Q. Have there been prob quitoes in the past?
A. Most species of mosquito do not carry disease. The problem arises when the few
species that do carry disease species that do carry disease
have large population growth and people do not take proper precautions. These mosquitoes carry and transmit yellow fever malaria, dengue ever, filariasis
and West Nile virus and sever other forms of encephalitis. Mosquito populations have been found as high as 14,000 feet and even in the Arctic
Circle. There are over 2,000 ircle. There are over 2,000
pecies of mosquito in the world. In the United States the best known are the Culex Aedes and Anopheles.
Mosquitoes are flies, ng only one pair of wings Spanish for "little fly." Unlik ther flies they have scales on heir wing veins and 14 or 1 egments to their antennae
Only female mosquitoes sing by vibrating the tiny appendages that cover their breathing holes in the thorax. They lay their
eggs in water or where water eggs in water or where water
will eventually cover them. In arctic regions they lay them on snow and they hatch when the snow melts. They lay them in
flat groups of 100 to flat groups of 100 to 300 . why the experts are urging people to empty water dishes unde plants, remove any tin cans, old
tires, tip lawn chairs so water tires, tip lawn chairs so water
doesnt stay in them; empty bird doesn't stay in them, empty
baths or anything else that can yard. Broken bottles, trash, any thing that will hold standing water and allow the mosquito to lay eggs and time for them to
hatch. If you have a water dish out for your animal or the birds, empty and change it every day and keep the eggs and larvae from turning into pupae and
