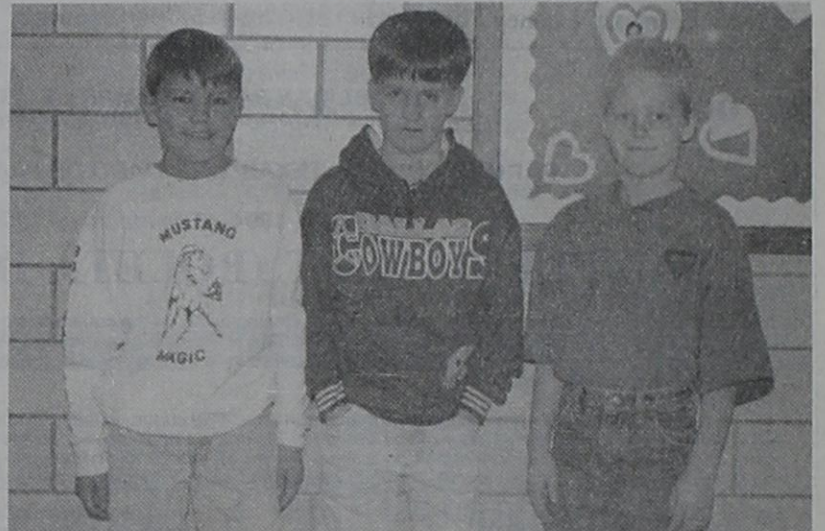
"Wednesday, March 23 has been set as the deadline for filing an application for a place on the ballot, if you are interested in running for the school board," Bob Owen commented.

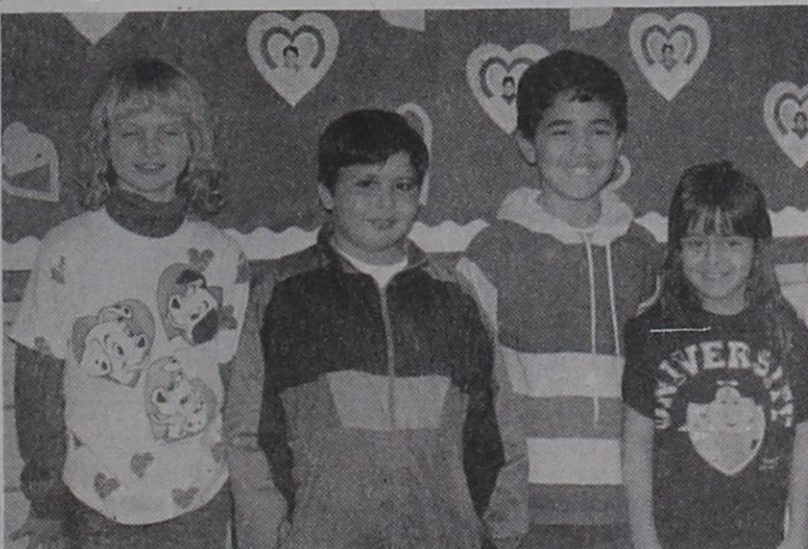

CAULIFLOWER SALAD

- 1 large head cauliflower
 - 1/2 pound bacon, cooked and crumbled
 - 2 medium tomatoes, diced
 - 1 bunch green onions, chopped
 - 1 cup diced cheese (American or Cheddar)
 - 1/2 cup pimento--stuffed olives, sliced
 - 1/2 cup mayonnaise or Miracle Whip
- Remove outer green leaves and break cauliflower into flowerettes. Toss cauliflower with remaining

ingredients.

HOLIDAY SALAD

By Linda Griffin

- 1 package lime Jello
 - 1 cup hot pineapple juice
 - 2 small packages cream cheese
 - 2 tablespoons chopped pimientos
 - 1 cup celery, chopped
 - 1/2 cup pecans
 - 1 pint whipping cream
- Dissolve Jello in hot pineapple juice and allow to partially cool. Add cheese broken in bits and beat well. When thoroughly cool, add pimientos, pecans and celery. Fold in whipped cream.

