by more than 300,000 votes. As chairman of the Senate Republican Policy Committee, Tower is a key member of the GOP leadership in the Senate. He now ranks 6th in seniority among

Republicans. Tower is senior Republican on the Senate Armed Services Committee and second ranking on the Senate Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs Committee.

Tower also is a member of the Senate Select Committee on Ethics. In addition, Tower serves on the National Transportation Policy Study Commission.

Tower is a trustee for Southwestern University and Southern Methodist University. He is past Worthy Grand Master of Kappa

over a half-mile long area from the impact area.


The largest piece of the aircraft was three feet square.




The scene of the T-38 crash and the ejection seat of 2d Lt. Steven Morris of San Antonio, who was found dead in





Statewide Screwworm Cases Rise

Some slowing of the number of positive samples from Texas animals arriving at the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Screwworm Eradication Program lab became evident in late July.

Dr. James E. Novy, Acting Program Director, says seven Texas counties, Floyd, Coke, Reagan, Bosque, Edwards, Real, Medina--recorded their first 1978 cases during the first half of July. A total of

"A big share of the positive samples arriving at the lab in late July were from the Big Bend area,' says Novy. El Paso County, with 26 confirmed cases, has the most recorded infestations.

A continuing buildup of screwworms seems to be occurring in Crockett County where 17 cases have been identified. Shearing of sheep and goats, with consequent nicks and minor wounds, is underway in that area. This may lead to an screwworm increasing

population. Arizona has recorded 1893 screwworm cases this year, California 35, and New Mexico's total is at

It has been more than four weeks since a screwworm sample from the Live Oak-Bee County, Texas, area has been identified in the lab.

Dr. Novy cities hot and dry July weather, combined with sterile fly treatment of known infested areas, as possible reasons for the slowdown in cases. 'This may change rapidly if heavy rains soak the ranges," he says.

Brine Dumped in Corpus Bay

Dischage of oil and gas field brine into bays in the Corpus Christi area has had no appreciable effect on water quality in that area, an environmental scientist told a Railroad Commission hearing July

The testimony came in the second day of a Commission-called hearing to review the disposition of oil and gas field brines in tidal waters off the regulatory agency's three districts bordering on the Gulf of Mexico.

Specifically, the hearing is intended to illicit additional data with respect to the continued use of tidal disposal of oilfield brines and for the development of control needed, if any, to assure abatement of pollution that might be caused by the disposal of

Michael T. Nicholas Jr.,

an environmental geologist at the Southwest Research Institute, made studies at sites in Aransas, Copano, Nueces, Corpus Christi and Red Fish Bays at the instruction of a consolidated group of 23 oil and gas

operators in the area. The 23 operators discharge about 60,000 barrels of brine per year, approximately 94 percent of all brine disposal in the

bays.
Nicholas tested bay water for salinity, amount of dissolved oxygen and foreign elements such as cadmium and oil and grease material around brine disposal sites in the

While there were some recorded instances of higher than usual amounts of salt and oil at the point of immediate discharge, at a distance of only 20 meters normal levels were again present, according to Nicholas.

At no point did the oil and salt exceed recommended environmental levels. Nicholas stressed. The scientist concluded that the discharge of brine created no adverse effect

on bay waters. Dr. Robert H. Parker, president of Coastal Ecosystems Management Inc., of Fort Worth, testified as to the results of studies he made for the same group of oil

producers. Parker surveyed the benthic community, that is, the small plant and animals which make their homes on the bottom on the bay. Benthic organisms are good indications of water pollution levels, according to Parker, since they are not mobile enough to move away from pollution sources.

Parker stated the number of Benthic Community members had actually increased since the last study of the area of 1970. Parker told examiners, Chief Engineer Bob R. Harris and Senior 100 Legal Counsel J. Brooks site.

