Bovina High School split their games against Happy last Friday night.

The Mustangs scored a 66-61 overtime win over the Cowboys, after the Fillies had dropped their game by an 89-26 score.

The Cowgirls were in command all the way as the Fillies could manage only four first-period points and trailed 21-4. It was 43-14 at the half.

Keri Mitchell was the only Fillies player to score in every quarter. She paced her team with nine points.

Happy jumped out to a 19-12 lead over the Mustangs in the boys game before Bovina got untracked. Cain Neal scored five points in the second quarter and

Bovina went to intermission trailing by only three, 31-28.

Corey Kirkpatrick's shooting paced the third quarter. He had one three-point goal, one two-pointer and was two of two at the line as the Mustangs pulled to within two, 43-41.

Kirkpatrick added five more points, as did Juan Reyna, and the Mustangs tied the count at 59-all and forced the overtime.

Free throws were the difference, as Reyna hit five of six at the line in the O.T. period, and Neal hit two of three for the win.

Kirkpatrick led the Mustangs with 18 points, Reyna had 15, Neal 11 and Rusty Venable 10.

Last Tuesday the teams lost games to Nazareth. The Fillies were swamped, 102-23, and the Mustangs lost their game, 64-53.

Donna Griggs scored 16 of the Fillies' points, and Corey Kirkpatrick scored 17 for the Mustangs.

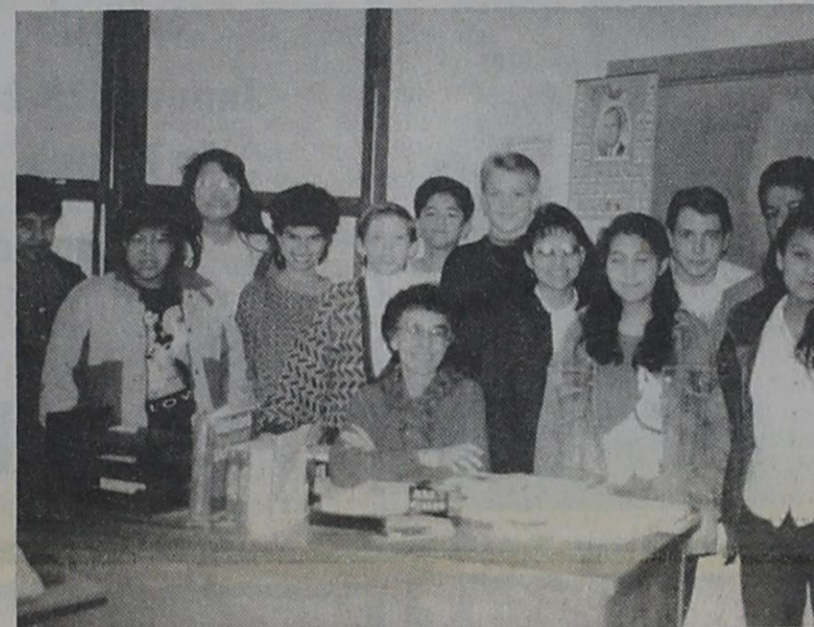

Dolls--More Than A Hobby For Her

Faye Hartwell not only manages Sands Motel on Highway 60 in Bovina, but is surrounded with hundreds of beautiful dolls that she makes and sells. She has made at least 300 dolls.

Faye and her husband, John Hartwell, lived in Bovina about ten years of their married life and John lived most of his life in Bovina. The couple raised three daughters, one son and one granddaughter. John passed away in 1978.

Their son, John, lives at Sedan, New Mexico on a farm. A daughter, Stormy Keeler, lives with her mother in Bovina; a daughter, Carla Jo, lives in Amarillo and is attending Amarillo College; a daughter, Irene, lives at Lubbock and her husband is Larry, son of Gene and Ginny Ezell of Bovina. Faye's granddaughter she raised, Katrina, attends ENMU. Faye also has four other grandchildren.

Faye said she had always been interested in dolls even as a child and said her mother always managed to give her dolls.

About twenty years ago, Faye bought her first mold and began making dolls. She said she did a fair job on her own but began

attending seminars and her work greatly improved. She still has the first doll she made on display at her home.

