## Bonilla Claims Partial Mohair Victory

Congressman, Henry Bonilla said today he is delighted to declare victory against the retroactive cut in the wool and mohair program passed last week by the Senate.

"This has been a very stressful time for West Texans and people in many rural communities across the country," Bonilla said. "More than 500 letters and calls came into my office just this week from families whose livelihoods would have been destroyed by this retroactive cut in the wool and mohair program."

"I have been working with several of my colleagues to get the truth out about the program," Bonilla said. "One of the greatest challenges was to get Congressman Dick Arme, one of the strongest adversaries of the program, to understand what this retroactive cut would do to Texas."

"I talked to Mr. Arme every day this week and was extremely pleased when he told me late last night that he would not oppose our amendment to restore this year's wool and mohair payment," Bonilla said. "He told me he was persuaded that it would be wrong to support this retroactive cut which would kill the wool and mohair industry and drastically hurt the Texas economy."

Because foes of the program did not raise an objection, the House passed the amendment to restore next spring's payment by a voice vote.

"I appreciate all the real-life stories people sent to my office," Bonilla said. "Showing the opponents how their reckless decisions would affect real families and real jobs helped them see past the misinformation spread by those prime-time news shows."

"Today's House vote marks victory for thousands of hard-working families whose efforts this year will not go down the drain," Bonilla said. "It is also a relief for all the banks and small businesses that could have been forced to close their doors if the wool and mohair producers had lost everything."

A new era for the Texas Department of Transportation in Sonora will begin October 1 when Joe W. Lane, retiring area engineer, passes the keys to his office, as well as administrative and engineering responsibilities to Paul R. Chevalier, III.

Lane received a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from Texas Tech University in 1958. He obtained his professional engineer's license in 1962. After six years' experience in Interstate 20 design and construction in the Abilene district of the then Texas Highway Department, Lane transferred to Sutton County to work on Interstate 10. Upon arrival in Sonora in November of 1964, he began finalizing location studies for I 10 and preparing an alternate route study for the Sonora business route. he was the moderator for the public hearings concerning right of way, served as the state's representative in four major condemnation suits, held pre-construction hearings with contractors, and was responsible for fifty-four miles of I 10 design and construction. Lane also worked closely with the Soil conservation Service on water retention and flood prevention in Sutton County. During peak I 10 construction there were over forty engineering employees under Lane's supervision.

In 1973 the two resident engineers' offices in Sutton County were combined extending Lane's responsibilities to all construction and plan work in Sutton and Schleicher Counties. From 1973 to 1987 he supervised bridge widening and rehabilitation projects in Tom Green, Iraan, Real, Edwards, Val Verde and Crockett counties as well as in Sutton and Schleicher. He served as the state's representative in two major wrongful death suits brought as a result of accidents on I 10 construction in Sutton

County. According to the State's Attorney General's Office, meticulous records kept by Lane and his local staff and expert testimony by Lane were the major contributions leading to the state's release from all liability in both cases.

In January 1987, Lane was promoted to Engineer V. Since that time he has supervised necessary surveys, field notes, right-of-way map preparations, design, construction, rehabilitation and maintenance operations in a five county area including Sutton, Schleicher, Crockett, Reagan, and Iraan. He has also been responsible for individual projects in Val Verde, Real, and Tom Green counties. Serving under four different district engineers he has personally negotiated with land owners concerning construction easements and material sources, co-ordinated activities with local and state agencies, conducted employee seminars, and routine

citizen complaint resolution. In addition Lane has served as mentor for entry-level engineers-in-training, one of whom has been Paul Chevalier, his successor.

Chevalier began work under Lane's supervision immediately upon graduation from Louisiana Tech University in 1986 with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering. His engineering apprenticeship was served on major construction projects in Val Verde and Iraan Counties in 1986-88. He was transferred into the Sonora office in February 1988 and began design work on various projects. Chevalier's training in all phases of highway engineering qualified him for his professional engineer's license which he received in July 1991.