RED, WHITE & GREEN SALAD

- 1-3 ounce package lime Jello
 - 1/3 cup pineapple juice
 - 1 cup crushed pineapple
 - 1-1/2 teaspoons unflavored gelatin
 - 1-8 ounce package cream cheese, softened
 - 1/4 cup milk
 - 1-3 ounce package strawberry Jello
 - 1-10 ounce package frozen strawberries
- Dissolve lime gelatin in 1 cup boiling water. Stir in pineapple juice and pineapple. Pour into mold; chill until firm. Sprinkle unflavored gelatin over 2 tablespoons cold water to soften; dissolve over hot water. Mix cream cheese with milk; stir in unflavored gelatin. Spread over lime layer; chill. Dissolve strawberry gelatin in 1 cup boiling water. Add frozen strawberries, stir until strawberries are thawed. Cool. Pour over cream cheese layer; chill until firm.

ORANGE JELLO SALAD

- 1 large package Jello
 - 4 cups hot water
 - 1-8 ounce cream cheese
 - 1 cup Cool Whip
 - 1 cup miniature marshmallows
 - 1/2 cup nuts
 - 1 cup crushed pineapple
- Dissolve Jello in hot water. Add cream cheese and stir until melted. Chill until thick. Beat with mixer. Fold in Cool Whip, marshmallows, nuts and pineapple. Refrigerate again to set.

PINK SALAD

- 1-12 ounce Cool Whip
 - 1 can Eagle Brand milk
 - 1/2 cup chopped pecans

CARAMEL LAYER CHOCOLATE

- 1 bag caramels
 - 2/3 cup evaporated milk
 - 1 package German chocolate cake mix
 - 3/4 cup oleo, melted
 - 1/3 cup chopped pecans
 - 1 cup chocolate chips
- Melt caramel in 1/3 cup of the milk. Set aside. Combine cake mix, oleo and 1/3 cup milk. By hand, stir until dough holds together. Press 1/2 dough into 9x13 pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 6 minutes. Remove and sprinkle with chocolate chips. Spread caramel over chocolate. Spread other 1/2 dough over caramel. Bake 15-18 minutes longer. Cool and refrigerate until caramel sets.

GREBBLE (GERMAN)

By Ruth Renner

- 3 eggs, beaten
 - 1 cup granulated sugar
 - 1 cup whipping cream
 - 1 cup buttermilk
 - 1-1/2 teaspoons salt
 - 1 teaspoon soda
 - 1 teaspoon baking powder
 - 2 cups flour
 - More flour
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla (optional)
- Mix beaten eggs, sugar, unwhipped cream and buttermilk. Add salt, soda and baking powder sifted with 2 cups flour. Then work in enough more flour to make a soft dough. Knead on board until very smooth. Roll dough 1/2" thick. Cut into 2x4 inch pieces. Cut 2 slits lengthwise in each piece. Deep fry. Do not overcook. Dribble each piece with icing mixture. Icing mixture: powdered sugar, milk, vanilla mixed to a thin consistency. May refrigerate dough and use as needed.

SUGAR-PLUM DUMPLINGS

By Fannie Southall

- Dough mix:
- 2/3 cup instant potatoes
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup boiling water
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1/2 tablespoon corn oil
- 1 cup flour
- 6 pitted sweet plums
- Filling mix:
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- Coating mix:
- 1/2 cup crushed graham crackers
- 1/4 cup sugar

Using the first five ingredients of dough mix, prepare as with mashed potatoes. Sift in flour until it has the consistency of dough (approximately 1 cup). On a

floured board, pat out to 12 inch square. Cut into 6 equal parts. Fill plums with filling mix. Wrap each plum individually with a piece of dough. Encase the plum completely. Drop dumplings into boiling water. When the dumplings rise to the top, remove with fork or slotted spoon. Drain for 10 seconds. Roll dumplings in coating mix.