To make the dolls, she buys the molds, then the porcelain slips which contains the substance that she uses and fills the molds with this. It usually takes about three minutes to set up, depending on the weather and how long it is left. It is then fired in a kiln and she said it can be a mess if it is fired too long or not long enough, but said her kiln is automatic and the dolls come out perfect. They are then painted and she designs and sews the garments for the dolls and fashions their wigs.

She now has three other places that the dolls are sold besides at the Sands Motel. Her son's wife's cousin has a shop in Pratt, Kansas and some of the dolls are sold there. Another place is a beauty shop in Dalhart and her daughter, Irene, has a floral shop in Lubbock, located at 26th and Boston and the dolls are on display there.

Prior to 1962, Faye and John lived in Bovina with her family for ten years. At that time, Faye had a ceramic shop, also taught lessons in painting.

She said she had always had a love for animals, too, and at one time, raised registered Persian cats and registered Poodles.

After her husband passed away, she bought some real estate in Clovis and rented it out to make a living.

Back in 1968, the couple lived in Havlin, Kansas and Faye drove 72 miles round trip each day and taught ceramic classes five days a week and two nights. At that time, she still had two children and a grandchild at home. She hired a high school girl to keep them while she was away.

The dolls she has in her shop now sell for \$50 to \$400, but she said if she were in a larger town they would sell for more. The French antique re-production doll named Collett sells for \$400 but is priced at \$700 in Amarillo.

The dolls are beautiful and so interesting. Take time to visit her shop on Highway 60 because it is a real treat to see all the lovely creations.

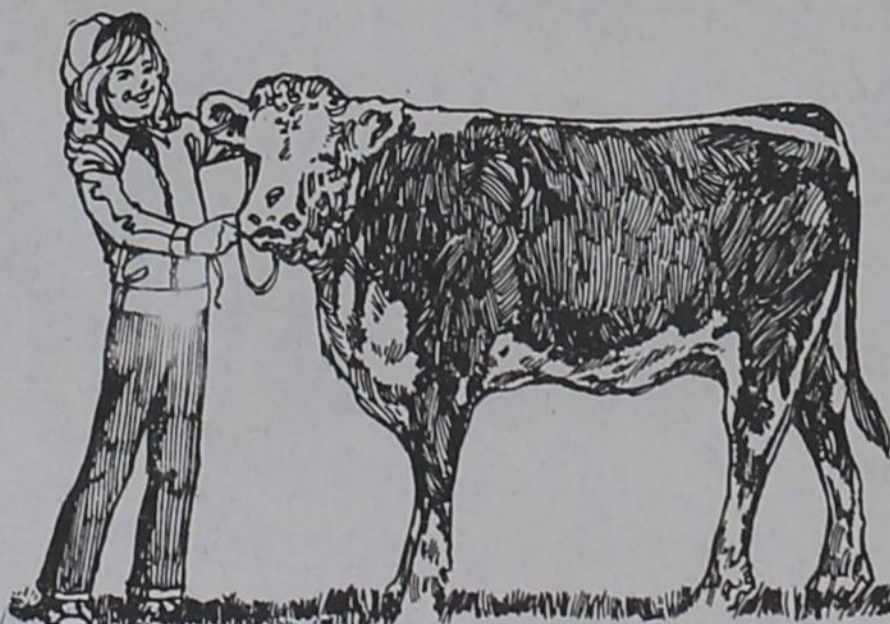

44th Annual Junior Livestock Show Set

The 44th annual Parmer County Junior Livestock Show will be held January 25-28 at the Community Center-Showbarn in Friona.

Judging will be held on Saturday and Sunday, starting with the lamb show on Saturday at noon, and the barrow show at 4 p.m. Saturday.

Steers and heifers will be judged Sunday afternoon beginning at 1 p.m.

The auction sale will be held Monday, January 28 beginning at 6 p.m.

Barrows will be weighed in on Friday, January 25 from 1-5 p.m. Lambs will be weighed in Saturday, January 26, from 7-9 a.m.

Judges for the county show will be Bert Williams of Spearman for the barrow show; Chris Miller of Ropesville for the lamb show, and Ross Caviness of Canyon for steers and heifers.

