Total land area in Parmer County is 549,760 acres. Of this total, approximately 528,000 acres are
considered farm property And of considered farm property. And of
this latter total, approximately 424,000 acres are subject to irrigation.
Farmsteads, towns, industrial
sites, railroads, highways and water sites, raiiroads, highways and water
areas make up roughly nine per cent of the total land area.
The underground water supply
that furnishes water to irrigate the that furnishes water to irrigate the
farms is considered to be the most important natural resource in the
county. Corrn is the county's largest crop,
with 197,303 acres planted in 1975. Wheat is the second largest crop,
with 120,000 acres planted for the 1976 season. Grain sorghum, one
the leader, was third in 1975 with 54,100 acres harvested.