CHOCOLATE PUDDING DESSERT

(Continued from Page 1) either for county chairman or precinct chairmen on either of the ballots, and it is pointed out that write-ins will be necessary. Wendol Christian, who has been serving as Democratic Chairman, says that he is not a candidate for re-election. Two candidates are running for County offices on the Republican ballot, but will not be opposed until November. Many voters may opt to participate in the Republican primary, where Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison, who recently fought off a court battle, has six opponents in the primary. None have really come to the top, so KBH hopes to win nomination without a runoff, similar to the way she ran away with the special election in 1993. George W. Bush, who is ready to give Ann Richards a run for the governor's race, has taken opposition from Ray Hollis in the primary. Four candidates are seeking the

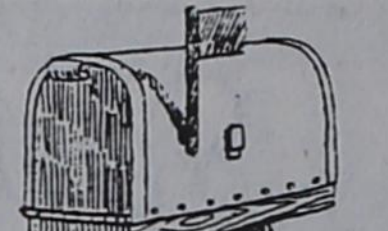
GOP nomination for state attorney general: John Marshall, Pat Lykos, Don Wittig and Tony Garza. Two are seeking the nomination for state treasurer: Mike Wolfe and David Hartman. On the Democratic ballot, Ms. Richards has an opponent in Gary Espinosa. Four have lined up for the Demos' nomination for senator: Jim Mattox, Evelyn K. Lantz, Richard Fisher and Michael Andrews. Grady Yarborough is opposing Martha Whitehead (incumbent) for the state treasurer's nomination; and Robert Earley opposes Jim Nugent for Railroad Commissioner. Raul A. Gonzales, Rene Hass and Bill Yarborough are seeking the nomination for Supreme Court Justice, place one; David Young and Mary Scott Nabers are down for Railroad Commissioner, unexpired term. Many Texas Counties Approve School Prayer

School prayer resolutions approved by more than half of the counties in Texas show that some politicians are willing to trade religious liberty for social and religious control, according to a Texas Baptist public policy expert. In effect, the resolutions propose that children in public schools be exposed to the prayers of whatever religious majority may control that school's board, said Weston Ware, citizenship associate with the Texas Baptist Christian Life Commission, the social concerns agency of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

"Preserving religious liberty in our country is a lot more important than any perceived benefits believed to come from schoolroom prayers determined by some political majority," he said. Resolutions urging that prayer be reinstated in public schools have been approved by commissioners courts in 134 Texas counties, city councils in more than 50 municipalities and the boards of several school districts. The act allows secondary school students to join together voluntarily for prayer, Bible study, devotions and religious instruction.

Vaccine Clinics Are Set Locally

The monthly immunization clinics sponsored by the Texas Department of Health are once again scheduled locally this month. Protection is offered against several childhood diseases, including polio, diphtheria, lockjaw (tetanus), whooping cough, measles, rubella, mumps and H.I.B. (Haemophilus influenza type B). The TDH charges a fee to help with the cost of operating these clinics. The charge is based on family income and size and the ability to pay. Clinics will be operated at Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona each Tuesday from 9-12 noon and 2-5 p.m. A clinic will also operate in Bovina on Monday, March 14, at the Bovin Medical Clinic, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

