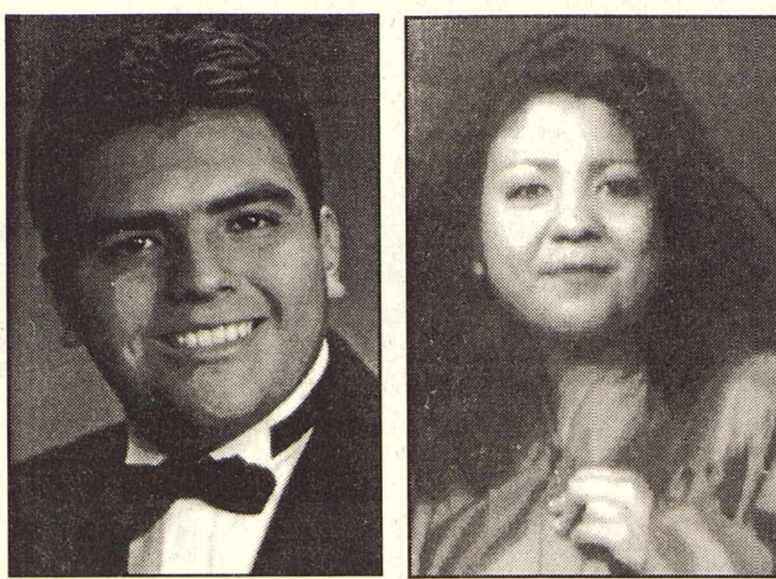





Historical Society

Q. Do you have any information on James Martin

A. We have several people named James Martin listed in our files:

James Henry Martin was born on 8th Sept 1826 at Cape Girardeau Co., Missouri to Andrew and Sallie Martin. He died on the 19th of October 1849 and was buried at Gentry Cemetery Kimble County. Gentry Cemetery is six miles below Junction on the Mason Road.

He had been married on 31st of October 1849 in the home of Harris Rowland in Saline Co., Arkansas to Mary Lee Rowland daughter of Harris Rowland and Francis Willis. He resided in Missouri until a short time before the War, when he moved to Little Rock, Ark. James Henry Martin served throughout the war in the Confederate Army. He immigrated to Clarksville, Red River Co., TX, immediately after the war. While in the army he contracted stomach trouble which caused his death. James and Mary Lee Rowland had the following children:

Andrew Harris Martin born: 20-9-1852 at Saline Co. Ark. married Annie Sandherr. He died 1928 in Comstock, Val Verde, Texas.

Martha Jane Martin born 2-7-1855 Saline Co. Ark married Joe Terry. She Died in 1934 at Matador, Motley Co., Texas.

John J. or T. Martin 27-2-1858 Saline Co., Ark. Died in infancy

Francis Emily Martin 30-7-1860 Ripley Co, Missouri married James Monroe Brotherton 30-4-1876. She died 24-9-1936 in Del Rio, Val Verde Co., Texas.

James Alexander Martin born 5-11-1862 Saline Co., Ark. Married 1 Amanda Kimble 2 Emmie Walker. He died 2-9-1910 buried Gentry Cemetery, Junction, Kimble Co., Texas.

Next Twins - John Rowland Martin and Sallie Hutchinson Martin born 24-12-1866 in or near Clarksville, Red River Co., TX John married Stella Acheah McMillan on 8-7-1891 He died 29-1-1956 Junction, Kimble Co., TX. Sallie Hutchinson Martin married Charlie Chester Kimble. She died 2-9-1940 at Douglas Arizona.

Mary Isabella born 19-12-1868 in or near Clarksville, Red River Co., TX married Walter E. Whitehead on 24-12-1885. She died 27-4-1941 in Del Rio, Val Verde, TX

William Allen Martin born 21-11-1870 in or near Clarksville, Red River Co, TX married Irma Ballew. He died 10-11-1949 at Burbank, Oklahoma.

First United Methodist Welcomes New Pastor

Members of First United Methodist Church in Sonora are to welcome a new pastor June 17.

The Rev. W. Conrad Archer, 60, replaces Rev. Suzanne Steves at the 305-member congregation. Steves, 45, who served in Sonora for four years, becomes pastor of First United Methodist Church, La Grange.

Bishop Joel N. Martinez of San Antonio announced the ministerial appointments in Corpus Christi during the June 6-9 session of the united Methodist Church's Southwest Texas Annual Conference.

Archer has been pastor of First United Methodist Church, Ganado, and Louise United Methodist Church since 1998. Before that, he served congregations in Bishop, Jacksonville and Temple.

Fifty-six of the 357 United Methodist congregations in Southwest Texas are to receive new pastors June 17. United Methodist bishops assign clergy members under their supervision to posts annually. A pastor may serve a congregation for more than one year if the bishop reappoints him or her to that post.

The Southwest Texas Conference area covers 77 counties in the southern third of the state. Total United Methodist membership in the region numbers more than 119,000.

Robert Henry Martin 7-1-1873 born in or near Clarksville, Red River Co., TX married a woman called Eliza Ann and he died 10-11-1940 Del Rio, Val Verde, TX.

Susan Farrow or Forrest Martin born 10-6-1875 in or near Clarksville, Red River Co., TX married a person named Staak and died 18-4-1891 in San Francisco, California.

Note: James Alexander Martin had two wives 1 Amanda Byrd Kimble and 2 Emmie Walker of these unions only 2 children, from his first wife were born. They are Harold 1894-1972 and Prosser 1896-1970.

Note: James Henry Martin was married first to Martha Hammond. They married in 1847 in Saline Co., Ark. Martha died in 1848.

In another family note it states that Walter Whitehead married Mary Isabella Martin at Howard's Well in Crockett Co., Texas in Dec. 1855 and that their children are: Emma (Wardlow), Charlie, W.R. (Lee), Willie B., F.H. (Tuffy), L.D. (Son), and Lois Dell (Topsy) Taylor. Son and Topsy are twins.

We also found a James A. "Turk" Martin, 48, died Wednesday in the Veterans Hospital in Big Spring Services will be at 2 p.m. today in Peters-Roberts Funeral Home in Hobbs, N.M. He was born June 17, 1926 in Bowie Ariz., lived in Sonora several years and was married to Margaret Goolesby in Hobbs, N.M. August 16, 1958. Survivors include his wife, two daughters, Cheryl Martin and Tami Martin both of Hobbs, N.M. and his parents Mr. and Mrs. John A. Martin of Sonora. (1974)

We hope this helps you find the James Martin you are looking for.

Q. In our baby book it says Great Aunt Beulah Pfister. How is she related to the Decker family?

A. Beulah Celeste Johnson Pfister (1875-1962) was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Johnson. W. F. Decker was married twice. His second wife was Laura Johnson Buchanan Decker Masters. They are related through the Johnson line. Mrs. Master's obit says that she is survived by 2 sisters: Mrs. Thomas of Sherwood and Mrs. Pfister of Sonora.

Q. How many children did Walter Horace Gilbert and Ida Isabelle Decker Gilbert have?

A. 3: Weldon Bruce Gilbert, Fred Truman Gilbert and Esther Lee Gilbert Hughs.

Q. How many children did James L. and Alma Wagley White Decker have?

A. 3: Lane Decker who stayed with his father when Alma died. David Shurley 1929-1993 and James Lewis Lightfoot 1928-1924 were given up and adopted and took their new families names.

Q. Where did S. G. Tayloe come from?

A. The father of S. G. Tayloe was J. W. Tayloe and he died in Memphis at the age of 90.
