In order to clarify some of the

in Sonora Elementary frem in Sonora Elementary, from Pre-K
through fifth grade, once a month in through fifth grade, once a month in
classroom groups to implement the Character Education Curriculum which emphasizes the importance
of honesty, justice, loyalty, and of honesty, justice, loyalty, and
integrity in everyday life. I also
conduct five conduct five small-group counsel-
ing sessions per week with ster ing sessions per week with students
who have been referred by their who have been referred by their
teachers and parents to increase self teachess and parentso increase self
esteem, decision-making skills, and
improve in their social interaction improve in their social interaction
skills. To date, I have processed skils. To date, have processed
thirty-eight special-education referral packets, grades Kindergarten
through fifth grade which through fifth grade, which include
meetings with teachers and adminmeetings with teachers and admin-
istrators, parents, and individual istrators, parents, and individual
classoom observations. More than
150 hours of time have 150 hours of time have gone into
these referrals so far. I currently counsel with five special-education
students on an individual basis as recommended by the ARD commit-
tee. The district is reimbursed for the. The district is reimbursed for
these contact hours through Medicaid funds. I have given ten
GED tests to members for our community who are trying to improve
their lives by improved education heir lives by improved education
and I currently have three more
scheduled Three of scheduled. Three of the ten tests this
year were given to our high school year were given to our high school
drop-outs. Passing the GED test
removes te student removes the student from our drop-
out rate and improves the AEIS
A. indicator and district rating with
TEA. I am doing a career-education unit for several classes in the third
grade; I am currently testing stugrade; I am currently testing stu-
dents who have been nominated for the Gifted and Talented program; I
helped coach the second and third grade story tellers for ULL competi-
tion; and I will be working with the Tech/Prep office in San Angelo to find summer jobs for our local
youth. I have worked with the high youth. I have worked with the high
school PAL program, which I I
developed and taught for several
