Remember, magazines and newspapers which you subscribe to, are usually mailed second class, which is somewhat cheaper than the first class rate by which you mail letters. By being a subscriber to said publication, you have indicated that you wish to receive it. When the first-class postage rate goes up, second-class postage rate is always raised accordingly.

But the items which are mailed at the lower cost bulk-rate are things which you have NOT subscribed to and usually don't want. Postal costs for this sector have not kept pace. Why, I don't know.

Added to the bulk-rate junk mail fiasco, is the good old franking privilege which is overused and abused by our politicians. Members of Congress, acting on official business, are allowed to use the postal system free of charge. This amounts to a lot of free advertising during each

election year. Every elected official, no matter how insignificant his or her office, Are Held now mails out a monthly newsletter. Again, the affect is to keep their names before the public for purpose of getting re-elected next time around. 




