
The Firefighters Association announces that George Keese of Sonora has been awarded Firefighter of the Year for 1994.





TIGER CUBS DISCUSS FIRE SAFETY




JV BOYS LOSE CLOSE ONE

Q. When did people start using Christmas trees in America?

A. For the answer to this question I will quote from the Reader's Digest Discovering America's Past:

Oh Christmas Tree!

1 The evergreen tree was not always a beloved symbol of Christmas in America. For years its appearance at holiday time was a source of heated

Henry Schwan might have thought he was giving his congregation a gift when he set up a Christmas tree in his Cleveland, Ohio, church in 1851. But the gesture met with outrage instead. Newly emigrated from Germany, the Reverend Mr. Schwan did not realize that dragging a tree into the holiday would be regarded as sheer paganism. For in some households, Schwan's was the first tree ever to appear in American church. Even as late as 1883 The New York Times was railing against the German Christmas tree," calling it "a rootless and lifeless corpse--never worthy of the day.

It was, in fact, Germans who brought the custom of any event the cay of the trimming trees to America, collected tree was ending, for beginning in Pennsylvania in the 18th century. By 1747 the Moravians, a religious sect, were decorating their holiday tables with pyramids of greens. And by 1825 the Christmas season in Philadelphia was not complete without a walk about town to view the elaborately decorated

Although still far from common in the early decades of the 1800's, the tradition of decorating trees began to spread as German settlers moved west. Not every community, however, offered a choice of evergreens. A sassafras sapling decorated with candles, hickory nuts, and hawthorn berries

brightened one family's Christmas in St. Clair County, Illinois, in 1833. In frontier Kansas, dried sunflowers served as makeshift "trees." and on the high plains of Colorado, families made do with cottonwoods.

While some people would rather have decorated a tumbleweed than have no tree at all, general acceptance was slow. Articles that appeared in Godey's Lady's Book and other magazines helped to popularize the custom. And at Christmas time in 1850 the Charleston Courier proudly retorted that the ladies of the city decorated a special tree to greet the arrival of soprano Jenny Lind.

By the turn of the century, the demand for Christmas trees was such that the state of Maine alone was harvesting some 1.5 million balsam firs every year. All those trees were collected from the wild-a fact that prompted President Theodore Roosevelt to urge a ban on Christmas trees. He ended his boycott only after discovering that his own sons had snuck a tree into the White House, and the head of the Forest Service, in the boy's defense, persuaded him that thinning the forest could be not only safe but beneficial. In in 1901 a New Jersey farmer discovered that the evergrowing demand for Christmas trees made them a highly profitable seasonal crop.

Note: From back issues of the Devil's River News we know that the earliest residents of Sonora turned Christmas into a town celebration with church services, dances, horse races, games, singing and a Christmas tree in the local school house.

CITY COUNCIL MET

The City Council of Sonora held their regular meeting on Tuesday, December 20, 1994 at 2:00 p.m. in City Hall.

The council passed two ordinances: the annexation of 6.757 acre tract on Savell Street, requested by Tracy Crites, and setting a public hearing concerning the annexation of 1.56 acre tract located on 2nd Street, Hunt Hollow Addition, requested by Richard Key.

After reviewing recent activities concerning several cities and counties in Texas withdrawing funds from Tex Pool, the city decided to take the conservative approach to protect their funds by withdraw them and depositing them into Sutton County National Bank. Due to the current interest rate, this action will not result in a loss of revenue.

Phillip Sagebiel, representing Sagebiel and Ravenburg, presented the 1994 fiscal year audit. Mr. Saggabill stated that the city is beginning a trend of expenses outweighing revenue, due to the revenue remaining approximately the same, but an increase in expenses due to the special projects the city has been involved in. He recommended that the city be more selective in choosing priority projects before spending. He also recommended a conservation approach in operating and maintenance expenses.

Department head reports were heard from four departments: Jim Garrett stated that the swimming pool is on schedule; Juanita Mesa stated that the new dishwasher was in place and working and that the new stove would be installed Wednesday, December 21st at the Senior Center; Amber Martin stated that HUD had placed 19 families with housing in Sonora and had 45 on the waiting list; Lisa Lipham reported that everything at the airport was running smoothly and that she was waiting for a reply from the state on what to do about the deer problem.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:58 p.m.



For the Christmas issue, I would like to tell a true Christmas story. I will be back with news around town after the holidays. A special thanks to Melinda McLain and Buddy Summers, who made me realize that this is a story worth telling.

Once again, the evil in the world drowned out the story of a boy, a balloon, and two unlikely, Santa's, but the stories of tragedy cannot stop the Christmas miracles that occur when people like Uncle Homer and Miss Mollie believe that miracles are possible, and sometimes just take a little bit

Just as a child's balloon can cross national boundaries and create a little Christmas miracle in the minds of those who can think of nothing better to do than to send back a box of blessings, thinks what blessings God is sending back even now in response to our Christmas prayers. The thoughts and prayers of good people everywhere can find their way to others. As long as people of faith believe that miracles are possible, peace on earth will not be drowned out by all of the tragedy that happens around us, and good will to all men will be a message, both sent and received.







FOCUS ON HOLIDAY OR PARTY BUFFETS

A popular way to celebrate holidays or any party occasion is to invite friends and family to a buffet. However, this type of food service where foods are left out for long periods leave the door open for uninvited guests -- bacteria that cause food borne illness.