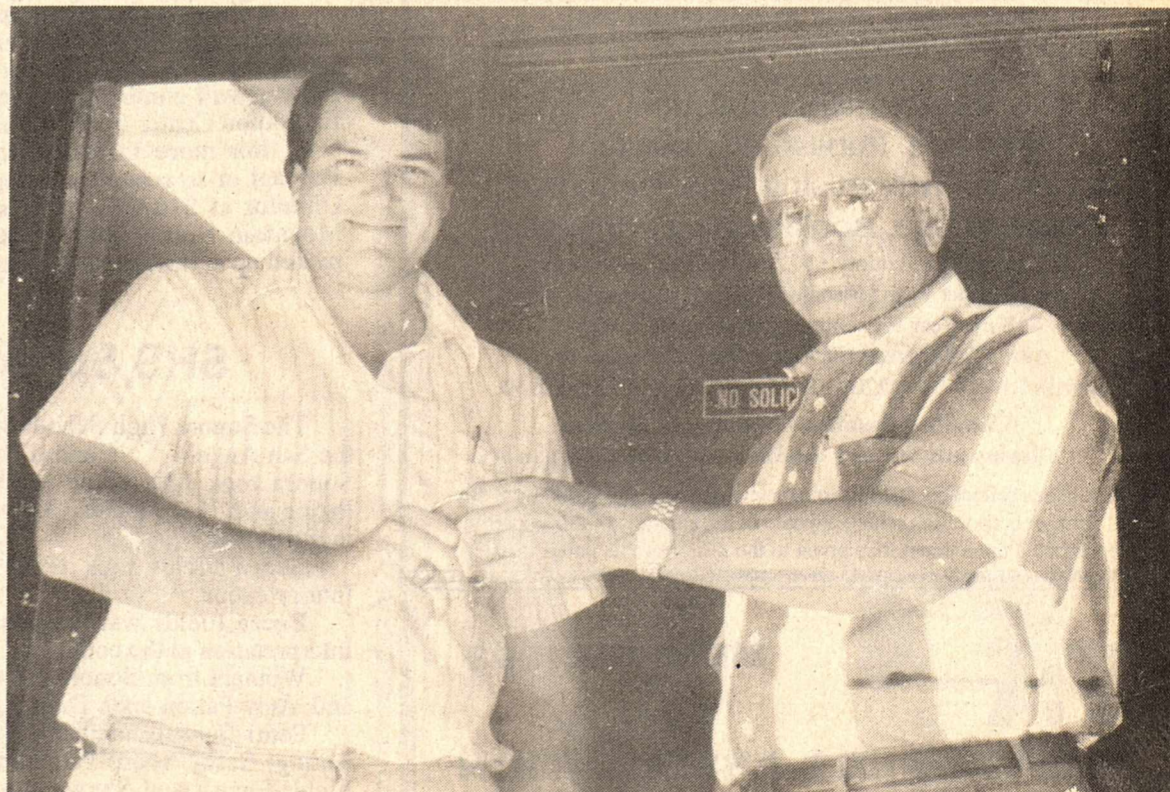
Joe Lane and his wife, Anita have been active in community affairs. Their two daughters, Flaire Shumard of Eastland and

Marche Milam of Mandeville, Louisiana are graduates of Sonora High School. Mrs. Lane was a teacher in Sonora Public Schools for twenty-three years. They are members of First Baptist Church.

Chevalier and his wife, Cheryl, are the parents of two sons, Harrison and Judson, both of whom were born in San Angelo. Mrs. Chevalier is the manager of Sonora Caverns. Both are active in community and civic affairs, and they attend the Catholic Church.

Marshall Heap, a Junction native, and a graduate of the University of Texas joined the Sonora engineering staff in June. He will serve as engineer-in-training under Chevalier's supervision.

Lane states that he is certain Paul Chevalier will receive the same "Stockman's Paradise" goodwill that has been afforded the Lane family for the last twenty-nine years.

## Blood Drive Scheduled

Sonora Community's next blood drive will be from 11:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Monday, October 11, 1993 at the Emergency Medical Services Center. Lenora Pool, Sonora's community blood drive coordinator, hopes to have 35 donors at the drive to help meet blood demands for patients at 21 area hospitals.

This year, United Blood Services is placing an even greater emphasis on precise inventory control to assure that all donations are used most effectively. More O positive and O negative blood is needed to meet increasing patient demand for these blood types. At the same time, the patient need for AB positive blood is extremely low. That is why people with AB positive blood are not being called to donate at the upcoming drive.

"Generally, most healthy people who are at least 17 years old and weigh at least 110 pounds may donate," Janet Gallagher, Community Relations Director with United blood Services explained. "There are quite a few people who do not realize they are qualified to donate."

People who are taking vitamins, hormones, birth control pills, diet pills, high blood pressure medication or antibiotics for acne MAY donate.

We also suggest that donors eat a small meal before donating," Gallagher continued. Anyone interested in more information may contact Sutton Co. EMS at 387-5132.

