

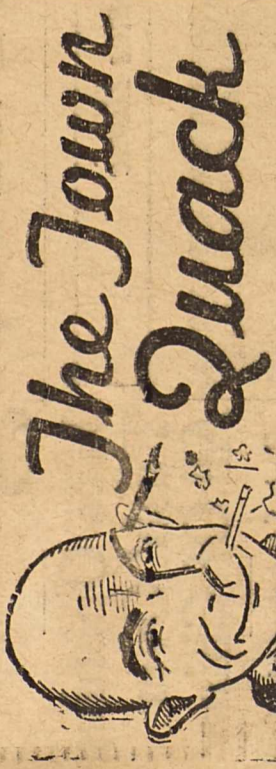

That's what the announcer might say as he looks over the public address system on the evening of Sept. 1 when the College All-Stars meet the Green Bay Packers in Soldiers' Field, Chicago.

You see, this fourth so-called dream game promises to be a pitcher's battle between Slingin' Sam Baugh, late of Texas Christian, and Arnie Herber of the National Football League champions, recently brought forward to seeing the best pitching duel since the days when Walter Johnson used to have it out on the dune with poor old Eddie Cicotte, who unfortunately extended his throwing to other things.

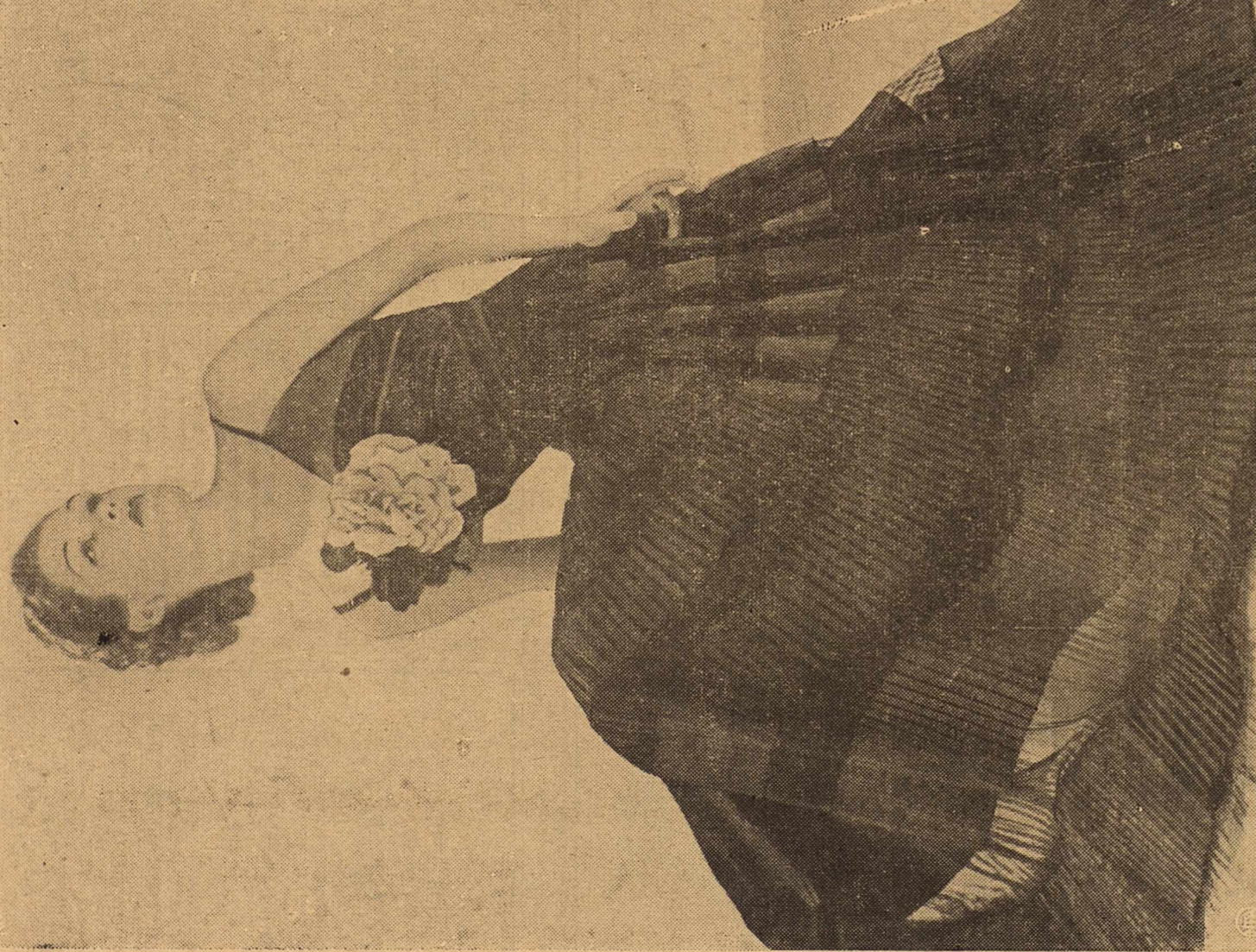

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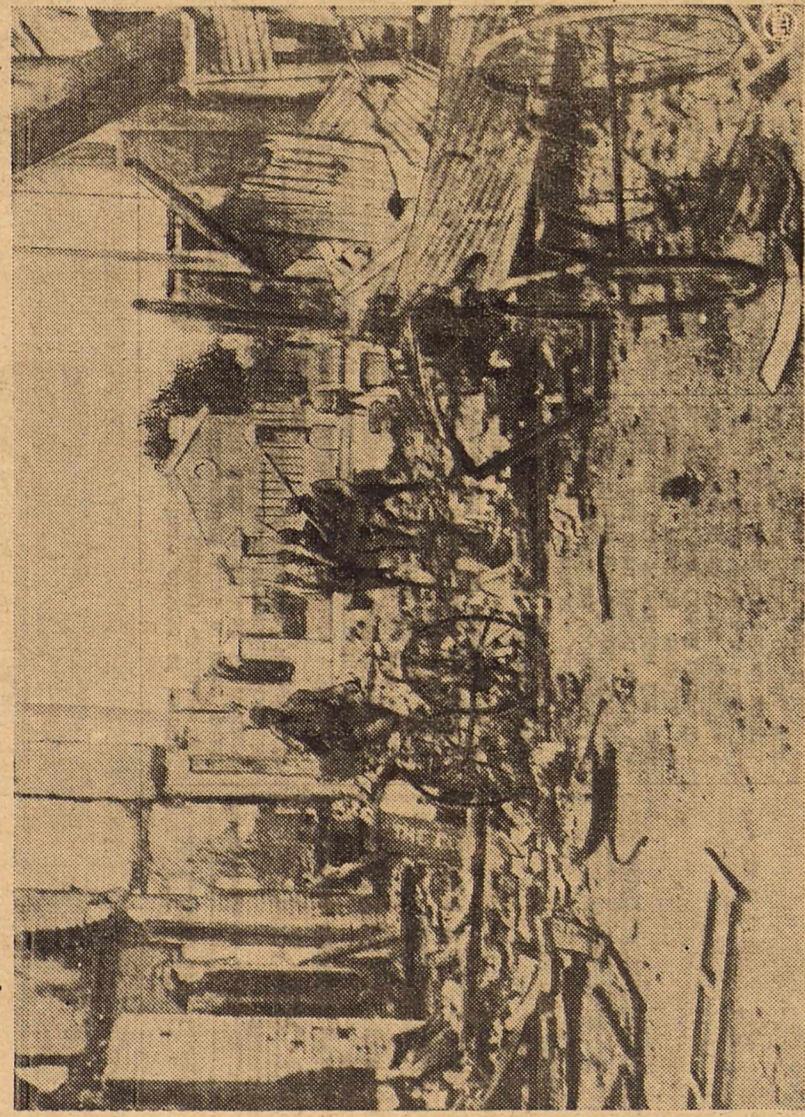

THIRD VOLUME ON TEXAS GEOLOGY ISSUED BY UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS

AUSTIN, Texas — In further accomplishment of the plan to write and publish a complete account of the geology of Texas, the staff of the Bureau of Economic Geology of the University of Texas, under the leadership of E. S. Ross, has published the third volume of the series, describing subject. The fourth volume is in preparation and it promises to be of unusual timeliness and interest as it will treat of the petroleum resources of the state. The contents of the third volume which recently came from the press is divided into two parts. The first is the late Paleozoic of Texas, and the second part to Permian Fusulinidae of Texas.

The first part is by F. B. Plummer, professor of petroleum production engineering at the University of Texas, and geologist in the Bureau of Economic Geology, and the second part is by C. E. Sloss, an exhaustive monograph on the Permian fusulinidae of Texas, and the Permian fusulinidae of Texas.

The systematic description is followed by a section on correlation of Texas formations by means of ammonites, in which the relative positions of the Permian fusulinidae zones are discussed. Of correlation of zones is stressed. Of the larger fossils, ammonites are the best and the easiest to use for zoning the carboniferous because of their rapid evolution and consequently short range for most species. It was pointed out.

