

After opening the trap door to the compartment Ortiz noticed some

The 1988 pickup was seized and Martinez was booked into the Sutton County jail where he was charged with aggravated possession of marijuana and for not having hidden compartment underneath the paid state tax for the illegal contraband. Martinez is being held in jail and bond was set at \$30,000 for both offenses.

What type of Christmas celebrations were held during the early years of Sutton County?

For the answer to this question we will reprint the following articles from the December 20th and 27th, 1890 issues of the Devil's River News.

At a meeting of the citizens held in the school house on Saturday evening last, to make arrangements for amusements during the holidays, Professor J. M. Bell was appointed chairman, and Max Mayer secretary-treasurer, the meeting called to order, and the following committee appointed.