# "Business As Usual"

"Until further notice, it is 'business as usual' in the county ASCS office for the Wool and Mohair program", says Herb Schwertner of the Sutton County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. Producers are requested to continue to bring in sales documents for the 1993 program year. Also, if an appointment is scheduled to complete eligibility forms in the ASCS office, Herb says to keep the appointment, or let the office know so that a time can be rescheduled. The County Committee must make "person" and "actively engaged" determinations for each person that applies for any program in 1993.

Herb reminds all producers that nominating petitions will be mailed in October to all known voters in the county. An election will be held in December to fill the position of County Committee Member, Charles Shannon. Charles is eligible for re-nomination in 1993. Petitions must be received in the county ASCS office by November 1, 1993. 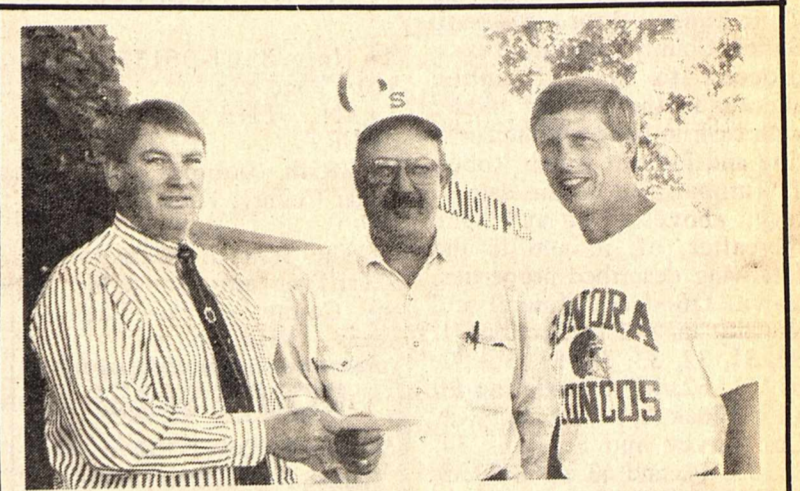
# Choirs Collaborate

