had followed the original radio call with a statement that said it was a full-scall exercise.
"You have to take everything as they are, he said.
Still, Humphrey was nervous. Prior to the exercise, emergency

be a drill sometime that day. They did not know the time, place, or what kind of emergency drill it would be. Humphrey said the first thing that hit him when he reached the

but several people have said that Humphrey did a good job when he got to the scene. Humphrey was not as convinced, "I had a lot of things' I missed."
