The polling place remains at Farwell Community Center, 207 9th Street, Farwell, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 302
This polling place remains at the Oklahoma Lane Methodist Church, 645 FM 1731, Parmer County, Texas.
VOTING BOX NO. 303
This polling place remains at Bovina Ridgelea School, 1000 Hwy. 86, Bovina, Texas
VOTING BOX NO. 401
This polling place remains at the Lazbuddie School, 673 FM 1172, Lazbuddie, Texas
