This is basically a party function and the way each political party
determines who its slate of andidates will be in the November General Election. To participate in this process, you must decide in which party's Primary Election you yish to vote in a given election year, as you cannot vote in two
different parties' Primary Elections in the same election year. However, you may switch from one party to another from election year to the time you vote, your voter registration card will be stamped to show at which party's Primary you voted; once it is stamped (or once you have signed an afficavit if you
did not bring your card), you cannot
