"All I thought about while I was in German prison camps was getting out and getting something to eat," stated Lt. Morris Cooke when he returned home this week after being liberated from German prisons where he had been confined for ten months. Now he back at home on a sixty day furlough and can't seem to get enough good ol' home-cooked fried

Lt. Cooke told the Star reporter that he was fortunate that he had ceived fair treatment while in erman hands. He was well and received sufficient food to carry through the ten months period. He was given German newspapers and German communiques . . . all news was from the German point of view. According to the German guards, they were winning the war until the very last. "We could tell something was taking place outside," Cooke "because we were treated much better just before we were



Many improvements and perfections in cooking services will mark the first gas ranges off the assembly lines after production can be resumed. Six months after steel and other materials are allocated for consumer appliance produc-tion, some finished ranges will be on the market, according to man-ufacturers. Homemakers who have purchased bonds for new gas ranges after the war can look for-ward to simplified top burner cooking, with speed more than ever an important factor. Multiflame top important factor. Multiflame top burners of pre-war ranges were designed in standard size, and in giant size for quantity cooking where a wider flame spread is needed for large utensils. Since 80 per cent of the cooking is done on top burners, designers of tomor-row's ranges hint that there may be a wider variety of sizes—such as simmering burners and several

other sizes adapted to special Cooking needs.

One of the achievements in top burners will be more even distrib

tion of heat, due to new burne designs. This will mean the elimi-nation of hot spots, sometimes unavoidable even at simmering temperatures — an improvement which will be welcomed by all cooks.






