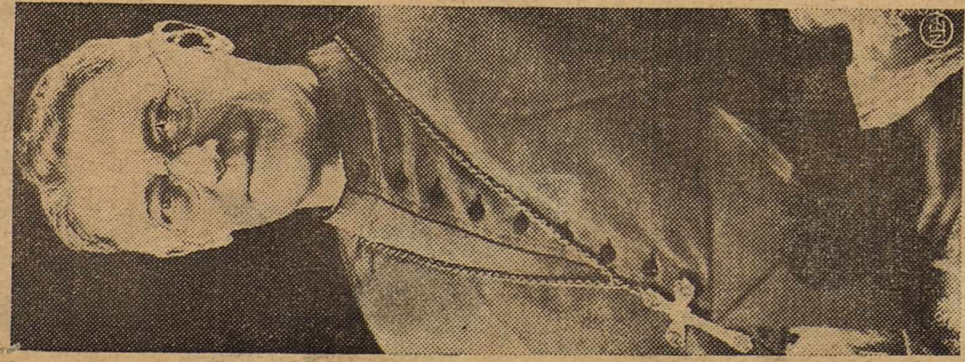


Nazi Target

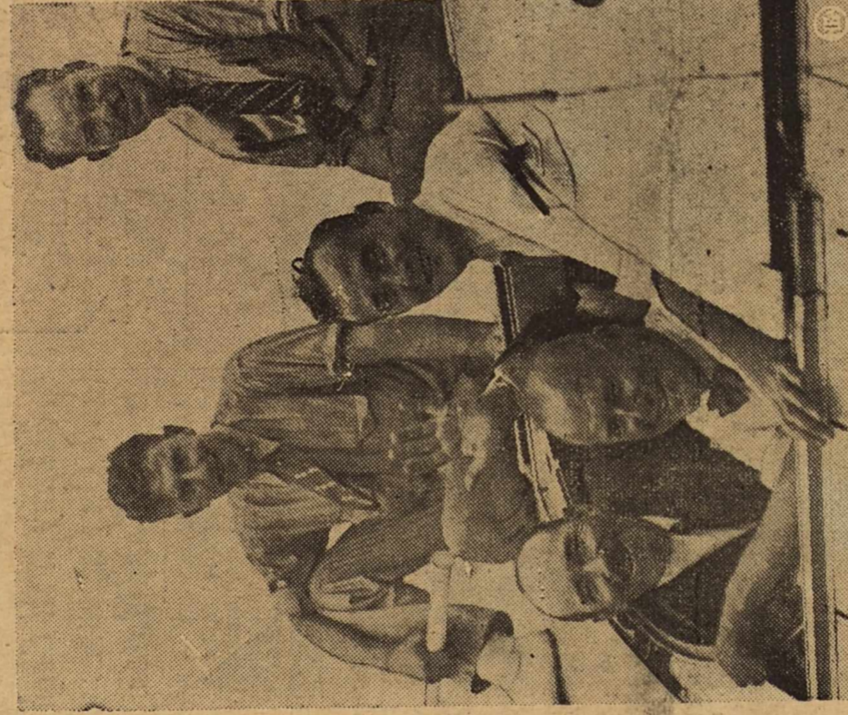
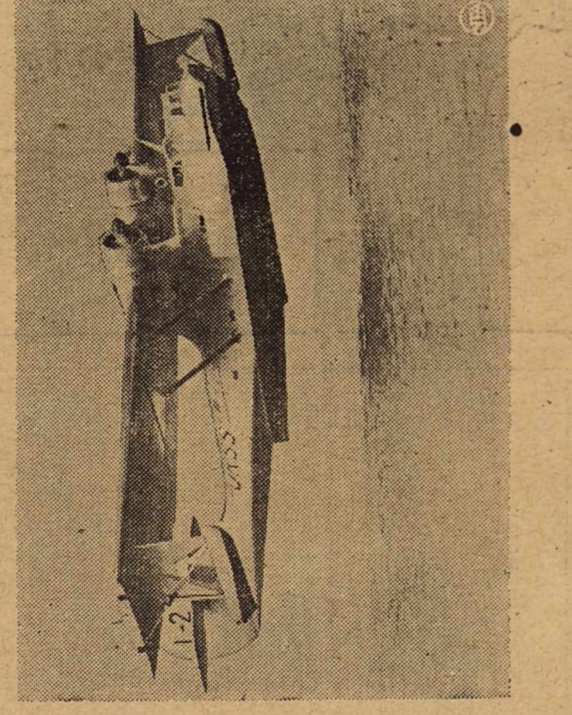

