The Family Shelter, under the umbrella of the Institute of
Cognitive Development, is oping to start a family shelter in Sonora. Four people involved
with ICD were in Sonora Monday afternoon to talk with local community leaders.
Program Director Wilma Igwe said, "There is domestic violence going on in and around this community.
Igwe said the Family Shelter
currently helps people in Sonora and the surrounding area when the abused make the trip to San Angelo where they are based. What Igwe would like is for the

to assist those who are in need with the announcement of a new comprehensive housing plan. President Bush recently announced a broad-based housing plan to help the homeless and
entry-level home buyers with a program called "Homeownership and Opportunity for People Everywhere (HOPE). The plan proposes down payment assistance for first-time home buyers, a
$\$ 2.15$ billion matching grant $\$ 2.15$ billion matching grant of public housing, and a package combining shelter resources with supportive services to alleviate
homelessness. omelessness
A crucial aspect of the plan
would help first-time home buyers would help first-time home buyers
accumulate funds for a down payment, one of the largest barriers to homeownership. Under the HOPE initiative, first-time buyers would be alowed to
withdraw funds from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) without penalty and apply the funds toward a down payment and closing costs. The maximum
amount that could be withdrawn amount that could be withdrawn
from an IRA for a down payment from an IRA for a down payment
is $\$ 10,000$ and the maximum is $\$ 10,00$ and price is 110 percent of the
