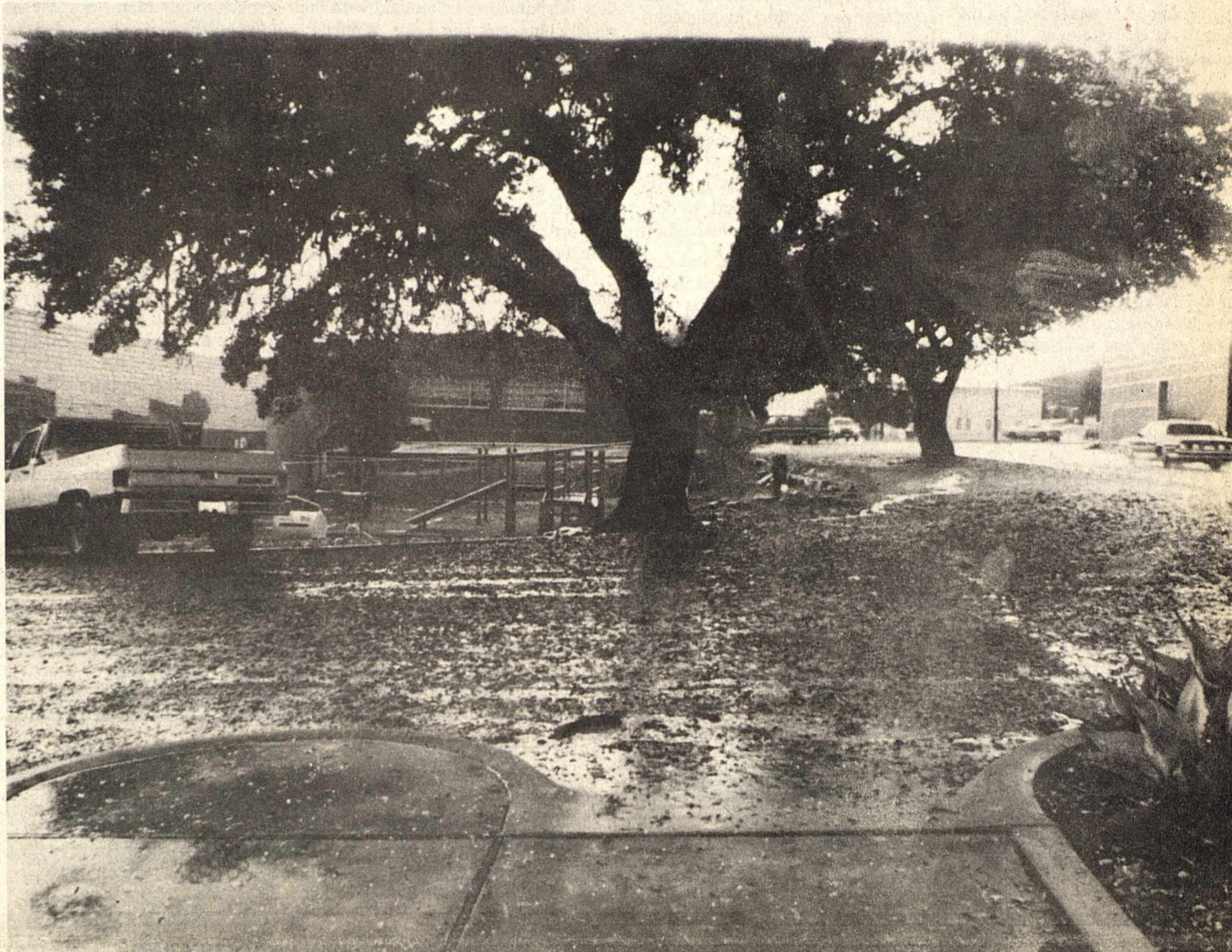

West Side Lions set White Cane Days for March 27

Westside Lions of Sonora has set March 27 as White Cane Days for Sonora. March is nationally acclaimed White Cane Days month for Lions.

