Mindy Neal led the Fillies with 27 points, and Peggy Shepherd came up with 18.

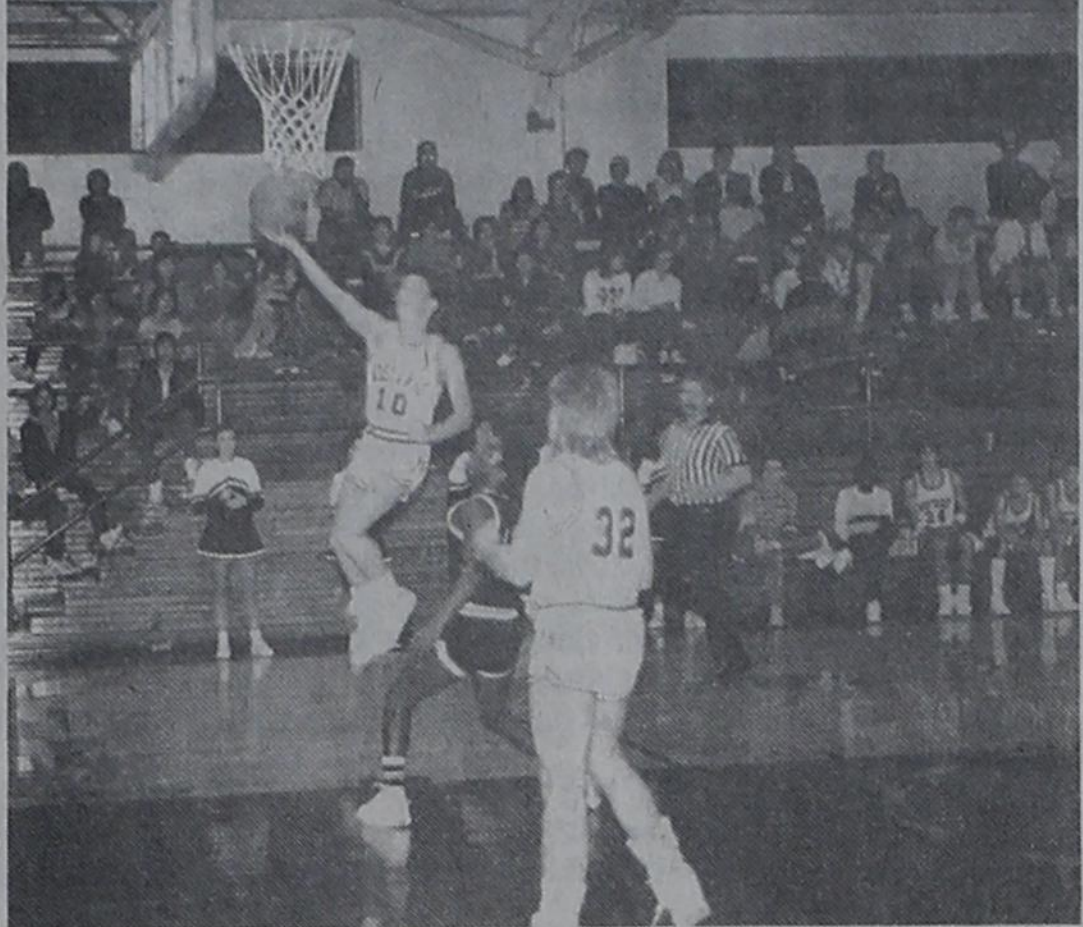

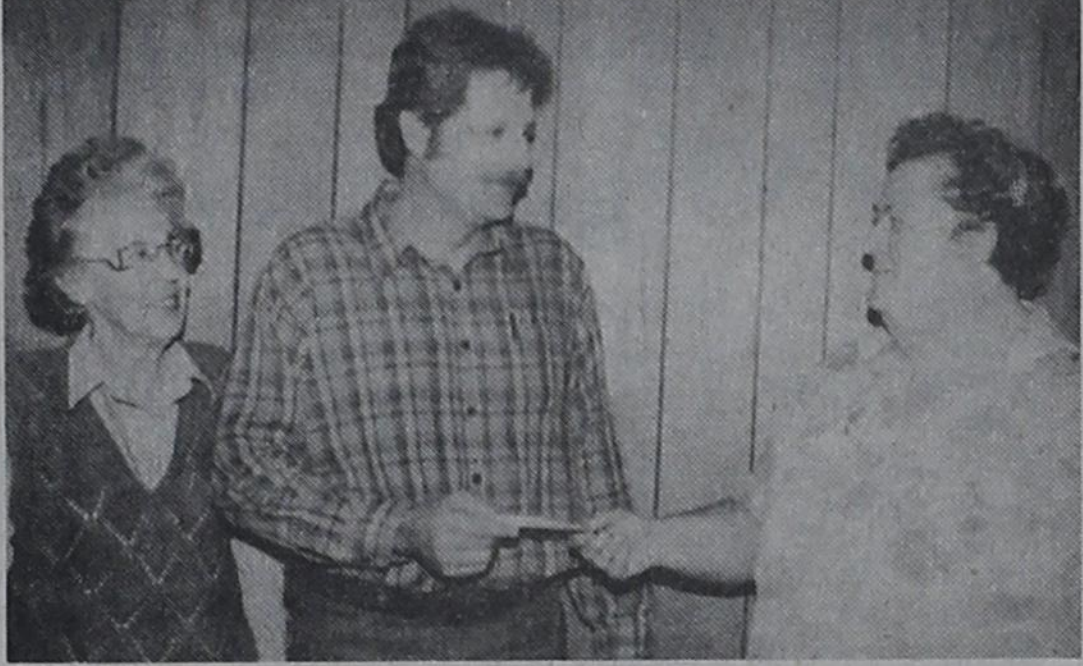
## Commodities Certification Dates Given

## Fillies Win In Own Tourney

The Bovina High School Fillies won the championship of their own "Tournament of the Stars" last weekend. The Fillies downed Vega in the finals, 67-52, to capture the championship trophy.

The Fillies took a big step toward winning the tournament title with a 40-39 win over Sudan in the semi-finals on Friday.

The game was a close one all the way. The two teams were tied, 11-11 after the first quarter, and 19-

all at the half. Peggy Shepherd scored ten points and Mindy Neal two as Bovina outscored Sudan, 12-10, to take a 29-27 lead at the end of three quarters.

Sudan outscored the Fillies, 10-9 in the final quarter, but came up a point shy.

Miss Shepherd was the scoring leader in the game, with 26 points, and Miss Neal had six.

In the tournament finals, the Fillies pulled away from a 13-12 first quarter lead to take a 32-25 lead at the intermission.

It still was a close game, with the Fillies leading 47-40 after three quarters, but the Fillies put the game away at the free throw line in the final stanza, outscoring Sudan, 20-12 for the final margin.

Peggy Shepherd made eight of eight free throws in the fourth quarter, and 14 of 16 for the game. Miss Neal was high pointer with 30 points. She hit 14 of 20 shots from the line. As a team the Fillies connected on 33 of 42 shots from the foul line.

The win left the Fillies with an 11-4 season record.