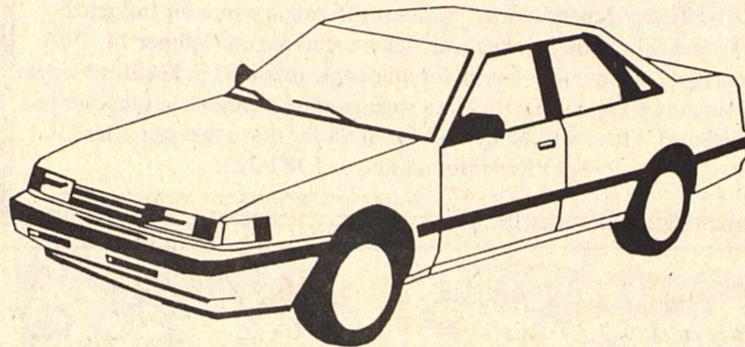

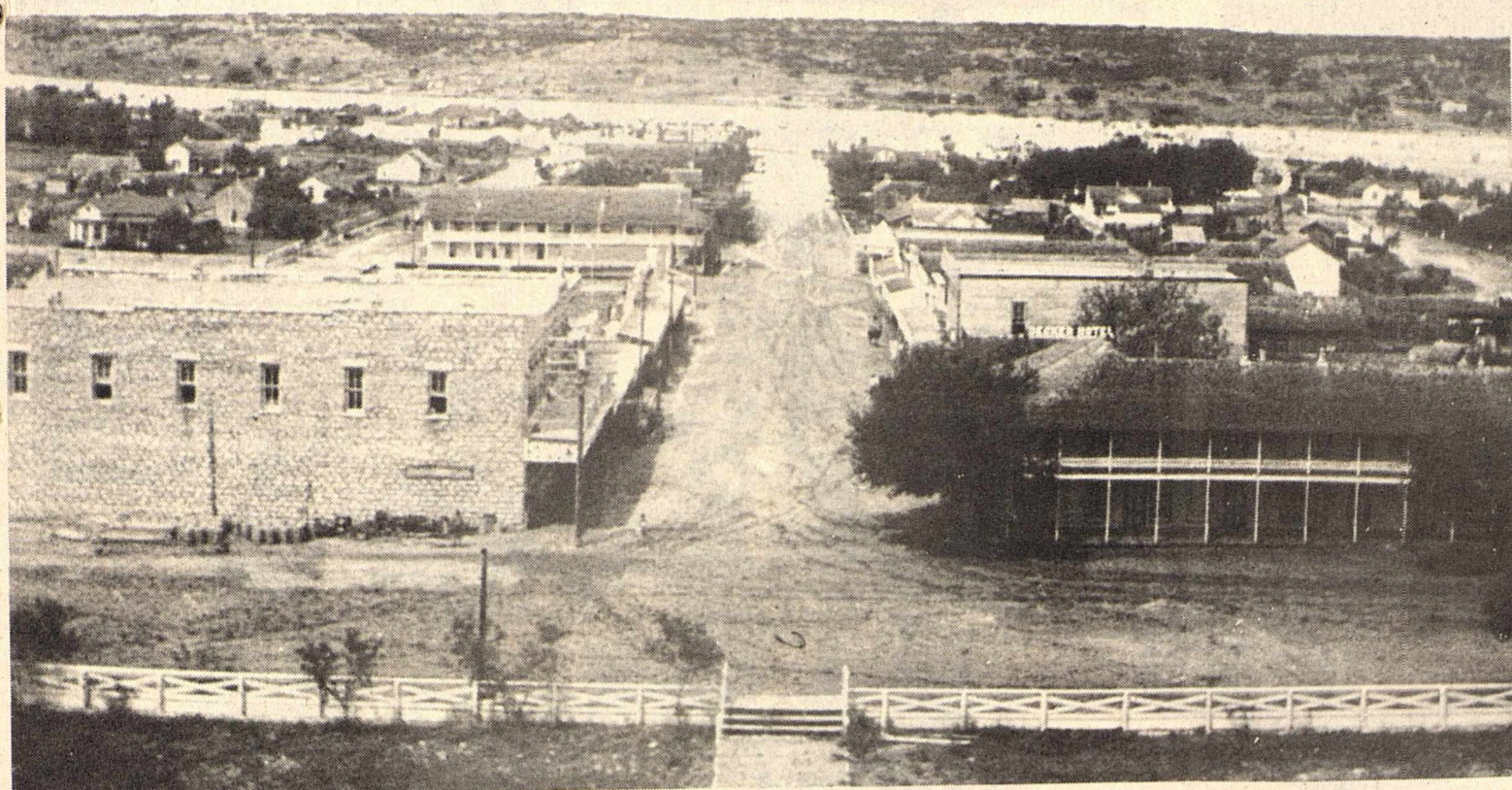

# Ask The Historical Society

ASK THE HISTORICAL SOCIETY by the Sutton County Historical Society

Q: When did the Decker family come to Sonora and build their hotel and when and why was it torn down?

A: Devil's River News, November 8, 1890.

W.F. Decker of McKavett was in town Thursday and purchased a business and residence lot in Sonora, will build at once and move his family here as soon as possible. Mr. Decker is a saddle and harness maker and will open a shop in the trading center of the Stockman's Paradise.

December 20, 1890 - W.F. Decker and family arrived Thursday from McKavett they will reside at the home of George Morris until they can build.

Mrs. W.F. Decker died April 21, 1891 at Ft. McKavett of typhoid pneumonia.

June 27, 1891 W. F. Decker will shortly commence building a two story store on Main Street nearly opposite the Devil's River News office. (Where Dillard Insurance is now located.)

December 5, 1891 - Mr. and Mrs. Henry Decker spent Wednesday in town, trying to rent a house. He wants to move to the trading center but does not fancy living under a Live Oak tree.

Marriage Records indicate that W. F. Decker married Mrs. Laura Buchanan on October 4, 1893.

March 2, 1895 Devil's River News state that W. F. Decker will commence building a two story hotel on his property on Main Street shortly.

Sonora Business Directory in the November 2, under Hotels: Decker House, Traweek Hotel, Huffman House (formerly Max Mayer residence burned down March 1896). In the April 25, 1896 issue under Hotels: Decker Hotel, Traweek Hotel, Wyatt Hotel.

Records of Birth indicate that a daughter, Ida Isabell Decker, was born to W. F. and Laura Decker on April 21, 1896 in Pulaski County, Arkansas.

Through the years we find J. W. Caldwell, D. G. Howton, J. A. Cope and others listed as

proprietors of the hotel. Devil's River news of July 15, 1911 lists Laura Decker as proprietress.

On January 19, 1912, W. F. Decker sold to Laura Decker all of lot 1, 1/2 of lot 2, and all of lots 20 and 21 (Decker House) for \$10. Vol. 12, page 366 Deed Records. The Decker Hotel was located on lots 1 and 2 of block E.

W. F. Decker died November 10, 1912 and Laura Decker continued running the Decker Hotel. On May 24, 1914, Ida Isabell Decker and Walter Gilbert were married at the Decker House. On January 19, 1915, Mrs. Laura Decker married T. T. Masters.

