claim their "ten free bonus prizes" could easily spend $\$ 100$ on the items the company has for sale-
and they aren't even bothering to pay your return postage. Not only that, you're being charged fully fo the shipping of the items back
Be very careful in your approach wind up costing you a lot of money for some merchandise you didn' even want in the first place
Another rule is not to give ou your credit card number to
telephone solicitations. We understand that this type of gimmick has expanded to telephone solicitors.

## Angler's Corner

## By M.D. McCALLUM The approach of spring signals the upcoming spawning season for the area walleyes. While many gamefish spawn sometime during the spring, the walleye is the first to watch for as it spawns in considerably colder water than considerably colder other area gamefish. other area gamefish. Areas chosen by the walleye will be from one to six feet deep be from one to six feet deep consisting of pea-sized gravel up to fist-sized rocks. Walleyes spawn in areas exposed to the wind as areas exposed to the wind as continual aeration of the eggs are necessary for thitr survival. The males will move in first even if the temperature is near the freezing mark freezing mark. As the water warms females move in. They will stay in adjacent deep water until a few weeks before the spawn at which weeks before the spawn at which time they move into the shallows to <br> Look for the actual spawning to place when the water five to fifty-five degrees. Not all females will be ready to spawn at the same time hence the prolonged spawning period. They rely on the crevices between the rocks and gravel to protect the eggs from Start with the northern end of ny lake as it receives the most su any lake as it receives the most sun and warms faster. Next check for the gravel and small rocks, then look for the most wind-blown stretch that falls within these parameters. Also, keep in mind prefers a deep water ""escape route" near the spawning "escape Putting these factors together should eliminate a lot of unproductive water and wasted One thing to keep in mind about One thing to keep in mind about fishing during any spawn is the fact that the fish are slaves to their nature and are easy targets during this time. Over-harvest of the fish during the spawn can lead to a downturn in fishing on that particular body of water for many years to come.