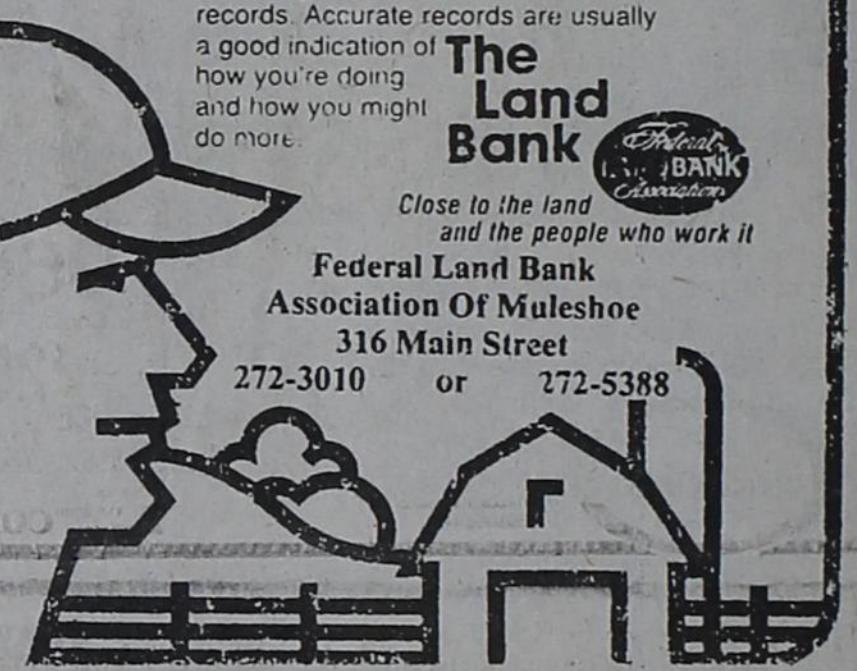

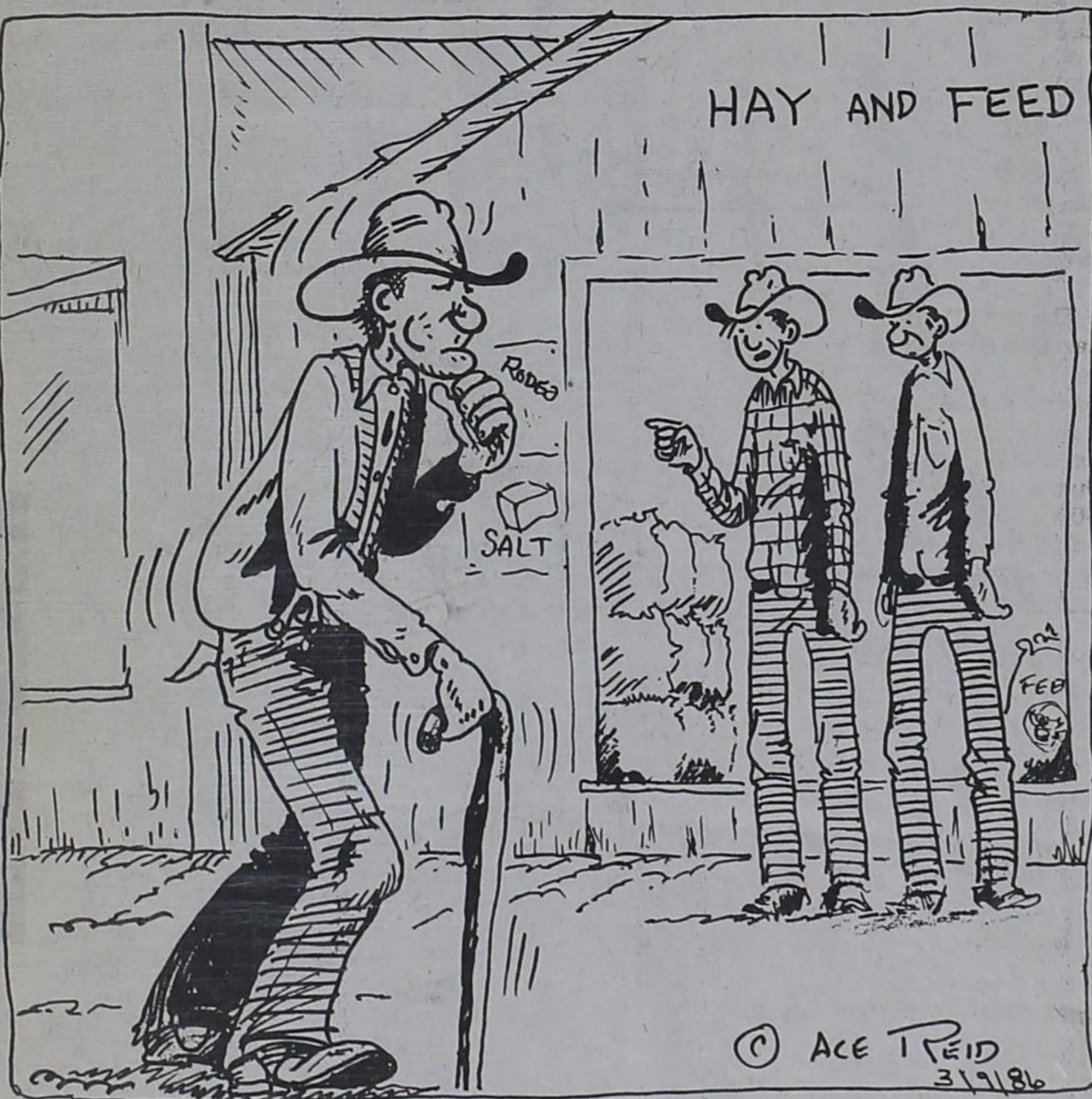

## Mustangs Second In Local Tourney

The Bovina Mustangs had to settle for second place in their own invitational tournament when the Vega Longhorns scored a 74-50 win in the tournament finals here Saturday night.

The Mustangs played a close game in the first half, when Vega went to the intermission nursing a 36-29 lead.

