The commission also authorized lengthening of the mule deer season
in both the Trans-Pecos and in both the Trans-Pecos and
Panhandle regions, from nine to Panteen days. Opening days in both regions will be the same as in the past, with the extra days added to

November 19 -December 4 in the Panhandle and November 26 December 11 in the Trans-Pecos.
