Education voted unanimously we do encourage the voters of at the July 13 meeting to order an election on September 11 for the purpose of securing voter approval for the method of lowering the district's appraisal values to \$280,000 per student and selected Option 3 as its choice for complying with Senate Bill 7. 





If your get fr total household income is the same or less than the amounts on the Income Chart Below, your child can get free meals or reduced price meals. A foster child may get free or reduced price meals. Rear meals regardless of your income. The reduced price is 40¢ for lunch and 30¢,

TO GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS FOR YOUR CHILD, YOU MUST apply for meals anytime COMPLETE AN APPLICATION AND RETURN IT TO THE SCHOOL. WE CANNOT APPROVE AN APPLICATION THAT IS NOT COMPLETE.

HOW TO APPLY

If you now get food stamps or AFDC for the child you are applying for, the application must have the child's name, a food stamp or AFDC case number for that child, and the signature of an adult household member. If you are applying for a foster child, the application must have the child's name, the child's "personal use" income, and an adult signature. If you do not list a food stamp or AFDC case number for the child you are applying for, then the application must have the child's name, the names of all household members, the amount of income each person got last month and where it came from the signature of an adult household member and that adult's social security number of the word "none" if the adult does not have a social security number.

Verification: Your eligibility may be checked at any time during the school year. School officials may ask you to send papers showing that your child should get free or reduced price meals.

Fair Hearing: You may talk to school officials if you do not agree with the school's decision on your application or the results of verification. You may also ask for a fair hearing. You may do this by calling or writing: Charles Russell, 807 S. Concho, Sonora, Texas 76950, Phone (915) 387-2545.

Reporting Changes: If your child gets free or reduced price meals because of your income, you must tell the school if your household size decreases or your income increases by more than \$50 per month or \$600 per year. If your child gets meals because you get food stamps or AFDC you must tell the school when you are not getting AFDC or food stamps for them. You may then fill out another application giving income formation.