But the Longhorns came back in the third quarter, getting 13 points from Walker to hike their lead to 58-39.

The 'Horns kept it up in the fourth quarter, with a 16-11 advantage for the final margin.

The Mavericks had an excellent fourth quarter scoring 14 points and holding the Colts to three points.

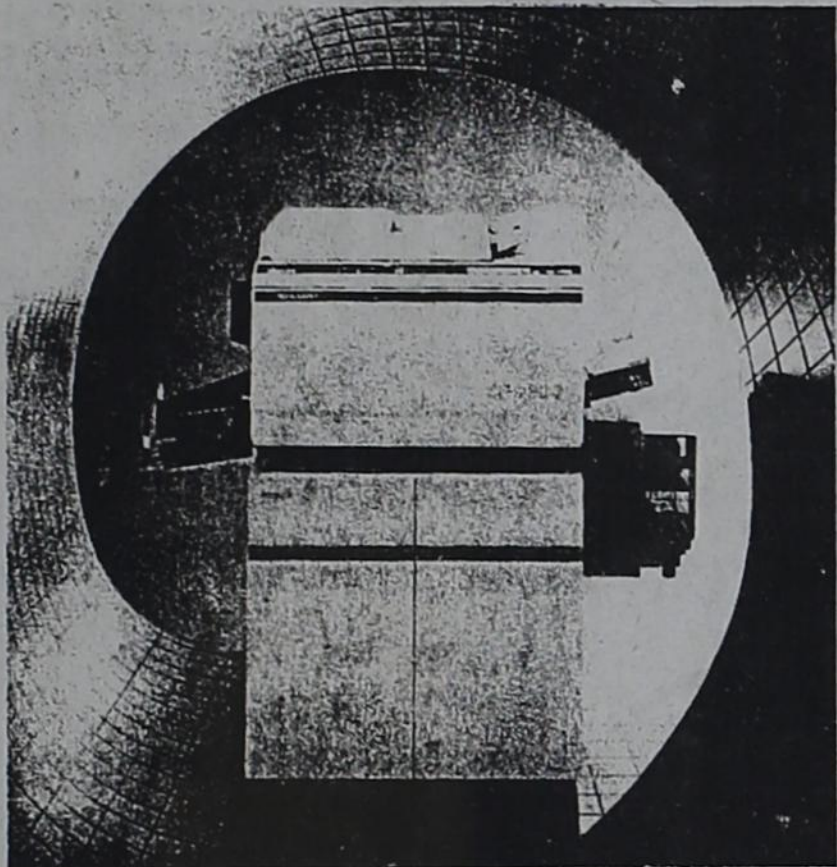