In 1925 Miss Helen Keller challenged the Lions of America to band together to serve the blind and needy with impaired vision. This wonderful woman with multiple handicaps called her inability to see the greatest of her limitations.

One of the first great steps of Lionism was the White Cane which makes the blind person more mobile. It (the White Cane) was proposed in 1927 by Lion George Bonham, then president of the Peoria, Illinois, Lions Club. It became not only a symbol stating that the user was blind but also a

tool of sight-by-feel for the blind and near-blind.

The concern of Lionism for those with failing or lost sight grew as Lionism grew. But the cost of the new needs of sight serving are a constant challenge of Lions Clubs financial reserves.

West Side Lions Club endeavor to help those in need in our community and in Lions District 2A1.

We have already distributed our collection centers and our drive will target March 27, 1993. When we will be out in force handing out our White Canes and asking for your support.

Exhibitor space is still available; the fees are \$20 for non-profit organizations, and \$50 for other organizations. Reservations are

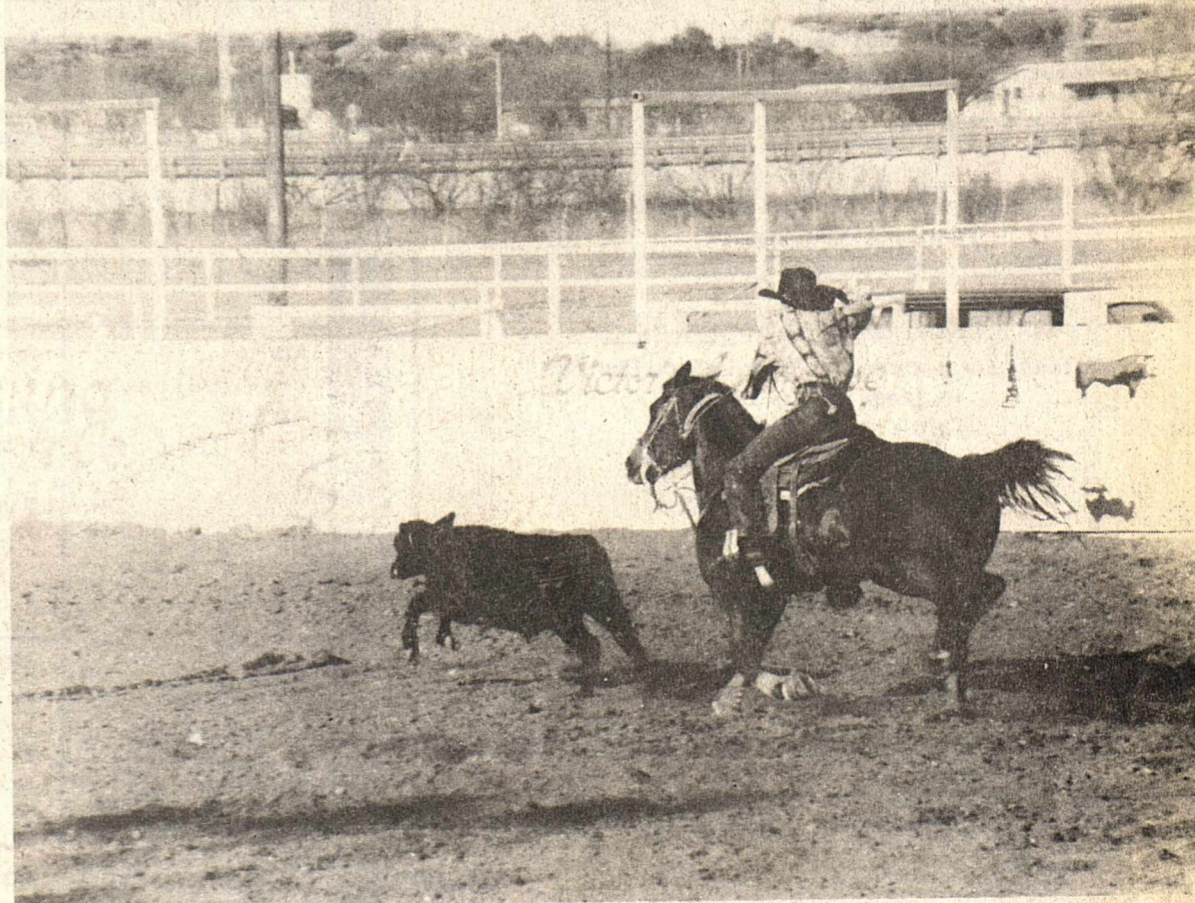

Hepatitis B seminar held

A Hepatitis B seminar was held at the Sutton County Emergency Medical Services Building on March 15, 1993 from 5 to 7 p. m. Lenora Pool, EMS Coordinator was the lecturer for the program.

Some of the topics covered were: exposure risk, identification of covered employees, and different types of protective equipment (gloves, masks, etc.)

Also during the program two video's were shown concerning Hepatitis B, HIV and AIDS. At the conclusion of the presentation the first in a series of three injections were given. Maria Carrasco, RN with the Department of Health gave the injections.

The seminar was given for the Sutton County Emergency Medical Service personnel, Sutton County Sheriff's Department and City of Sonora Police Department.

EMS to offer CPR classes

Sutton County Emergency Medical Service will sponsor two American Heart Association Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Course C classes during the month of April.

The classes are as follows:
April 6, 1993 (Tuesday) 9 a. m. - 12 noon.

April 26, 1993 (Monday) 7 p. m. - 10 p. m.

Course C: This course is designed for the healthcare provider. (Hospital personnel, nursing home personnel and Dr.'s offices, etc.) In