Exhibitors of grand champion animals in the 1990 show were Cammy Hancock of Friona in the barrow show; Rusty Simmons of Friona in the steer show; Cade Morris of Lazbuddie in the lamb show; and Shannon Cochran of Friona in the heifer show.

Miss Hancock gave her community its 11th win in the barrow show with her 228-pound Yorkshire. It was the first Yorkshire to be tapped for the county barrow title in the 43-year history of the county show.

The win by the Yorkshire broke a streak of seven straight years when Hampshire barrows had won the county title, and 15 years overall. The barrow show is always by far the toughest competition of any of the divisions of the show.

Hampshire breeds hold a wide lead in the overall history of the show with their 15 titles. Duroc barrows have won eight times; crossbreeds have won on seven occasions, Polands have been tapped six times, Chester Whites four, and now Yorkshires, once.

Simmons won the steer title with a 1235-pound Maine Anjou-Chianina crossbred animal, and

stretched the Friona young showmen's lead in that division to 25 titles of the last 43 awarded.

Stock show boosters and buyers are urged to attend the premium auction sale. The animals placed at the top portion of each class will be eligible for the sale.

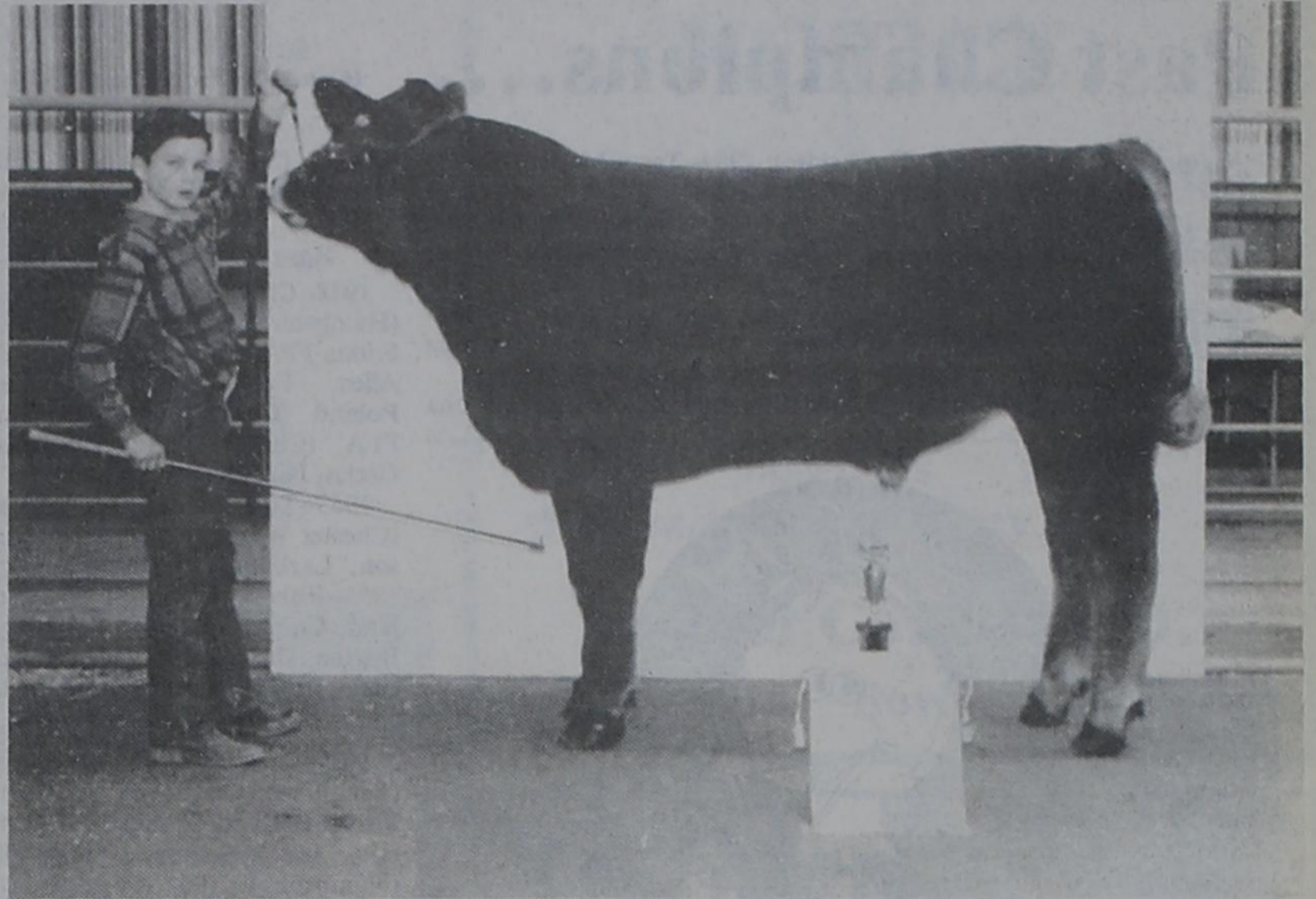

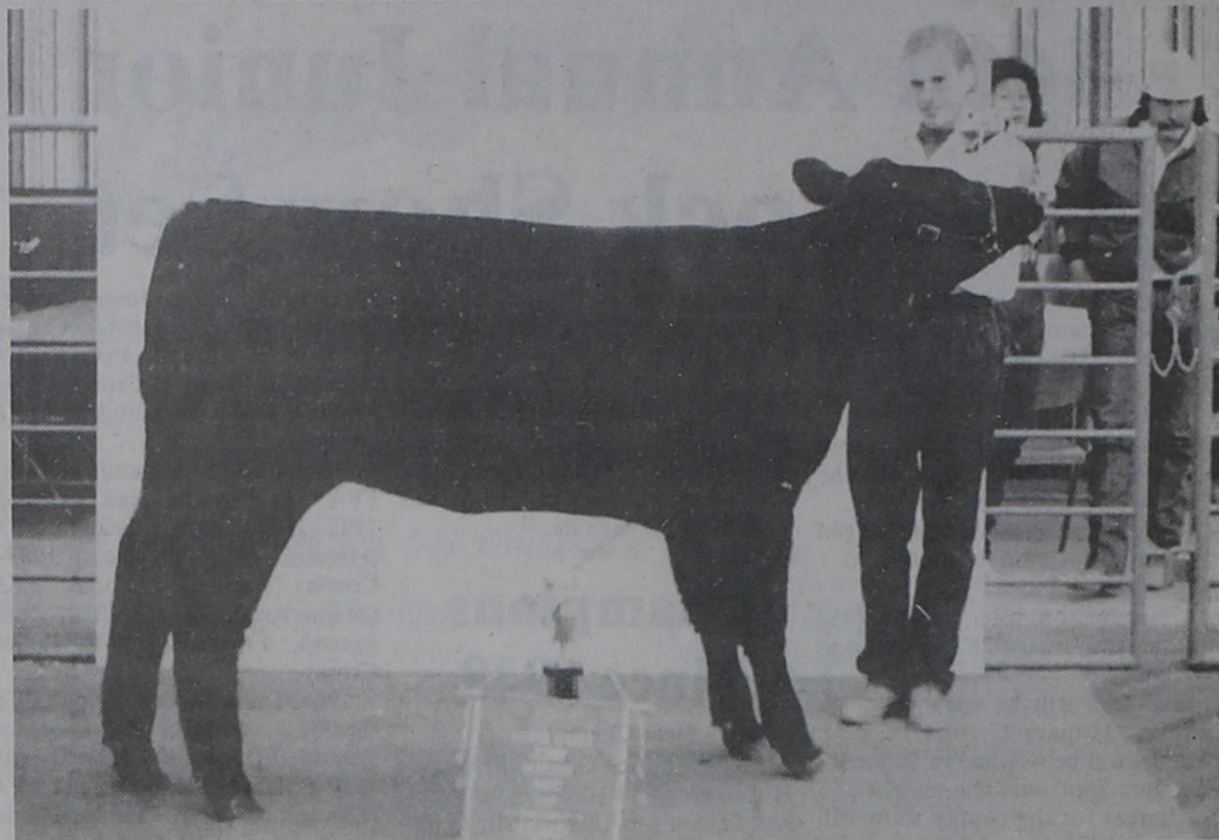

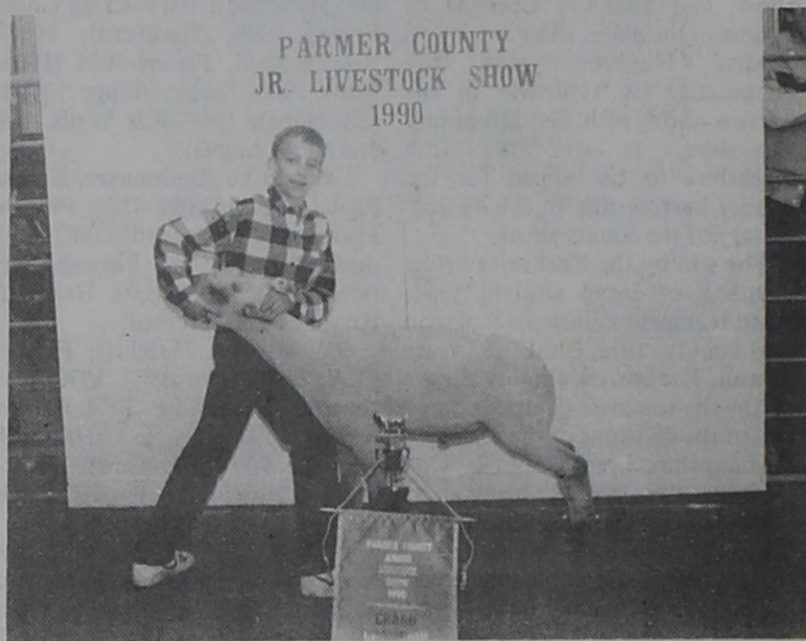

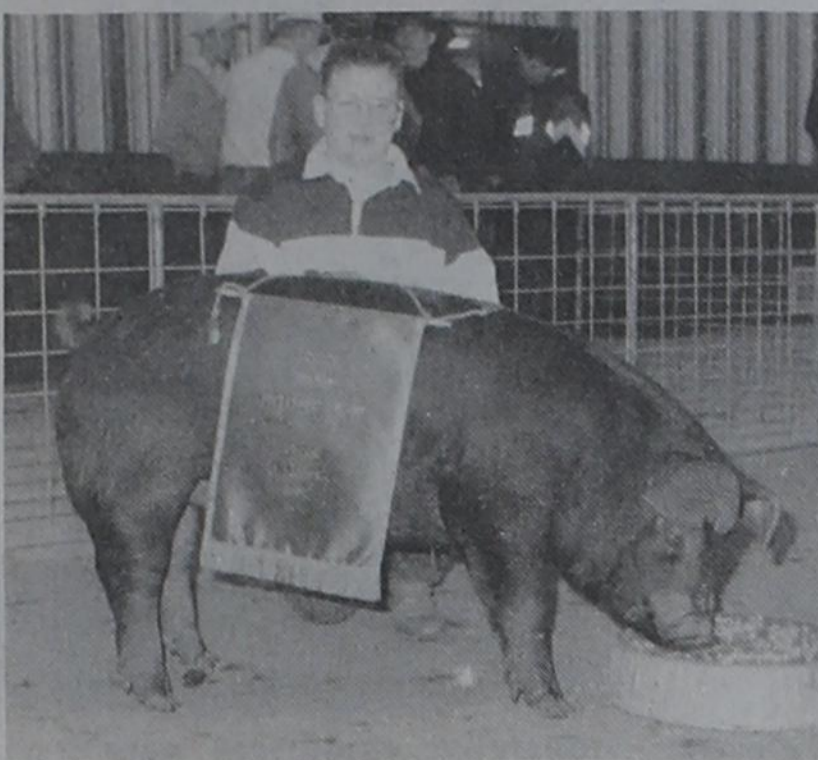

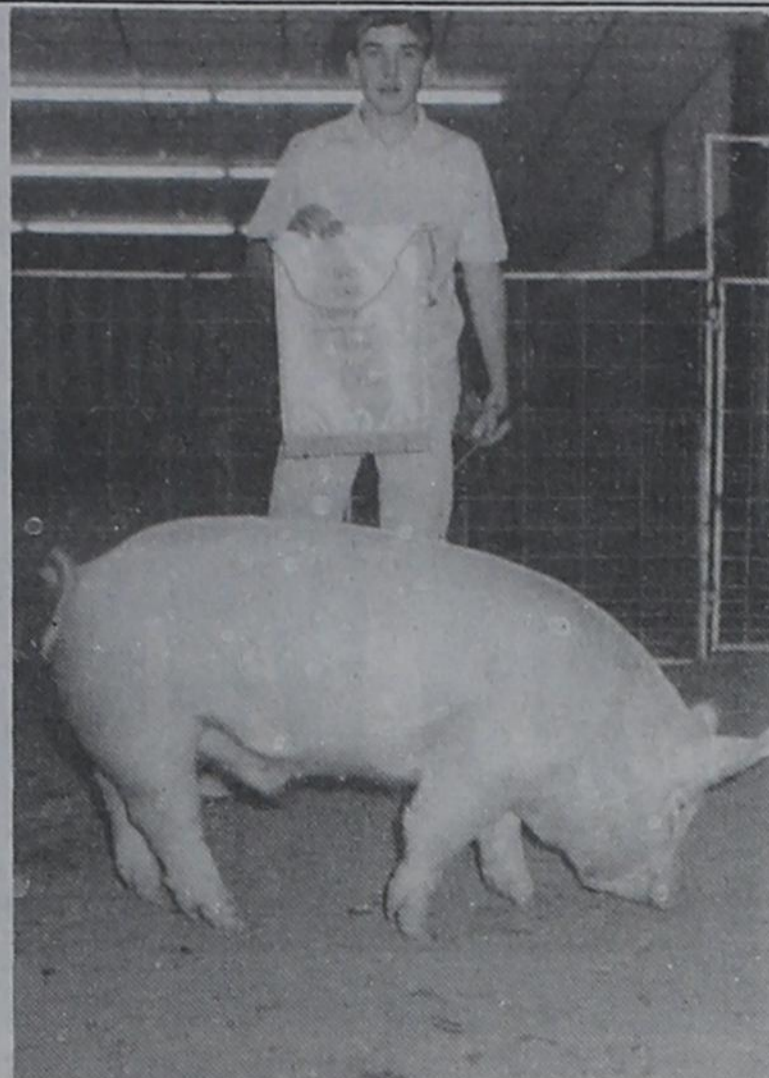

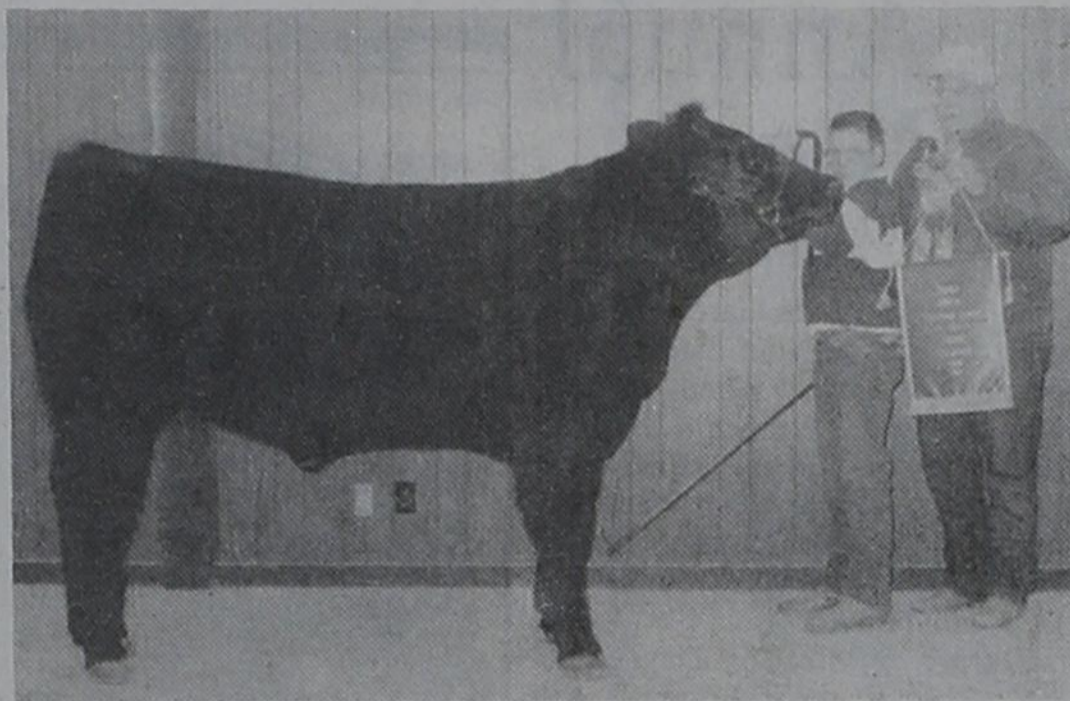

