

Finsler's comet, shown above, right, as it appears through a 24-inch telescope, will be visible to stargazers in United States during the first weeks of August, near the Pole Star and the Big Dipper. Appearing as a slightly hazy star, fainter than those of the nearby Dipper, the comet will be visible to the naked eye, and will reach its maximum brightness on Aug. 9. Opera glasses or low-power telescopes will be required to see the tiny tail, pointing away from the sun. The comet, discovered July 4 by a Swiss astronomer, will take the course outlined in the sketch above, left.