More Texas Drilling Helps Gas Situation

The effect of federal price controls and uncontrolled prices on drilling and development in Texas is reflected in the latest estimates of the state's natural gas and crude oil reserves:

Texas' natural gas reserves did not drop as fast last year as they have annually during the past decade. The rate of decline for the 2.5-trillion cubic feet (Tcf) drop in 1977 was 3.8-percent. That compares with an annual average decline of 9.2-percent in the four previous years. in the four previous years. But, crude oil reserves last year dropped 759-

million barrels — some nine-percent — compared with a six-percent average annual decline during

Appraisals by the American Petroleum Institute and the American Gas Association list slightly less than 8.5-billion barrels of crude oil and approximately 62.2-Tcf of natural gas in Texas' fields at the end of last year. As the free market price for natural gas produced and sold for use in Texas increased in the 1973-1977

period, Texas producers responded with increased drilling. They set a new gas well completion record every year in an effort to meet demand. By the March-May quarter of 1977, Texans were using nearly 68-percent of the state's natural gas production.

The average price of intrastate gas went from 14-cents per thousand cubic feet (Mcf) in January, 1973, to an average price of \$1.04 per Mcf in the March-May, 1977, quarter. In 1974, producers in Texas made 1,843 gas well completions; in 1975, 2,135; in 1976, 2,443, and last year, 3,064.

In contrast to the free market that exists for intrastate gas, about 90-percent of Texas' crude oil production remains under federal price controls. Only production from stripper wells, those yielding 10 barrels or less of oil per day, is exempt.

The higher price allowed for so-called "new" or upper tier oil helped stimulate drilling for oil last year. The oil well completion total of 6,533 was the highest in 13 years. But, this was far short of the annual average of more than 11,000 completions during the 1950s, when reserves averaged 14.7-hillion barrels. billion barrels.

As Texans look toward their future energy needs, which must be satisfied from today's oil and gas reserves, they are seeing a demonstration of the power of the economic incentive provided by a free market. Oil men expect a turnaround in energy supplies when Congress learns this lesson.



Cattle Prices Drop Sharply

Producers and consumers have watched cattle prices decline sharply and the market react violently during the past several weeks, notes Dr. Edward Uvacek, Jr., livestock marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Uvacek points out that fed cattle prices dropped from the \$62 per hundredweight level of early June to the \$50 level by mid-month. Feeder prices showed a similar drop.

"The sharp decline resulted from simultaneous reaction to several distinct factors: consumer resistance to high retail beef prices, weakness in

Horse **Owners** Beware

Horse owners should be aware that the Western Equine Encephaloymelitis (sleeping sickness) virus has been isolated from mosquitoes at 21 different areas of the Texas Gulf Coast between Kleberg and Orange Counties, says Clint Langford, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension

'Serious outbreaks of Eastern Equine Encephaloymelitis have already taken place in Florida as well as the Dominican Republic," Clint adds.

Horse owners who have ne already done so may w.... to contact their veterinarions to schedule vaccinations for all colts, mares, geldings, stallions, ponies and mules, the county agent adds.

The county Extension agent emphasizes that vaccinations must be repeated each year to give proper immunity.

It is possible to give Eastern. Western and Venezuelan Encephalomyelitis vaccines--along with tetanus--as a single combined vaccine.

'It is much cheaper to prevent a disease than to treat an infected animal, since these diseases do not respond to antibiotic treatments," Langford con-

He points out that some forecasts, including that of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, look for further improvement in the

with some weakness in the fourth quarter. The real key to their forecasts, however, is an estimated 7 percent decrease in beef production for the second half of the year. The USDA analysis places the average price of U.S. choice fed steers in Oma during the July-September period at \$55-\$57 per hundredweight. Price predictions for similar cattle in the fourth quarter are \$54-\$56.

Uvacek's view of third quarter beef supplies is not quite as encouraging.

He expects only 2 percent less beef production and larger pork, broiler and turkey supplies.

poultry production could be up 11/2 to 2 percent from a year ago. That would be the largest production of the year and undoubtedly would limit price recovery," contends.

