Many times we as Many times we as EMT's arrive at an accident scene where the patient has either vehicle wreck, involving an injury to the neck and spine. Our first concern to this patient is the ABC's, Airway, Breathing, and Circulation, and the spine. No matter how serious the accident our raining teaches us to always
mmobilize the patient to prevent further injury to the spine or neck. A cervical ollar (C-collar) is placed around the neck to prevent compression, and the patient is
placed on a rigid backboard to prevent movement to the spine. $17 \%$ of the people involved in an accident in which a spinal injury has occurred is found to e walking around the scene. hey later find they have to the injury they were unaware of. Signs of spinal injuries are pain upon movement, dislocation of the injured area, and tingling felt throughout the body.