Deed Records, vol. 15, page 215, indicate that Laura Masters sold the Decker Hotel to Geo. Aldwell and T. B. Adams on August 24, 1917.

Devil's River News, January 21, 1920, the Board of Directors of the Sonora Hotel Co., sold the old Decker Hotel building to Roy Rees for \$13,000. Everything is to be cleared away

in sixty days.

The Sonora Hotel Co. was supposed to build a three story, fire proof hotel, containing 50 rooms. For some reason the plans fell through, the building was never built and the lots stood empty for years.

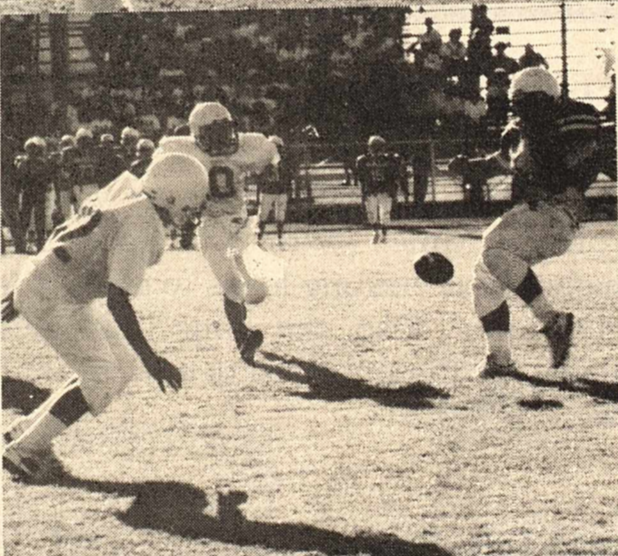
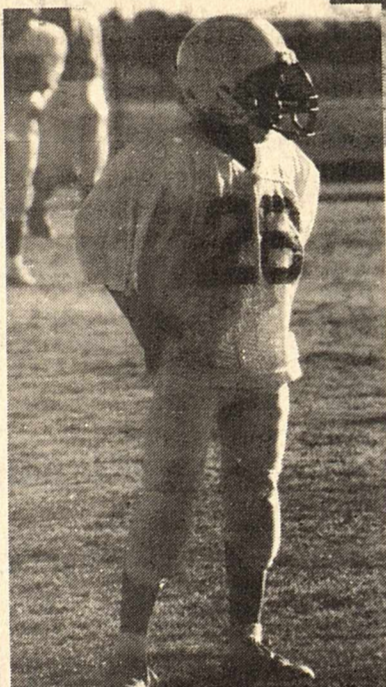