this class you will be trained in adult one-rescuer and two-rescuer CPR, child one-rescuer and two-rescuer CPR, infant one-rescuer CPR, and adult, child and infant foreign body airway obstruction management. Cost: \$20.00 per person.

- ☐ También puede someter un "reporte de valoración disminuida" para avisar al distrito de cualquier reducción significativa en la valoración de su propiedad en 1992. El distrito examinará su propiedad antes de designarle un valor en 1993.

¿Cual es la hora del cierre?

El día miércoles, 31 de marzo es la última fecha para mandar sus rendiciones para 1993. Puede obtener 30 dias adicionales si los pide por escrito antes de la hora de cierre.

Ask the Historical Society

St. John's Episcopal Church was remodeled around 1940. Do you have any information on the remodeling.

Devil's River News, Friday, September 10, 1937 under Sutton County Is Building! we find the following:

No more appropriate time will present itself for the picturing of the beautiful St. John's Episcopal Church building than today -- two days before the first service is held there.

Not many months ago it was a small frame building. Today it is one of the most attractive houses of worship in this section. The building was rock veneered and remodeled throughout.

The contractor was J. T. McClelland with rock work done by G. W. Archer.

Native stone was used in rock veneering the frame structure the church formerly used. Interior remodeling was done with a new floor laid, the altar and vestry room made larger and twisted weave rugs placed in the aisle. The front of the church was revamped with two arched windows and a center entrance built. Attractive indirect lighting fixtures hang from the beam ceiling. Other indirect fixtures are on the walls. Kneeling benches have leatherette covering.

Two memorial windows of stained glass have been given and these match the former three in the church. The new ones bear the inscriptions: "W. L. Aldwell - February 17, 1859 - April 14, 1931" and "D. J. Wyatt - 1863-1929."

A circular window, one of the three memorial ones in the church before the recent work is in memory of an early day rector of the church -- "Richard R. Mercer - October 31, 1857 - August 17, 1925." The other two are in memory of -- "E. R. Jackson -- February 25, 1861 - December 23, 1911" and "Thomas Bond -- December 19, 1850 - April 5, 1922."