Gill Spudding New Wildcat 4 Miles East Of Seminole

Ralph H. Gill, San Angelo oil operator, is spudding today in his 4,000-foot well, No. 1, in Seminole county, east of the town of Seminole. The well is located 330 feet from the north line and 1,533.6 feet from the east line of section 8, block C-44, public school land, slightly over four and one-half miles east of Seminole. The well is located 600 feet from the north and west lines of section 8, block M. E. L. & R. R. survey, Standholy No. 1 Shaughton youth well northwest of the Texas company's discovery, is drilling one at 4,970 feet, with 2,500 feet of oil in the hole. It is showing about a gallon of sulphur water when bailed on the first run. The well is bailed from 4,945 feet in the sand and filled with cement to the southwest quarter of labor 76, lease Bohago and Bond No. 1 West, Yoakum county well west of the Bennett pool, is reported to have flowed 77 barrels in 23 hours through 3/4-inch choke with 5,000 gallons. Total depth is 5,255 feet with a total of 4,000 gallons.

AUSTIN, Aug. 25. (P)—Traveling blind and destitute children, authorized by the electorate Monday will be stayed until the legislature provides funds.

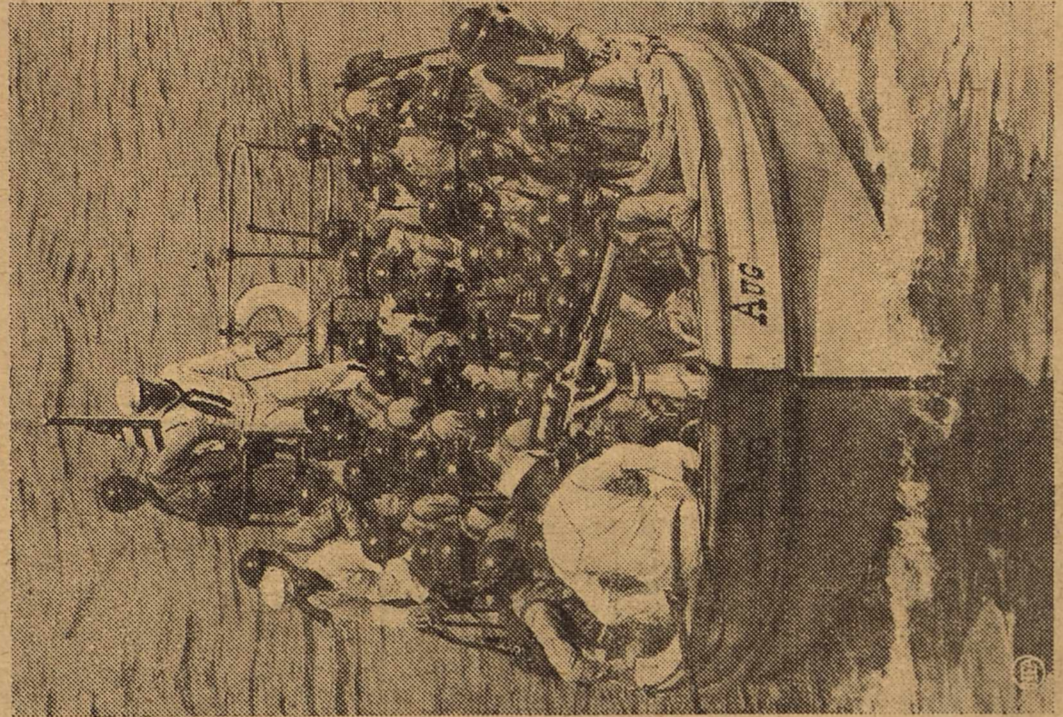

The division, for which the board will have a salary not exceeding \$4,500 annually, will include the existing child welfare division and Texas relief commission.