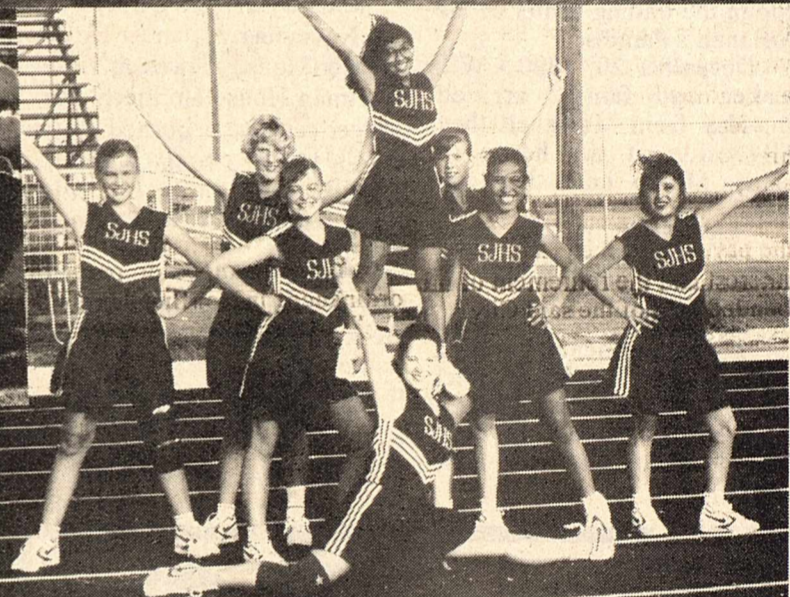
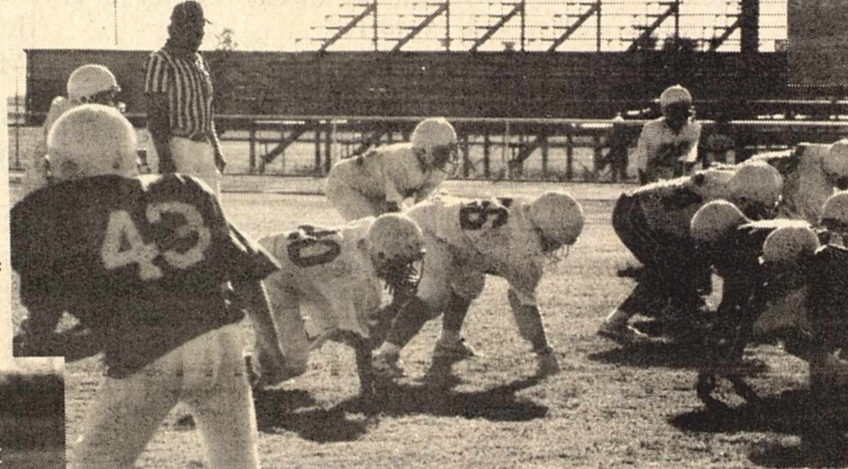
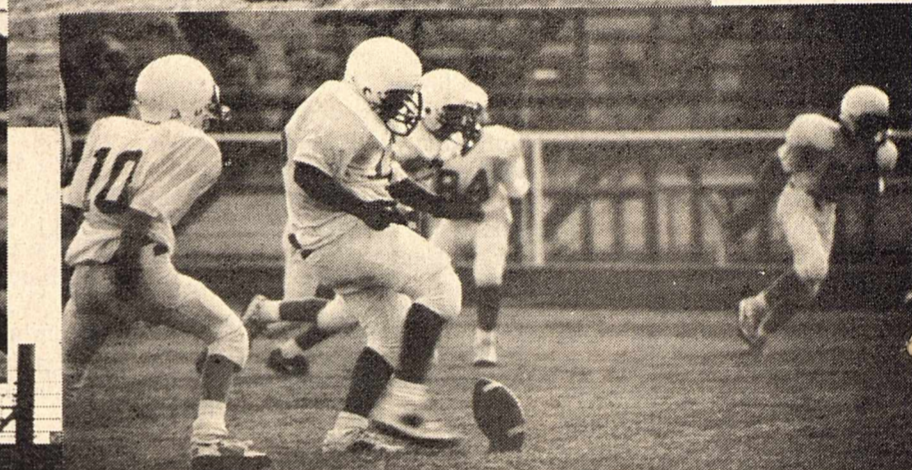
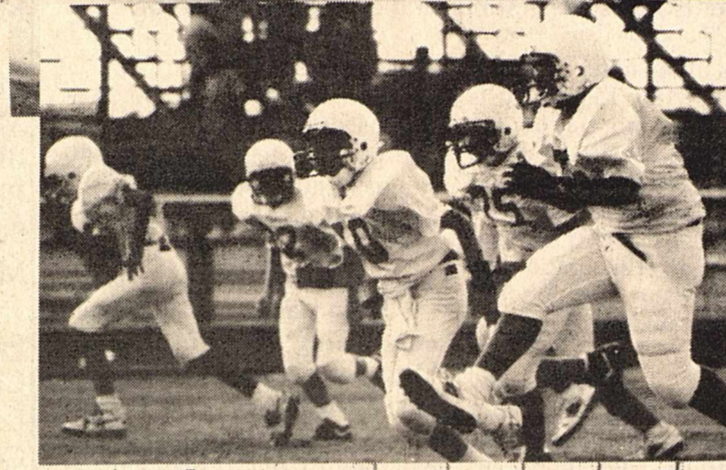
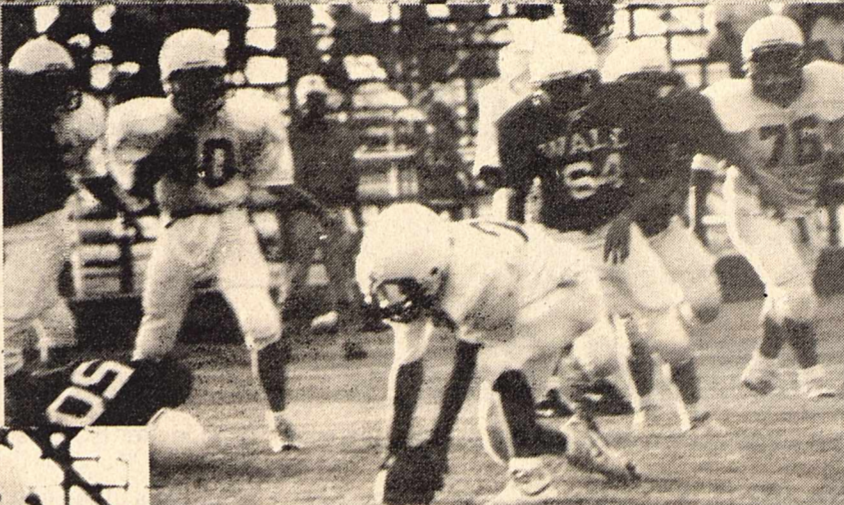
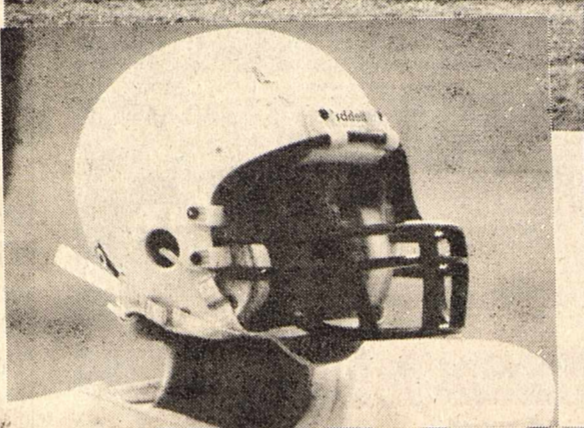
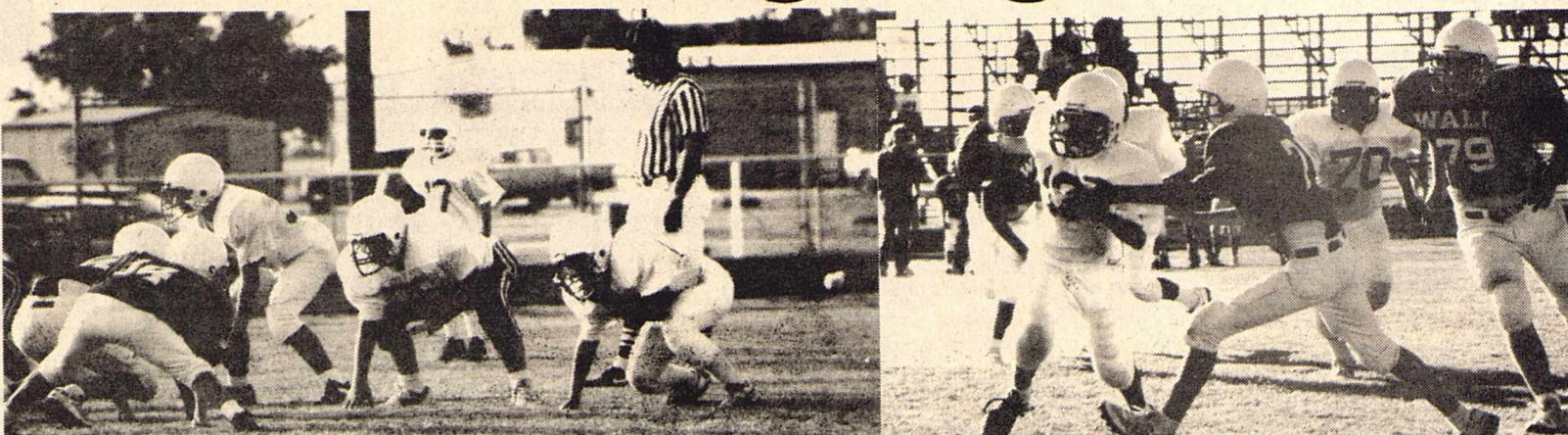
## Eighth Grade