Gifts to the church to aid in the modernizing of the interior include the following:

Reredos, a wooden carving replacing the curtain behind the altar, given by Mrs. J. L. Nesbit and Mrs. T. A. Williams; prayer bench, given by Mr. and Mrs. Bryan Hunt; credence shelf, given by Young Woman's Guild.

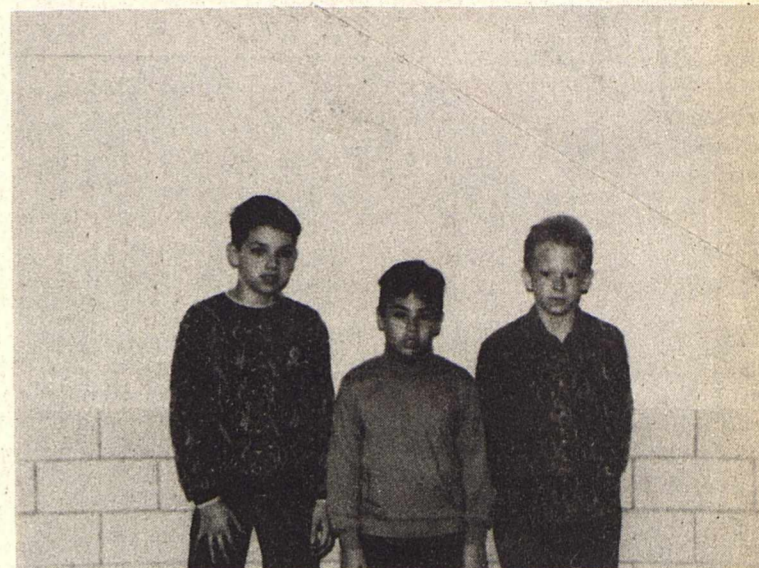
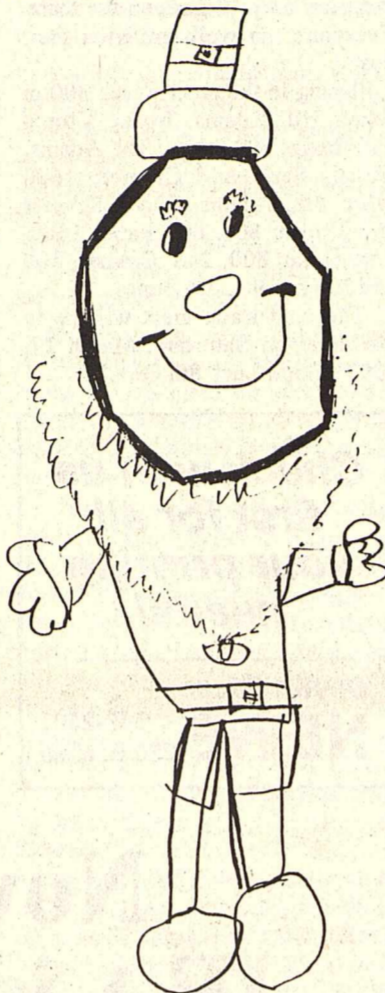
Tricky leprechaun on the loose