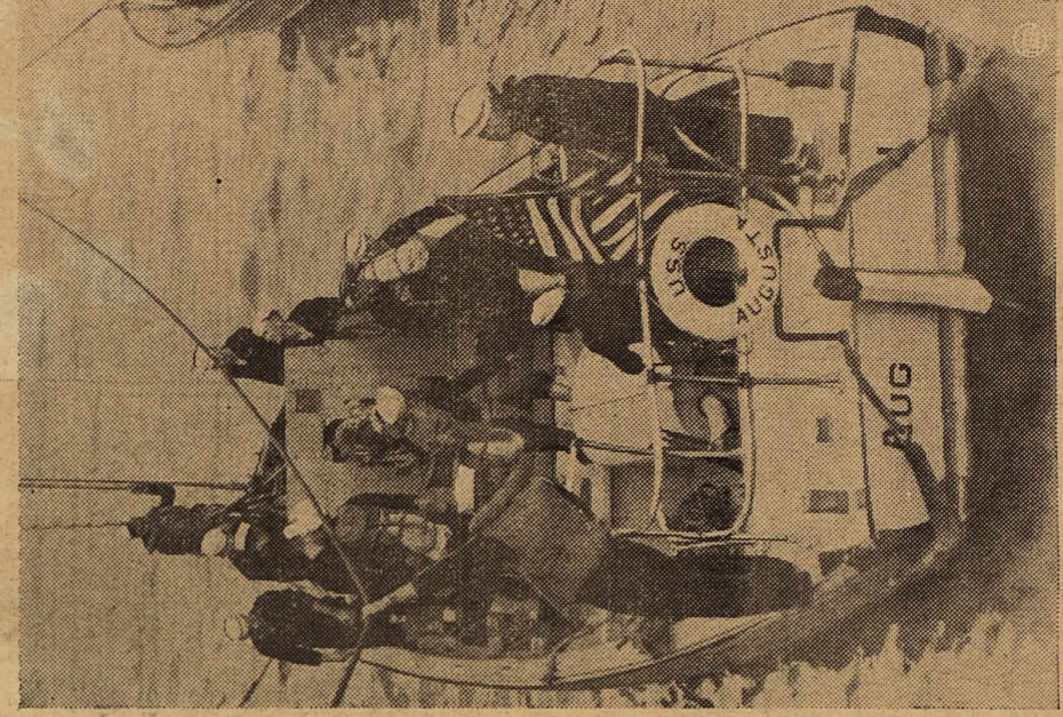
Functions of these two agencies will remain unchanged but will be administered by the public welfare director.

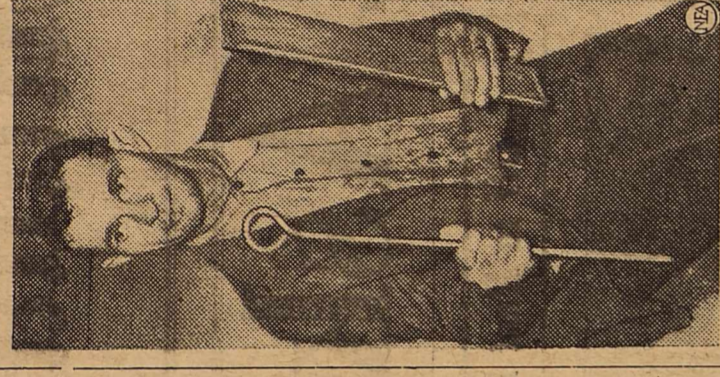

GOOD NEWS It's hard to take much pleasure in a great deal of the news that comes out of Washington these days, but here's one item that ought to bring hearty cheers even in the hottest of hot weather. The Treasury Department is rearranging its income tax blanks to make them a little simpler, and will begin distributing them on Jan. 2 so as to give the maximum amount of time to make them out before that awful March 15 deadline. The new form is especially aimed at making it simpler for "the little fellow," but the treasury is hoping to simplify even the returns for upper-bracket individuals and corporations. paying the tax is always bad enough, but making out the blank is almost as bad as the actual payment. Anything that can be done to make it any less painful will be a boon to millions and millionaires alike.

LIVING AND DYING Within the past 35 years the general death rate in the United States has declined from 17.6 to 10.9 to each hundred thousand persons, according to statistics compiled by the U. S. Public Health Service. The reduction in death rates, however, has come almost entirely for persons in early life. The decreases in diphtheria and smallpox are startling and reflect the courage and labor of white-robed laboratory workers and physicians whose discoveries resulted in practical life saving. On the other hand, disease of middle and old age are increasing. Deaths from cancer almost doubled. Youth is spared just to find a more hazardous middle and old age. It is well that medical research has turned to a greater concentration in this field.