Fourth quarter estimates point toward a somewhat improved supply situation, Uvacek says.

'Recovery during that period seems highly likely," he believes. The specialist's cattle price outlook includes these specific forecasts:

Petroleum Industry Boost

boost that oil and gas industry operations gave to the Texas economy in 1977 was shared by the citizens of Sutton County.

The marketed value of petroleum production in the county has been calculated at \$61.4-million in an economic activity profile of the state's top producing counties prepared by the Dallas-based Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association.

"Texas' oil and gas industry remains the cornerstone of the economy of the state and of many of its counties," said

dent, H.B. (Hank) Harkins, Alice, independent producer and drilling company executive.

It is imperative that the state maintain taxing and regulatory policies which will encourage the growth of this industry." Sutton was one of the

201 counties last year which produced petroleum with a marketed value of \$100,000 or more. The county ranked 69th in the estimated total value of petroleum produced. The Association has

computed that some \$2million came from the production of 220,100 barrels of crude oil, with approximately

output of 65.7-million MCF of natural gas. Payments last year to owners of royalty in the county were calculated at \$7.7-million.

While paying local, county and state property taxes, producers in the county also helped support state government through production tax payments estimated at \$4.5-million. This included \$91,500 from crude oil output, \$4.5 million from natural gas.

According to the Texas Employment Commission, during 1977 some 624 employees worked for the industry in the county. The reported payroll a-

\$9.2-million.

The search for additional petroleum continued in Sutton County last year. Oil and gas developers spent an estimated \$33.5million in the drilling of 197 wells, including seven

classified as wildcats. Some \$6.4-million of that amount was lost in 52 dry holes. The 145 strikes included three oil wells and 142 gas wells.

Processing also contributed to the county's petroleum-related economy through the operation of the three natural gasoline processing plants with a combined daily capacity of 90-million cubic feet.

Brazos River Gas Co. **Customers Get Refunds**

sion July 31 ordered the Brazos River Gas Co. to make refunds to approximately 12,000 of its customers in North Central Texas for excessive rates which the Commission determined the utility has charged for nearly two

The Commission's action, recommended by Hearings Examiner Phyllis B. Schunck, came at the regular weekly conference on Gas Utility Division matters.

The order, directing refunds and more accurate monthly reports from the utility, was unanimously approved by Chairman Mack Wallace and Commissioners Jon Newton and John H. Poerner.

Brazos River Gas is directed under the order to tabulate and report to the Commission within 30 days the total overcharges in excess of rates which had been established by the Commission in prior rate cases.

Those cases involved Brazos' customers in the City of Mineral Wells and its environs, the unincorporated areas of Palo Pinto, Millsap, Bennett, Perrin, Whitt and Jermyn, the City of Weatherford and the City of Jacksboro. The cities and towns are located in the counties of Palo Pinto, Jack and

Parker. Schunck explained to the Commission that she had found from evidence presented at an April 5 hearing investigating the utility's rates that the company had illegally increased its rates to

percent amount for lost and unaccounted for gas in the company's cost of gas and gas cost adjustment clauses to customers.

The company further had failed to file certified monthly reports to the Gas Utilities Division showing the amount of any increase or decrease from the base rate schedules authorized by the Commission, she cited.

The utility, said Schunck, had incorrectly interpreted the Commission's orders to include lost and unaccounted for gas in its charges to customers. This is the amount Brazos will be held liable for refunding to customers, Schunck said.

In addition to the excessive rates, she said. evidence presented at the

hearing revealed that the utility had been charging less than authorized rates to its commercial custom-

Schunck reported that Brazos River Gas' reason for setting its own commercial rates was that the utility felt the Commission did not have the jurisdiction to set commercial rates.

Monday's order also directs Brazos to readjust its commercial rates immediately.

Under the order, Brazos is also directed to file quarterly reports to the Commission showing the progress of the refund, including the amount of the refund made to each class of customers, the amount remaining, and the date on which the refund shall be complete.