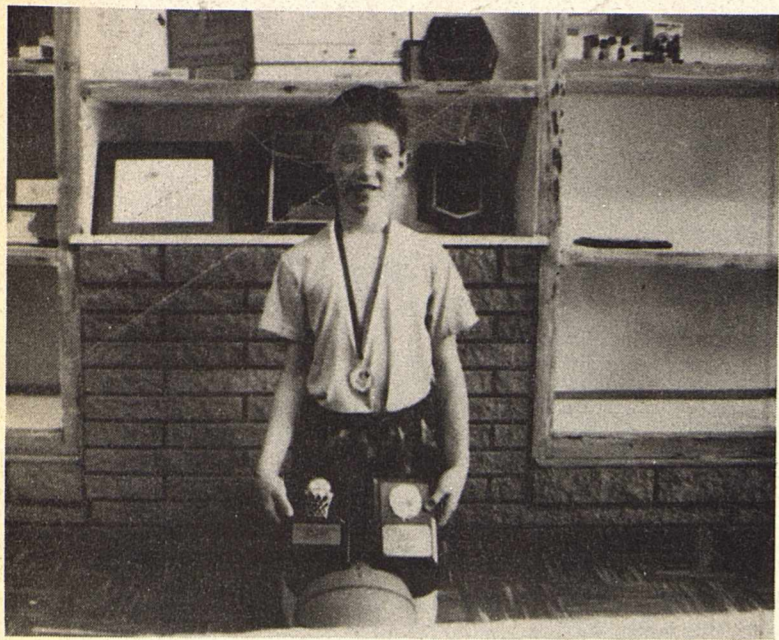

Junior High girls participate in Cub Relays in Ozona

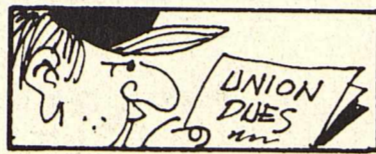
7th GRADE

Protect your rights! "Render" your property by March 31st.

A "rendition" is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on January 1st of this year. The rendition form is available at your local appraisal district office... or you may draft a similar form.

Who must file a rendition?

You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income--such as the inventory and equipment used by a business.

Are there any advantages to you?

The advantages of filing a rendition are:

- ☑ You give your opinion of your property's value. If the appraisal district believes the value is higher, it must notify you in writing of the higher value and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
- ☑ You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- ☑ You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 1992. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 1993.

What's the deadline?

The last day for filing or postmarking 1993 renditions is Wednesday, March 31. You can get an extra 30 days if you ask for it in writing by the March 31 deadline.

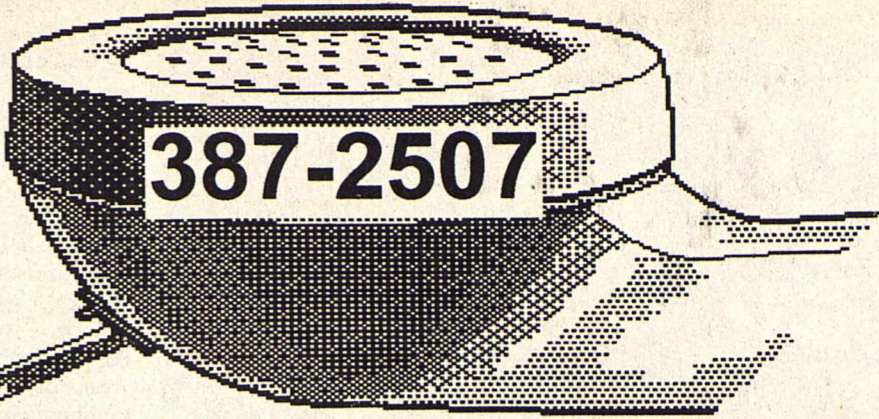

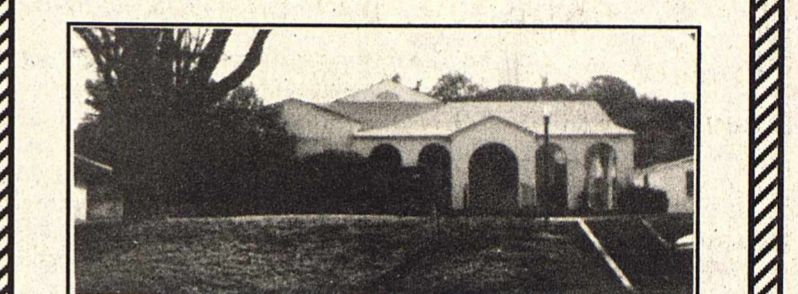