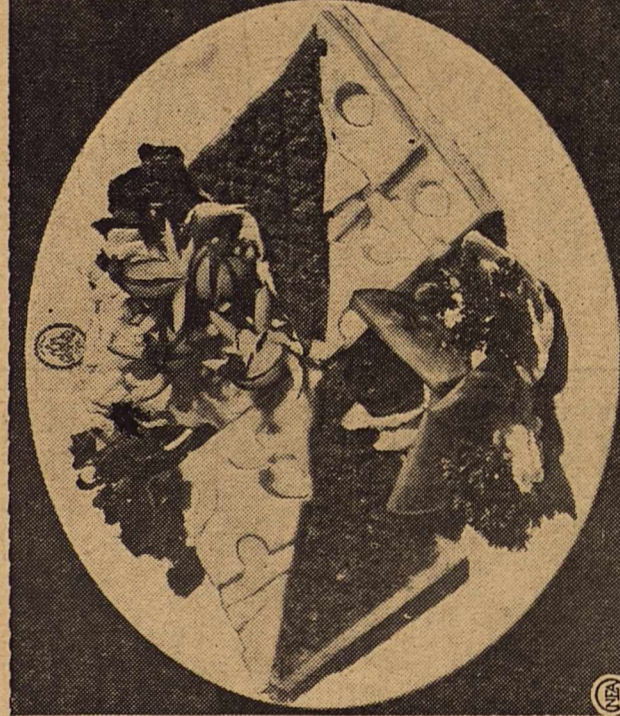

Department of Anthropology Museum At Texas University Again Opened

AUSTIN.—The University of Texas anthropology museum, closed during the early part of the summer, is again open to the student of anthropology interested in the life of prehistoric man which in the museum reconstructs to the visitor who delights in the things that are to the person seeking the unusual of the believe-it-or-not variety.

Mrs. Helen Donnan, chairman of the museum, is preparing a handbook under the supervision of the director of the museum, Prof. J. E. Pearce, which will serve as a guide to museum visitors of interested laymen.

Notes from this handbook reveal that the university museum probably has the largest collection of local materials of any museum in the United States. Several thousand earthware vessels of Ocho and Asmat, Indian manufacture, and ornaments of conch shells and of

bone; stone and earthenware pipes, flint, implements and weapons, and other objects of the prehistoric past are of the extremely dry areas of West Texas; food preserved in ashes or cached in caves; and skeleton material in caves, much of it showing artificial head deformation—these are the local materials which have drawn to the university students of the life of the Indian in Texas during prehistoric times.

Approximately 90 per cent of the local material of the museum is prehistoric, although university archeologists have found mounds of historic date, easily recognized because of the presence of glass beads or other articles of European manufacture.

The scientific importance of the local materials of the department of anthropology which appear from time to time. A study on boat-stones by Dr. J. T. Patterson is now in press. Dr. Patterson is professor of zoology at the university, and is author of another volume published by the University of Texas, "The University Field Foreman in Archeology, Photographs and Petroglyphs in Texas, which is just going to press.

Other publications will include an article on skeleton material of the museum by Dr. George Woodbury of Peabody Museum, Harvard University, and "The University of Michigan, R. Gilmore of the University of Michigan.

In addition to local collections the museum displays materials representing various Indian tribes of the United States, Central America, and South America, including casts of large ceremonial figures or stellas used by the Maya Indians; foreign material, including pottery and artifacts from the Dutch East Indies, the Philippine Islands, Fiji, Japan, Korea, Africa, Australia and Greenland are also exhibited.

AMY JOHNSON RETIRES FROM GLORY FLIGHTS

LONDON, Aug. 25 (P).—Amy Johnson, heroine of the first solo flight by a woman from England to Australia, has decided to give up flying.

Knowing that Empire air liners and the Royal Air force are better equipped than any other in the world, she believes there is nowhere in the world to fly to and set up new records unless with the backing of government finances.

"Fly" she said. "It is the last thing I would dream of doing now. I am just going to go ahead. No, I am just going around now wondering what on earth I am to do with life.

"But I am not going to fly. I don't know what I'm going to do. In the old days I was going to do, for me all that Jim, my husband, has now ended."

Has Earned Thousands. Miss Johnson has been a good business woman. In ten years of spectacular flying, with half a dozen great flights to her credit, she has made many thousands of profitable bolts and enough to buy a fine house in London and expensive cars.

In that time, however, Amy has seen her friends and rivals "go west." Amelia Earhart was the latest to disappear. Before her, the air-climbed Sir Charles Kings-Um and Bert Hinkley. The old brigade of record-breakers has faded out.

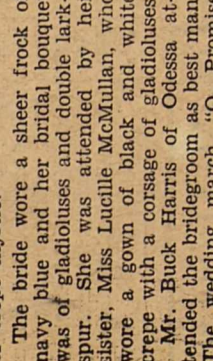
Tommy Rose has a job which keeps his feet on the ground in London City, while Scott has given up record flying.