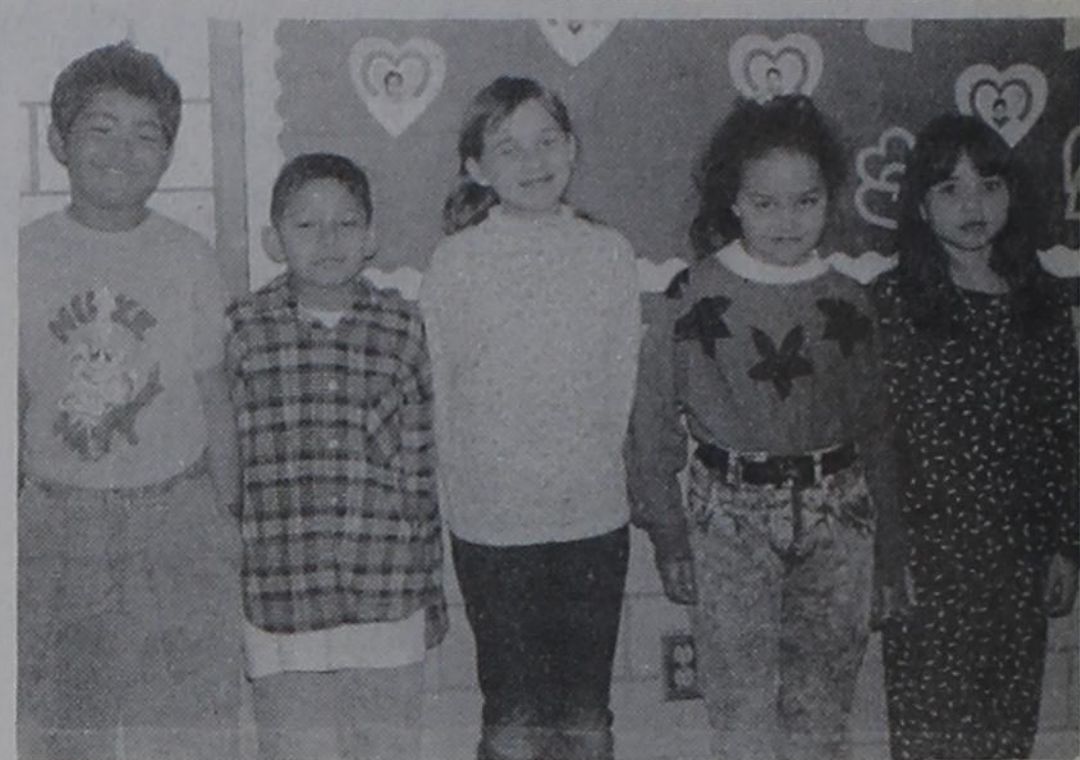
Corn Producers To Elect Director

The Texas Corn Producers Board (TCPB) announced that it will hold elections in four of its eight voting regions to elect four board members where current members' seats are expiring. The election will be conducted by voting regions. There is one seat open for election in Voting Region Two, which includes Parmer County. A person is eligible to vote in this board election if he or she is, or for at least one production period during the three years preceding the date of this election (May 5, 1994) has been a producer of corn or has caused corn to be produced for commercial purposes. This includes owners of farms and their tenants or sharecroppers if such person would be required to pay the assessment. Any person qualified to vote is also qualified to seek nomination for election to the board as a Director. However, qualified persons must reside within the TCPB voting region wherein they seek nomination. Nomination applications must be submitted to the TCPB signed by the applicant and ten other eligible voters in this election. Nomination forms are available at each county agent office, or they can be requested by mail directly from the TCPB, 218 East Bedford, Dimmitt, Texas, 79027. If you

request a nomination form by mail from TCPB, please include your county of residence. Nomination forms are publicly available from county agent offices or by mail from the TCPB office after February 21. For a nomination form to be valid, it must be signed by an eligible applicant for nomination and ten other eligible voters and must be mailed to the TCPB, 218 East Bedford, Dimmitt, Texas, 79027, with a postmark date of no later than March 29, 1994. Nomination applications with a postmark date later than March 29, will not be valid. Nomination applicants must reside in a county within a TCPB voting region where they seek nomination. The TCPB is a research and promotion program for corn funded by a uniform corn checkoff, collected on a refund basis, from corn producers in every county of Texas. This election in four of the TCPB eight voting regions is the biennial election required by the Texas Commodity Referendum Law. Friends Don't Let Friends Drive Drunk!
