## Drugs are the most prevalent crisis facing today's society

It should be obvious to all that
one of the most prevalent crisis in
our society today is drug abuse.
We are constantly reminded of this
by the media in all levels of our
society. Our response to this
dilemma has been popularly
described as war. It's a war that
should be fought by every
concerned citizen in ail the varied
environments of America.
A simple definititon of a drug
makes it easier for us to
understand what we are fighting.
A drug is any substance other than
a food that affects the way our
mind and body works. Not ouly
does this involve the abuse of
commonly recognized drugs such
as marijuana, crack and cocaine,
but also the abuse of alcohol.
Most of us shudder at the thought
of abusing drugs such as
marijuana, crack and cocaine. At
the same time we condone the
abuse of alcohol, even by our
youth, that is just as lethal and
destructive as other drugs.
There are two principle ways we
can fight drug abuse. These are by
cnforcement and education. We

sixteen of our citizens. This is often a difficult part of our profession as law enforcement officers. Some of these citizens that were arrested are people that we have watched grow up. Not
only that, but they are people we may have daily contact with. In law enforcement we have the sometimes difficult task of dealing with the other results of drug abuse. It often seems to us that
jail and prison sentences are much jail and prison sentences are much
more productive for a drug abuser than other consequences such as assaults, killings, maiming and fatal accidents, and suicides.
The more pleasant tool in the war against drug abuse is the

R. E. was instituted in Sonora Public Schools this past year. Here, we are trying to educate our children and encourage them to develop positive alternatives to drug abuse. We must educate these children at such an early age

## Farmers urged to maintain federal records on workers

by Preston R. Faris, CEA-Ag Farmers, starting on January of this year, were required to start from wages of employees Employers must keep on file a completed W-4 form for each employee. This W-4 form etermines the correct amount to withhold from each paycheck, based on how many exemptions
-

Regarding seasonal migran vorkers who don't live in the area where the farmer resides, the mployers will have to be able to
show they have made a good-faith effort to locate the workers so that the W-2 forms could be sent to them. This means that the employers should obtain and put the permanent addresses of
workers on file for reference
Workers who do not earn the minimum taxable wage base of $\$ 4,400$ will be eligible to recover all federal taxes that have been offer assistance to their workers in obtaining such refunds when warranted. Farmers should use the IRS
Circular E to determine Circular E to determine correct withholding rates. They can call
the IRS toll-free at $800-424$ the IRS toll-free at 800-424-
FORM to obtain this circular and other forms or come by my office where I have a few of these forms. In addition, farmers are reminded that the Social Security tax rate
for 1990 also increased from 751 for 1990 also increased from 7.51
percent to 7.65 percent for percent to 7.65 percent for
employers and employees and to 15.3 percent for those who are self-employed.

Home buying! The process of
finding the home you desire and finding the home you desire and vocabulary all its own, especially for first time home buyers. Here are some of the terms you're likely to hear along with brief ARM - S
ARM - Short for adjustable-rate
mortgage. ARM interest rates change at regular stated intervals (often yearly) based on some independent index such as Treasury Bill yields.
CLOS
CLOSING- also called buying step. At closing, you si for the loan, make a down payment, pay closing cost and CONVENTIONAL LOAN - A guaranteed by a government or a private source. However sometimes, depending on the amount of the down payment, a lender will require Private
Mortgage Insurance until the principle balance declines to $80 \%$ of the appraised value.
ESCROW - Depositing money or documents with a neutral third party until the actual sale. Escrow
can also refer to the initial payment and continuing monthly payments into the lenders account to pay for yearly taxes and EIXED-RATE MORTGAGE (ERM) - Mortgage interest rate remains the same during the life of the loan.
EHA LOAN - Short for the Federal Housing Administration which insures this type of loan. LISTUNG - Placing a property for sale with a Real Estate agent.
"Listings" are houses for sal through agents.
MORTGAGE - A loan backed by real estate. If you fail to make the loan payments the lender can take your house.
PUTI - Shorthand for your
monthly home payment to the lender, consisting of loan principal and interest, and real estate taxes and insurance.

POINTS - Up-front amounts Each point equals $1 \%$ by lenders. amoun
OUA OUALIFYING - The process of meeting a lenders requirements to obtain a loan. Different lypts formulas. A conventional loan usually requires formula standard of $28 / 36$. Your monthly home payment, including real estate taxes and insurance is limited to $28 \%$ of gross household
income; home payments plus other long-term debt such as auto loans are limited to $36 \%$ of income. cont'd on page 3

They will permit its purchase or use to affect other, more vital priorities. They will too great. Most important, they will not subsidize the "drug lords by purchasing the 'weed', knowing people die in the process. It's no worth it.

Local sales tax rebate released
State Comptroller Bob Bullock
stated that his office sent checks totaling $\$ 156$ million to local sales tax rebates to cities and This month's total is the second highest monthly rebate in the state's history with last February's payments of $\$ 157$ million to cities and counties setting the
state's record. state's record.
Total payments last February were $\$ 1.2$ million higher than this month because a number of large audit payments were credited to the books last February, Bullock said. This February's payments to cities totaled $\$ 143$ million. Houston received $\$ 24$ million,
the state's largest payment. Dallas he state's largest payment. Dallas
received the state's second largest payment of $\$ 15$ million. San

Austin received $\$ 6$ million. Payments to counties totaled $\$ 13$ million this month, compared to $\$ 12$ million last February. Merchants collect the state, city
and county sales taxes and send and county sales taxes and send
them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state keeps its 6 percent share and each month sends cities and counties their portion of the sales tax. taxes collected on December sale and reported in January by businesses filing monthly tax returns. Also included in this month's payments are sales tax and yearly filers. Sonora received $\$ 27,256.60$ this period.