No one dared hope that this inexperienced aviator, with not more than 90 hours in the air to her credit, could perform such a feat. A newspaper scoffed when Amy offered to write a story

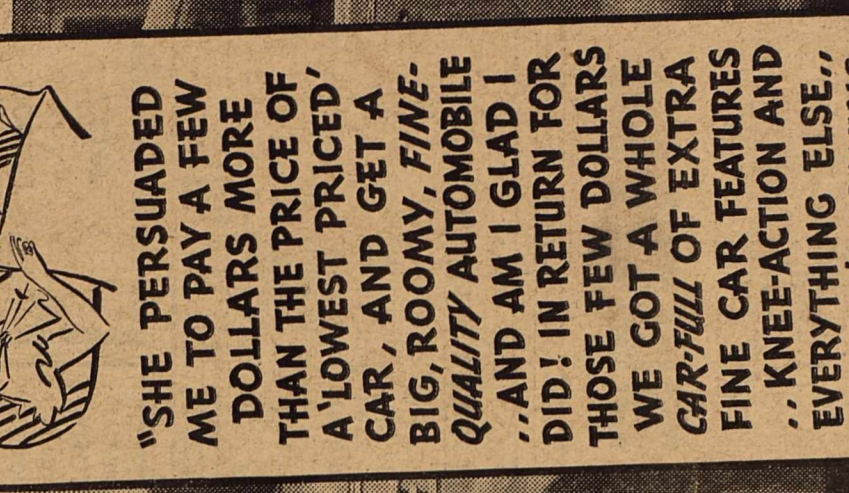

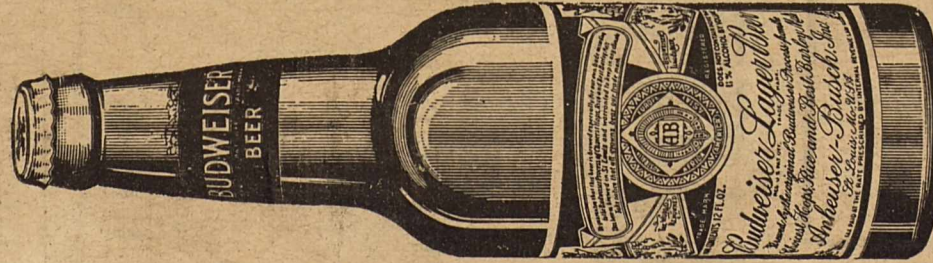

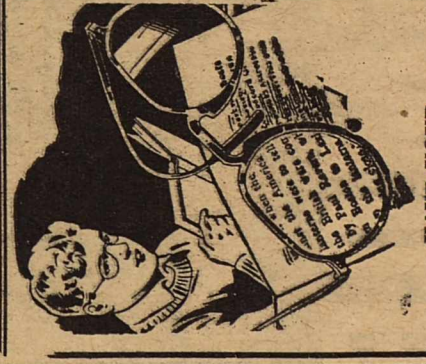
Old Fortress Monastery Soon to Be on Island

At present tourists may visit the historic monument by motor car, but when the dike is cut it will be separated from the mainland.

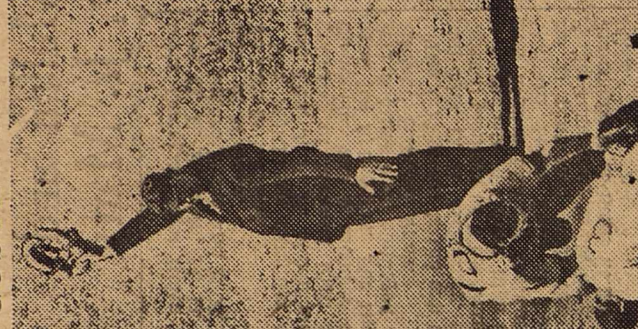

Montana Cave Has 12 Levels

BUTTE, Mont. (UP)—Another huge chamber, has been opened in the Morrison cave by the national park service—the fourth since the government began development activities two years ago.

The cave, in the third largest in size, is in the southwest Missouri mountains, near the old lead mines, and it, the chambers continues, park officials said, it is possible that the cave will become the largest and the most beautiful in the country.

The original cave, which was discovered by Lewis and Clark and later developed by Allan and Daniel Morrison, has 12 floors of length and 30 feet wide. The first new chamber, which was opened, named the Paradise Room, measured 260 by 338 feet.