Often it is not until later in life that there is enough extra income to begin a regular investing program. If you face this dilemma, don't despair. Budget a reasonable amount each month and have the mutual fund of your choice run some hypothetical illustrations to show how much your monthly investment could grow to at various rates of return after certain periods of time.

It is simple and should cost you nothing. The only requirement is that your fund must have been in business at least the length of time you want your illustration to cover.

By using past performance figures of a mutual fund you can't guarantee future results but you can get a reasonable guide in terms of what to expect. Plan reasonable results based on proven experience.

Unrealistic expectations can be a disappointment.

It's also nice to receive your letters and knowing that you are praying for us. So thank you again and may God return the favor to each and every one of you.

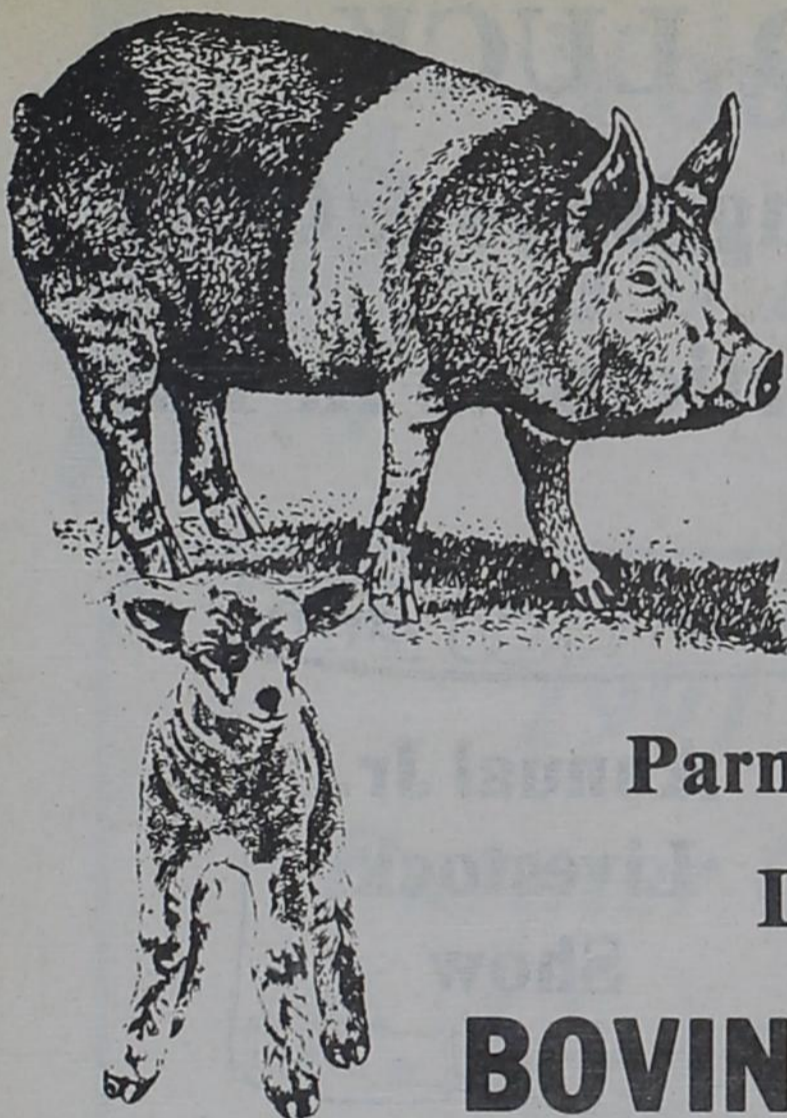