Food borne Bacteria are everywhere but a few types especially like to crash parties. Bacteria can be found on people's hands and steam tables. And unlike microorganisms that cause food to spoil, harmful or pathogenic bacteria cannot be smelled or tasted. Prevention is safe food handling. If illness occurs, however, contact a health professional and describe the symptoms.

Here is a list of bacteria to watch out for and some tips to help you have a safe holiday party: • Staphylococcus ("staph") bacteria -- are found on our skin, in infected cuts and pimples, and

in our noses and throats. They are spread by improper food handling. Prevention includes washing hands and utensils before preparing and handling foods and not letting prepared foods particularly cooked and cured meats and cheese and meat salads sit at room temperature more than two hours. Thorough cooking destroys "staph" bacteria but staphylococcal enterotoxin is resistant to heat, refrigeration and freezing.

• Clostridium perfringens -- "Perfringens" is called the "cafeteria germ" because it may be found in foods served in quantity and left for long periods of time on inadequately maintained steam tables or at room temperature. Prevention is to divide large portions of cooked foods such as beef, turkey, gravy, dressing, stews and casseroles into smaller portions for serving and cooling. Keep cooked

foods hot or cold, not lukewarm.

• Listeria Monocytogenes -- Because Listeria bacteria multiply slowly at refrigeration temperatures, these bacteria can be found in cold foods typically served on buffets. To avoid serving foods containing Listeria, follow "keep refrigerated" label directions and carefully observe "sell by" and "use by" dates on processed products, and thoroughly reheat frozen or refrigerated processed meat and poultry products before consumption.

Safe food handling tips always include washing your hands before and after handling food. Keep your kitchen, dishes and utensils clean also. Always serve food on clean plates -- not those previously holding raw meat and poultry. Otherwise, bacteria which may have been present in raw

meat juice can cross contaminate the food to be served.

If you are cooking foods ahead of time for your party be sure to cook foods thoroughly to safe temperatures. Cook fresh roast beef to at least 145 degrees Fahrenheit for medium rare and 160 degrees F for medium doneness. Bake whole poultry to 180 degrees and poultry breasts to 170 degrees. Ground turkey and poultry should be cooked to 165 degrees. All other meat, fish and ground red meats should be cooked to 160 degrees.

Divide cooked foods into small shallow containers to store in the refrigerator or freezer until serving. This encourages rapid, even cooling. Reheat hot foods to 165 degrees. Arrange and serve food hot in the oven (set at 200-250 degrees) or cold in the refrigerator until serving time. This way foods will be held at a safe temperature for a longer period of time. Replace empty platters rather than adding fresh food to a dish that already had food in it. Many people's hands may have been taking food from the dish, which has also been sitting out at room temperature for awhile.

The two hour rule should always be observed. Foods should not sit at room temperature for more than two hours. Keep track of how long foods have been sitting on the buffet table and discard

anything there two hours or more.

Keep hot foods HOT and cold foods COLD. Hot foods should be held at 140 degrees or warmer. On the buffet table you can keep hot foods hot with chafing dishes, crock pots and warming trays. Cold foods should be held at 40 degrees or colder. Keep foods cold by nesting dishes in bowls of ice. Otherwise, use small serving trays and replace them often.

When the party's over, discard any foods that sat for two hours or more on the buffet table. other leftovers can be refrigerated or frozen in shallow containers. Leftovers are safe in the refrigerator for four days. In the freezer, they are safe indefinitely, but most will have the best quality if used within two to four months. Remember, always thoroughly reheat leftovers to 165 degrees.





SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE RENAMED

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Soil Conservation Service has had a name change to the Natural Resources Conservation Service. The new agency was authorized as part of USDA's reorganization in October by Agriculture Secretary Mike Espy.

Our new name more accurately reflects what we do," said Paul W. Johnson, chief of the Natural Resources Conservation Service. "Our responsibilities go further than soil conservation.

They have for some time."

While the agency has focused on soil conservation for the past 60 years, it has also been the key federal agency to offer technical help on private lands for improvements to water, wildlife habitat, forest lands, grasslands, and other resources connected to the land. More recently, the agency has worked with the nation's private landowners to increase acreage of grasslands, wetlands and forest lands through USDA programs.

"More than two-thirds of the land in this country is privately owned. Those private landowners are the key to our environmental well-being," Johnson said. "We will continue to build on our 60 years of experience with a unique relationship between the federal government and those landowners, as well as our partnership with local conservation districts," Johnson added.

The new Natural Resources Conservation Service will continue to have responsibility for all the programs of the former Soil Conservation Service. In addition, several other programs have been transferred to it: the Wetlands Reserve Program, the Water Bank Program, the Forestry Incentives Program, the Colorado River Salinity Control Program, and the Farms for the Future Programt.

The Natural Resources Conservation Service will increasingly look at all resources on private lands as its resource conservationists help private landowners on a voluntary basis. "We will continue to be the American people's link to private lands, as helping caretakers of the land. But we think of land itself as a core constituent. I think we speak for the Land with a capital "L"--to go beyond the soil resource," Johnson said. "What's done on our vast acreage of private lands encompasses so much more--our water, our forest lands, our wildlife, our air and our quality of
