## Hospital's 'bottom line' reviewed

Hudspeth Memorial Hospital's fiancial problems have been building
for several years, according to statistics presented at a public meeting Tuesday night by hospital
administrator Dennis Robertson. Robertson said that the hospital's primary problem is low occupancy rates. "In 1972 the hospital had 38 percent occupancy or 10 patients per
day. In 1977 the facility had 37 ercent occupancy or 9.7 patients was day. In 1981 our occupancy rate "For the first six months of 1982, per day," Robertson revealed. Patient revenues, due in part to
inflation, have shown a steady ncrease from $\$ 209,863$ in 1972 to 1981. Projected revenues for 1982 are $\$ 535,038$ and the hospital has
collected $\$ 267,594$ through the first six months of 1982.
Salaries have gone from $\$ 159,365$
Stect in 1972 to $\$ 182,870$ in 1975 ( 61
percent of the gross revenue), to percent of the gross revenue), to
$\$ 327,261$ in 1981 ( 13 percent of gross
revenues). Projected cost for 1982 is 337,058.
"We could handle twice as many patients with the same staff," Ro
bertson noted.
