

Of course, the animated cartoons have always been a big hit, beginning with Walt Disney's characters, and including such regulars as the "Peanuts" series.



New Publication Date For Blade


Readers and subscribers are receiving their copy of the Bovina Blade on a different day than usual this week.



Friona State Bank would like to congratulate Jerry Hinkle as our Employee of the month. This selection is made by a majority vote of our employees.








