The new Bovina doctor is 58, and has 24 years experience in the medical field.

# Party Primaries Set For Saturday, May 3

The Democratic and Republican primaries will be held next Saturday, May 3 in Parmer County and across the state.

A race for the unexpired term of County Judge is expected to swell the vote totals on the local level.

Porter Roberts, who was appointed to serve until the General Election, is opposed on the Democratic ballot by Jo Buchanan for the nomination.

Also drawing considerable interest is the race for Democratic nomination for the state senate, where Bill Sarpalius and Gerald McCathern, two Hereford residents, are facing each other. The winner of this showdown will face incumbent Bob Price in November.

Those are the main races which will concern local voters. The residents in

Precinct 3 (Farwell and Lariat) will nominate a commissioner from among three candidates. Incumbent Archie Tarter is opposed by Cecil Atchley and Max Crim.

Otherwise, the main statewide race which has drawn attention is the Railroad Commission race where incumbent John Poerner and Buddy Temple have been waging a heated campaign.

A smattering of other state offices feature contested races. (See the sample ballot on Page 2).

The Democratic ballot features a non-binding presidential preference "straw vote," but the Republicans will actually be giving delegate votes to either Ronald Reagan or George Bush.

## Local Polling Places Given

Bovina Democrats will vote at the American Legion Hall in the May 3 Democratic primary.

Horn also announced that the Democratic precinct conventions will be held at 2 p.m. at each polling place.

The county Democratic convention will be held at 2 p.m. May 10 at the First State Bank in Bovina.

Republicans will vote at the high school cafeteria, and their convention starts at 4 p.m.

The GOP also features a race for the Railroad Commissioner nomination, between E.W. Kidd, Hank Grover and John T. Henderson.

The GOP ballot contains two referendums, one to determine if the state should have Initiative and Referendum as a way for the public to vote directly on issues and make law in elections rather than depending only upon legislators.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on election day. See separate story for election places.

## Commission Passes Issue To Tax Board

Despite a report published last week by Farwell's State Line Tribune, the county commissioner's court has NOT accepted an anonymous gift of \$50,000 to build an office for the Parmer County Tax Appraisal's Board in Farwell adjacent to the court house, County Judge Porter Roberts said this week.

Roberts said that the commissioners discussed the matter in an impromptu, specially-called meeting last week, at which commissioner Archie Tarter gave the proposal, which called for the new office to be built on the northwest

corner of the courthouse property in Farwell.

The gift, supposedly would be a "no strings attached" proposition, except that the county would have to pave around the new 30x40-foot building.

"We agreed to present the matter to the tax appraiser's board, and then if they approve of it, we will put this on the agenda for a regular meeting of the commissioners," Roberts told the Bovina Blade this week.

The Parmer County Tax Appraisers Board is a newly-formed group which will be making appraisals for all of the taxing entities within the county. It is made up of E.A. Parham, Lawrence Jamerson, David Grimsley, D.C. Herring and Gilbert Kaltwasser.

The next meeting of the board will be held on May 5, and Roberts said that if the board favorably considered the proposition, the commission would place the matter on the agenda for its regular meeting May 12.

Commissioner Jack Patterson said it was his understanding in visiting with members of the tax board that they had been looking for office sites already, and had considered locations in Friona, Bovina and Farwell.

Roberts, as official spokesman for the court, said he wished to assure residents of the county that no official action had been taken, contrary to reports which had circulated throughout the county, and that it would not be officially considered except under the situations outlined above.

Jones remains in fourteenth place for all-around honors.

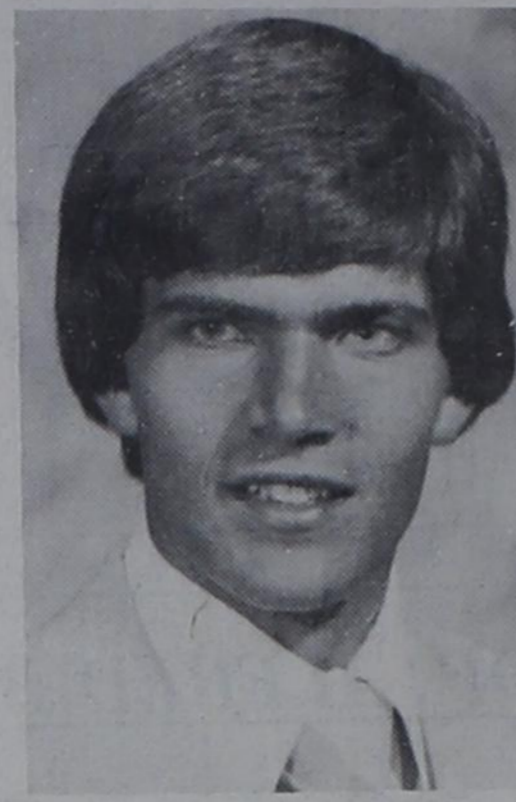

## Commission Plans Second History Book

Members of the Parmer County Historical Commission are working with Craftsman Printers, Inc., a division of Taylor Publishing Company, to formulate a second history book for the county.

Commission members are enlisting the aid of every resident of Parmer County so that every family in the county can have their family's history included in the book at no charge for the first 500 words. A charge of 10¢ (ten cents) will be charged for additional words in the histories.

The book will consist of history on committees, churches, organizations, education, historical landmarks and family histories. "This book will be unique in that it will be written by all the people in the county who send in their family history, thus giving emphasis to the importance of the family life in our history," a spokesman for the commission said.

If you are presently living in, or have previously lived in Parmer County, we need and want your family biography, as the history of the county will only be complete to the extent we all participate.

As a non-profit organization, the purpose of writing the history of Parmer County is to preserve



historical records for the education and enjoyment of future generations. The book will be available on a pre-sale basis only.

A logo for the new book has been established and work has already started on the project. The logo appears with this article and will be seen on successive articles as well as being used for letterheads and the front of the book. Bobby Weid was the artist who designed the logo.

Otho Whitefield has been selected to serve as County Chairman with his wife, Grace Whitefield, as assistant County Chairman. Orma Flippen will serve as record keeper and Allo Reeve will be publicity chairman. Field representatives have been appointed for each community and these will be published at a later date.

To produce such a book for the education and enjoyment of future generations, materials are needed for the family story section from NEWCOMERS as well as OLD-TIMERS and from present residents as well as those who formerly lived in the County.