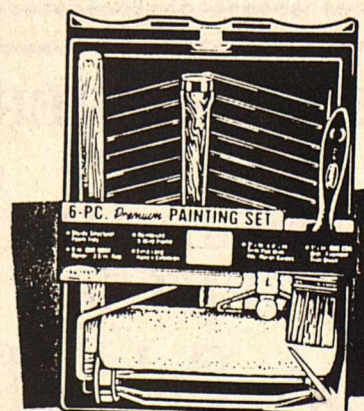

3. Hotel Motels \$8.75
4. Laundry room \$8.75
5. Wash rack minimum \$16.25

**6. Mobile homes**

a. Individual trailer space \$12.50

b. Each additional bath or partial \$1.25

7. Court house, jail, schools and churches (per commode) \$5.00

8. Grease rack \$11.25

The appropriate category and the resulting collection fee shall be determined by the City Manager and his duly authorized representative and the fee thus determined shall be in force for no less than the following twelve (12) billing periods.

**ORDINANCE NO. 412 - GARBAGE RATE**

An ordinance amending an ordinance of the City of Sonora, Texas amending sections of Chapter 12, garbage and trash; publication; conflict; validity; declaring an emergency.

Whereas, it is deemed advisable, necessary and in the best interest of the City of Sonora and its citizens and for welfare to provide regulations relating to the utility services provided to its citizens.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Sonora, Texas.

Section 1. That Section 12-12 (c) and (e) Garbage and Trash - Fees For Collection are hereby amended to read as follows:

(c) Assessment of fee. The collection fee will be assessed to all owners, occupants, tenants or lessees to whom the collection service is available and shall include a six and one fourth (6 1/4) percent state sales tax along with the local sales tax of one (1) percent.

(e) Fees. The collection fee schedule shall be as follows:

(1) Residential:

Inside city limits, per month \$7.50

Outside city limits, per month \$8.75

(2) Commercial and industrial:

Class A: Minimum monthly service charge for one (1) small dumpster or trash receptacle:

\$7.50 per month, pickup weekly

\$15.00 per month, pickup twice weekly

\$22.50 per month, pickup three (3) times weekly

\$37.50 per month, pickup daily

Class B: Minimum monthly service for one (1) large dumpster or trash receptacle:

\$20.00 per month, pickup weekly

\$40.00 per month, pickup twice weekly

\$60.00 per month, pickup three (3) times weekly

\$100.00 per month, pickup daily

Class C: Minimum charge for two (2) large dumpsters or trash receptacles:

\$40.00 per month, pickup weekly

\$61.25 per month, pickup twice weekly

\$82.50 per month, pickup three (3) time weekly

\$125.00 per month, pickup daily

Class D: Minimum monthly charges for three (3) large dumpsters or trash receptacles:

\$60.00 per month, pickup weekly

\$82.50 per month, pickup twice weekly

\$105.00 per month, pickup three (3) times weekly

\$150.00 per month, pickup daily

All commercial and industrial customers outside the city limits shall be charged an additional fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per mile traveled.

The appropriate category and the resulting collection fee shall be determined by the City Manager and his duly authorized representative and the fee thus determined shall be in force for no less than the following twelve (12) billing periods.

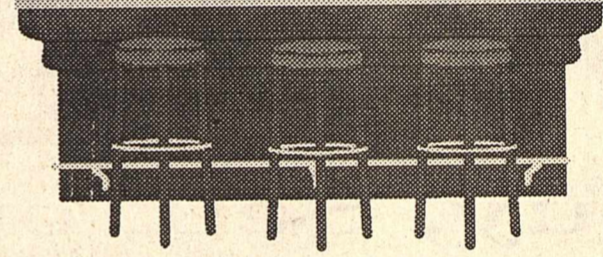

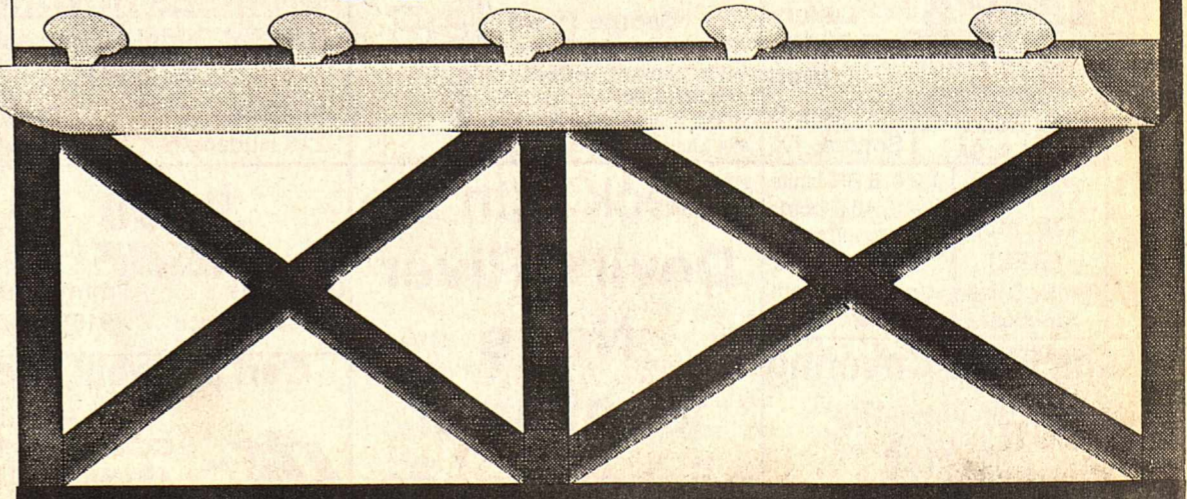


