Up to 80 percent of cancers may be related to the way people live rather than hereditary causes. nutrition specialist with Swe Texa Agricultural Exalist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, said a recent report from the National
Cancer Inslitute (NCI) indicates that lifestyles have a vital role in an individual's cancer risk.
Sweeten said NCI has suggested that each individual consider seven areas of cancer risk in relation to
lifestyles, including use of tabacco, diet, alcohol, radiation, work place, estrogens and viruses.
"Whether we smoke and what we eat, for example, may have a lot more impact on cancer risk than forces beyond our control, such as
heredity," she said. heredity," she said.
Offering the grea
reducing cancer risk, according to the NCI report, are avoiding use of tobacco and eating right. The report indicated that about 30 percent of cancer deaths are
attributable to tobacco use and about 35 percent may be associated with diet.
Sweeten said the percentage of other five risk factors to 5 percent each according to the report.
Several surveys show that people are trying to stop smoking and cut moking ake, the report indicated. older dropped 10 men 20 years and 1977 and 1983, but the percentage of women who smoke grew during that period.

By this time I was resigned to the probability of being seriously injured, yet everything seemed to slow down or revert to slow motion. Adrenalin was flowing, allowing my senses to convey
information and me to execute information and me to execute
reactions in micro-seconds. My life was saved by my organized, splitsecond reactions.
Both arms wrapped around the wheel, I steered as far to the right a possible without going into the
 miss.
No suct No such luck. When our left, front fenders ollided; both were sheared from the vehicles, along with the two driverenough control to keep from going into the ditch; I was able to steer the pick-up a little to the left, in
order that an approaching tree would land on the passenger side of my vehicle, rather than on me, when I hit it,

dive' into the ditch, then to flip end over end, sideways.
When everything stopped, I was still hugging the steering wheel, the engine was still running, and I was still alive!
I killed the engine and crawled out. The front-end was down in the
ditch, the pick-up bed had come off and was laying on the passenger side, the back tires had been ripped from the rims when they made impact with the asphalt during the
flip, and the back-end was resting up on the road.
My only injury was a bruise which later appeared on my chest, from holding the steering wheel so closely. The man in the car escaped
