James Edwin Bruton, 85, formerly of San Angelo died Saturday, May 14, 1994, in Lubbock hospital.





How a Woman's Tears Changed Name of Randell to Sonora by W. E. James

'Few people know the real facts of the 'how and why' of the town of Sonora - who started it and when. Old-timers interviewed here and there have given versions of the matter as they remembered it. All concede that it was the work of Charley Adams, and in fact, it was he who laid the foundation for the thriving little city.

"But it was his wife, Mrs. Alice E. Adams, who was the real founder of the town and gave to it its name. It was Mrs. Adams' idea, and she convinced Mr. Adams that it would be a good thing to do. However, she reserved the right to name the town, when and if it was started. These facts were obtained from Mrs. Adams through her son, Ica, (Ica was born in 1893) who now resides in Brawley, California. The following quotation is taken from a recent letter from Mr. Adams:

'My mother conceived the idea first, to start a town and finally convinced my father. It was her only wish that, if a town was started, she be given the privilege of naming it. This was agreed to and my father proceeded

toward this end.

A water well was started in the latter part of the year 1888, and the location of the well was in what is now your courthouse yard. This well came in the early part of the year 1889.

My mother was then living at Fort McKavett. When my father informed her that he was getting ready to send in the papers for starting the town, evidently he had forgotten his promise to let my mother name it. He had selected a name: 'Randell.'

My mother states that she broke into tears' and that my father acceded to her wishes. She then selected the name of 'Sonora' and sent it to my father a day or so later. Sonora was chosen by my mother, not because of any particular meaning, but because she liked the word and the way it sounded."

The story of Mrs. Adams

naming the town was also printed in the Devil's River

News at that time. Word of mouth history is great to listen to but sometimes the facts become distorted through the years. This particular story is backed up by an article in 1890, when the event occurred, by several people who were there at the time and is fairly well documented in several periodicals. I am sorry you don't like this "yarn" but it looks like it is not going to come unraveled.

Don't forget readers, we are still looking for pictures, or copies of pictures, of everyone who has ever lived in Sutton County. Please we need your help to complete this project.

#### Jordan's Market Report May 12, 14, and 16, 1994

Receipts totaled 5121 head. The market continues to sell steady on the calves seven with the down feeder and fat cattle prices. On Saturday at the Special Replacement Sale we saw a good house full of buyers and sellers from a wide area of Texas and Oklahoma witnessed over 4000 head of replacements go through the ring at steady to firm prices. The only exception were some of the higher dollar pairs with \$1150 per pair being the highest price paid on a set of cows bred back with big calves on their sides. The majority of the better pairs sold from \$950 to \$1100 while a few of the pairs sold in the \$850 to \$950 range. The bigger the better longbred cows and heifers ranged form \$750 to \$890 with one group bringing \$985. The smaller framed or younger heifers sold from \$650 to \$750. Fall calving cows and heifers mostly sold from \$700 to \$875 range with some smaller frame or younger kind going from \$600 to \$725. The better open and exposed heifers sold from \$600 to \$740 while the balance of the open and exposed heifers sold from \$460 to \$635.
