Judging the local show was Mark Edens, vo-ag instructor at Levelland. Judging was held in lambs, swine, heifers, and a Pee-Wee pig show.


Due to the show happening after the Blade's deadline, complete results will be printed in next week's issue.



Sgt. Markeith A. Hardin has deployed to the Middle East with American military forces participating in Operation Desert Shield.