The second part of the volume is by Dr. Carl O. Dumbar of the Peabody Museum of Natural History at Yale University, and John W. Skiffner, geologist with the Midland County Museum, author of a monograph on the Permian fusulinidae of Texas. A thorough discussion of how to measure and re-

Aid in the completion of this volume is acknowledged in the preface by Dr. Sellards, to several sources. In connection with group study to establish more satisfactory correlation of Mississippian, Pennsylvanian, and Permian sediments in the Texas region, a contribution was made by the Geological Society of America from the Penrose Fund of the University of Texas, a part of which has been applied toward the completion of the memoir on ammonites of the University of Texas through donation by William F. Morse and others, the Paul Franklin Morse Memorial Publication Fund, honoring the memory of Paul Franklin Morse. The cost of engraving the plates of the memoir on fusulinids has been paid from this fund.

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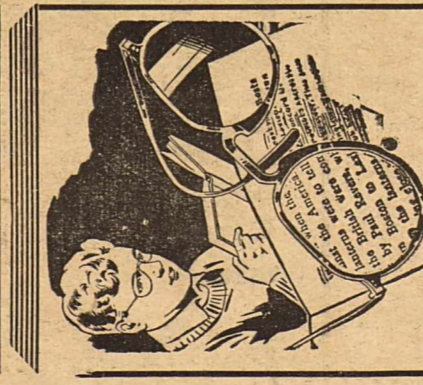

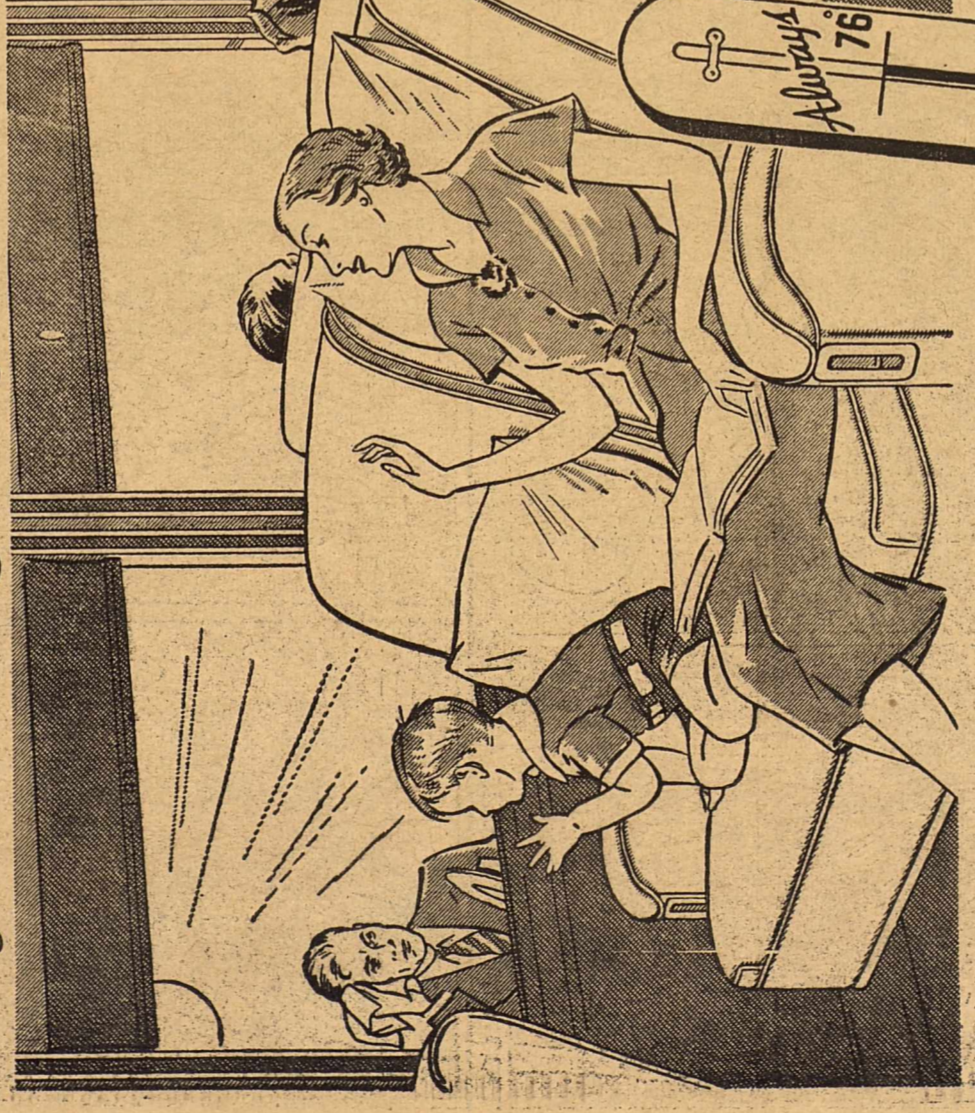
