The U.S. Postal Inspection Service is warning consumers to beware of a notice in the mail that says the IRS is holding a refund

Postal Inspectors

Warn Against Scam

To claim the money, the notice says all you have to do is send ten dollars to an address in Florida. Those who send in ten dollars don't get a refund. Instead, they get a claim form--something the IRS gives away for free.

Linda Deiskopf, assistant director of the Taxpayer Service Division for the Internal Revenue Service, says there is never a charge to claim a refund.

"If a taxpayer is due a refund, all he or she has to do is call our 800 number, and we'll send them a claim form free of charge."

The IRS has a fully staffed 800 number for people who have questions about their income tax returns, including questions about tax refunds.

Meanwhile, postal inspectors offer tips to keep you from getting stung by scam artists who make bogus offers through the mail.

"Any offer that requires you to pay a certain amount up front should be looked at dubiously," says John Brugger, a postal inspector in Washington, D.C. "Be willing to check them out. Make a few phone calls and verify the truthfulness of the offer."


But one phone number you should not call is the 900 number printed on the postcard. Scams that employ this method usually charge high fees to victims who respond by calling.



Santa Fe tracks. A passing freight had notified Sheriff Williams of seeing the man in the car at about 12:49 p.m. Where the vehicle came to rest, it was not clearly visible from the highway, Williams said.

When the sheriff arrived on the scene, Hernandez was still alive, but he was dead on arrival at Parmer County Community Hospital after being taken there by Bovina Ambulance.

Officers found a fully-automatic pistol in the car with Hernandez.

"When you pull the trigger on one of those types of guns, it keeps shooting until the trigger is released," Williams said, in


Pageants Set Here July 3

As with the 1992 programs, 0/92 conserving use (CU) acreage may be planted, at the producer's discretion, to minor oilseeds (sunflower seed, safflower, flaxseed, canola, rapeseed and mustard seed). If minor oilseeds are planted on this acreage, producers must choose whether to retain deficiency payment eligibility and waive price support program eligibility or retain price support program eligibility and waive deficiency payment eligibility.

Crops prohibited on the 1993 flexible acreage will be the same as those prohibited in 1992 (fruits, vegetables peanuts, etc.).

Corn and sorghum permitted acreage will be combined. If you participate in the corn program in 1993, you must be in the sorghum program, also. You cannot participate in the corn program and go out of the program on sorghum. The planting mix between these crops is at the producer's discretion. 

Herb Gardens Are Great Pastime **Offer Cooking Varieties** And

By Carla McKeown Now that Spring is here and the days and nights are warmer, the back yard. We want to spruce it Tony and I have started spending some of our spare time in the herb garden.

So far, most of our gardening has been in the maintenance area-raking away the leaves we let drift around the plants to protect them from the winter cold, pulling the weeds that have already sprouted, clipping off old growth, etc.


"An empty tomb is not enough," I very quickly said. "They would not seal His tomb unless He still was there and dead.