The second discovery, called Hells Half Acre, was reported to be larger than the Paradise room. It measured 200 by 300 feet and is 1,000 feet long and 30 feet wide.

The fourth chamber, which will possibly be called the Saclawea room, has been only partly explored. Sufficient investigation has been done, however, to justify the belief that it is not only immense in size, but beautiful in its formation.

"We'll have to go some to beat the Corral cave in New Mexico," said a park service employe said "but

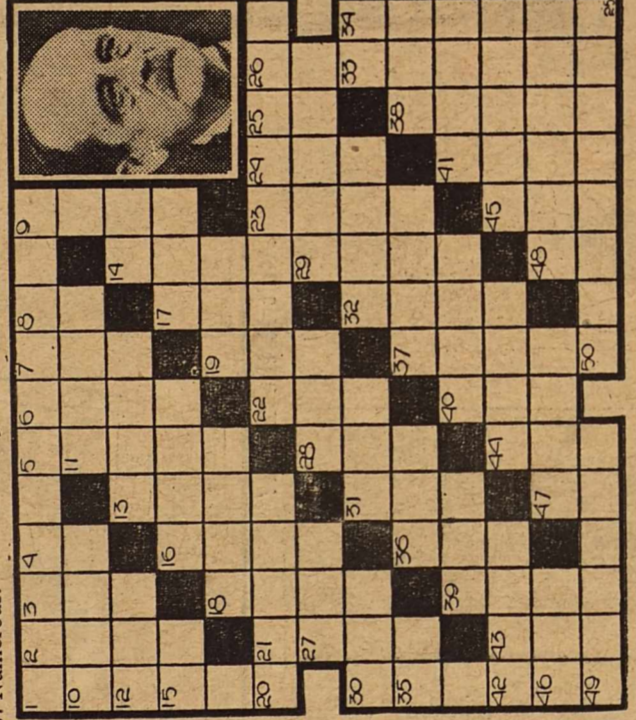

All public opposition to the government, the Mexican hierarchy is strictly following the instructions laid down last Easter by Pope Pius XI in his encyclical, "Firmissimum," addressed to the Mexican Bishops.

Pope Pius deplored the present situation of the church in Mexico, but advised Mexican Catholics that the best means of working toward the restoration of Christian life in Mexico would be by (1) the purification of the clergy itself, (2) the formation of lay organizations to co-operate with the clergy.

The present policy of the Vatican, therefore, is one of allowing evolution to take its course, to be solved by evolution and not by revolution. The Pope in his encyclical exhorted Mexicans to follow a policy of "union, charity, and peace in the apostolic work of Catholic Action, which is destined to bring back Christ to Mexico, re-establish peace, and even prosperity.

Instructions of the encyclical are being followed strictly by the new Archbishop of Mexico, Monsignor

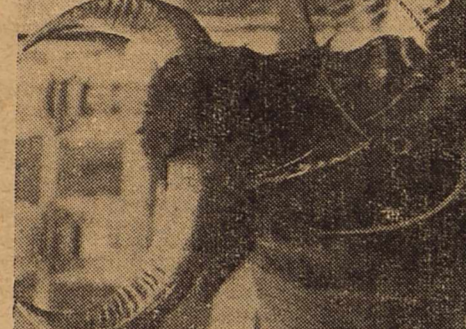

In the state of Chiapas, crowds also forced churches to reopen. In Chihuahua, Catholics obtained a supreme court ruling that the state law restricting the number of priests was unconstitutional.

Engine Jumps Rails In Test Of Safe Speed

ESTCOURT, Netai (UP)—An engine and tender weighing 89 tons were hurled off the line in a spectacular railway smash, near here—

The derailment was part of the experiments being conducted under the supervision of Dr. C. von Abo, railway research engineer, to determine the overturning speeds of different types of vehicles.

The engine and tender were dragged up a steep incline, and allowed to gain momentum. Fifteen times the engine ran down from different heights on the slope gradually gaining a higher speed over the testing apparatus each time as it was allowed to gather more momentum. Over 40 miles an hour the engine and tender dashed toward the corner on its "fatal" run. They approached the curve luridly, just as the tender at the end of the bend, which was at a radius of only 300 feet, the tender left the line and swung outward from the coupling, attaching the engine off the line.

With a deafening crash, the engine and tender overturned beside the rails. The tender, its steel plates twisted and two special vacuum tanks wrenched off, apparently was beyond repair, but it was hoped that the engine would be salvaged.
