NATIONAL VOTE ON WAR

One bit of pending legislation worth more than a passing glance is the constitutional amendment drafted by Representative Louis Ludlow which would provide for a national referendum before the United States could enter any war.

Why should not they themselves—through their own votes, and not through their congressional delegates—be permitted to say whether the country should go to war?

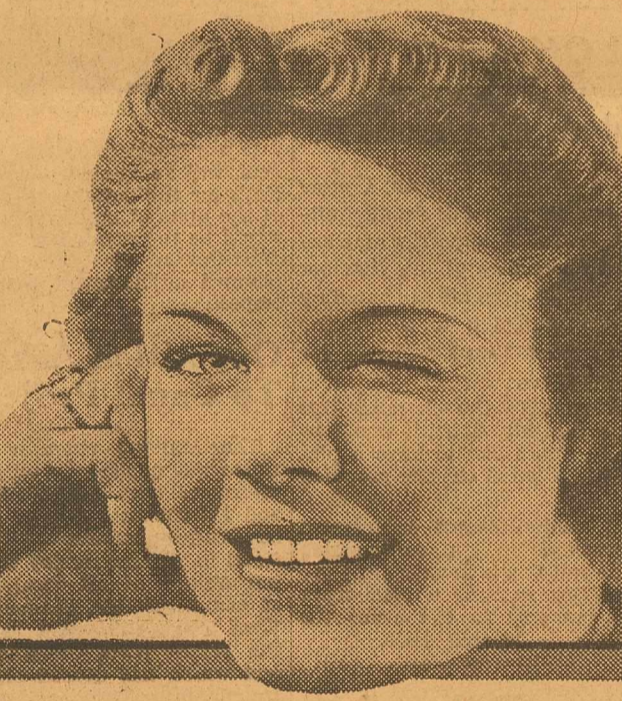

Behind The Scenes In Washington

WASHINGTON, July 14. — That party the Democrats had at Jefferson Island is well in the past, but some of the best stories of what happened on the island are just beginning to leak out.

One of them evidences the fact that although President Roosevelt will call a man by his first name as quickly as one thus addresses a barber or waitress—often applying the pronomen to a lady or gent on first meeting—it takes a Jim Farley to remember the correct name every time.

A group of anti-court bill senators stuck close to each other on the island, and a half dozen of them approached the President in a group to pay their so-called respects. Senator Bailey of North Carolina and Byrd of Virginia had passed by and had not been greeted by their first names, which would be a story by itself. Then up stepped Senator Clark of Missouri. And the President either had become flustered by this time or else suffered one of those brainstorms or memory lapses which at one time or another afflict us all. The only other possibility is that he was trying to be funny, which is unlikely.

Rural School Offers 'Safe Driving Course'

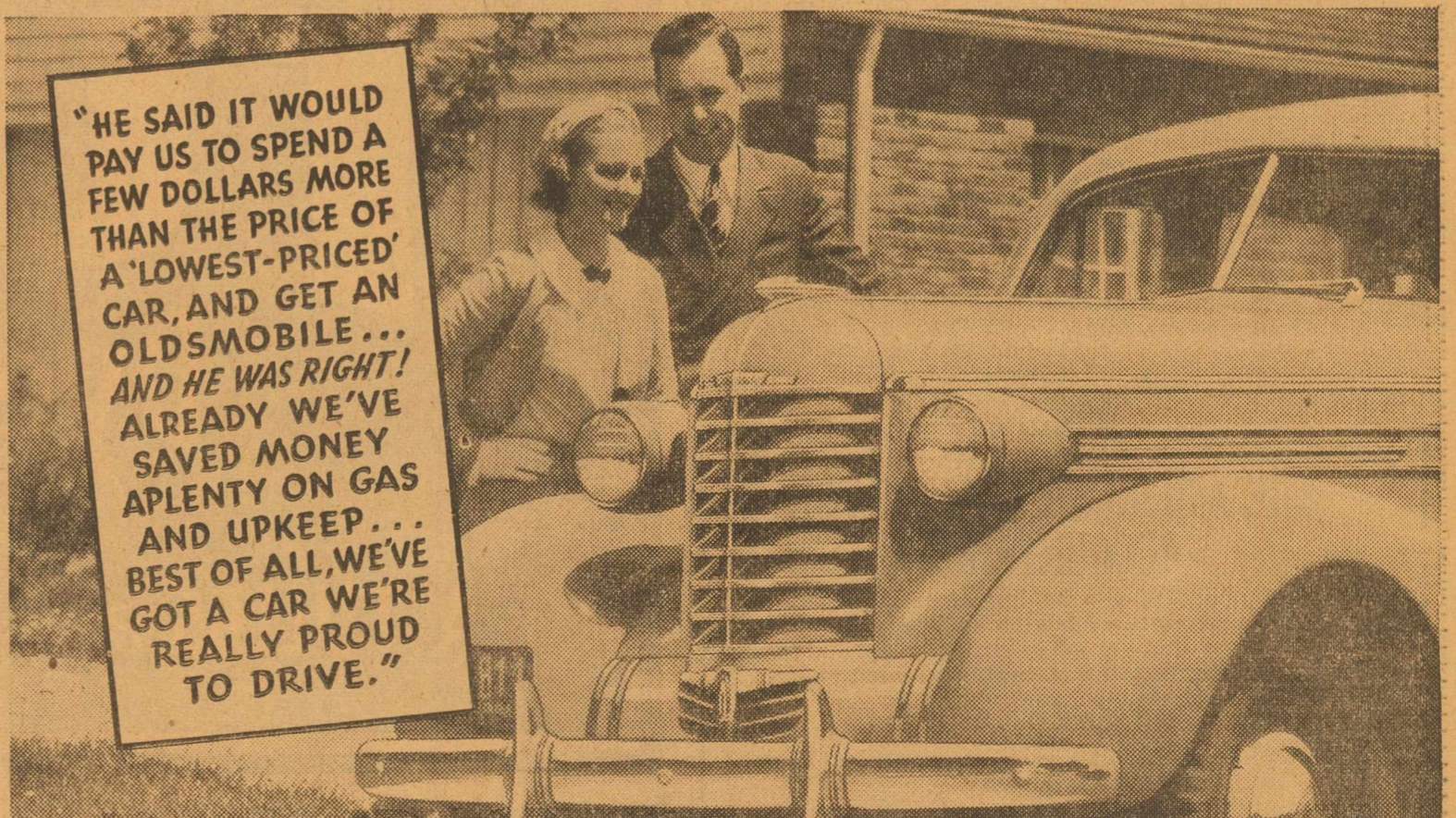
