Few animals were in such demand in the early 1800's as merino sheep, Spanish breed prized for the quality and abundance of its hecce. Since Spain forbade their sale to foreigners, any American who got hold or to breed them.
What b
businesslike interes burgeoned into a nationa nania in 1807: an embargo $n$ British textiles made wool production, and prices for merinos soared as high as $\$ 1,000$ each. In 1810 the Spanish king was unseated just long enough to lose xport, causing sheep to value of American merinos But the madness persisted until 1815 , when the-effect of influx of Spanish sheep was finally felt, leaving flocks of sorely devalued heep. note: According to several local ranchers the Merino is raised mainly in Australia now.
