Fiercest Battle of Sino-Jap War Rages

Japs Gain 2 Miles In New Drive

Hand to Hand Knife Fighting Engaged In by Soldiers

SHANGHAI, Sept. 11. (P)—A smashing drive inland from the Yangtze river today locked Japanese and Chinese into one of the most important battles of the war. Japanese troops pushed Chinese forces back to Yuen Hsing four miles inland from the Wooning forts. After reaching the city, attackers were forced to retire after hand to hand fighting with knives, swords and bayonets. A Chinese spokesman termed the battle a major engagement.

At the end of 24 hours headquarters reported that the Japanese had advanced 30 miles south of Tientsin, after a heavy battle.

An aerial and artillery bombardment projected the Japanese movement slowly and inexorably forward. When the attackers reached the city however, they were forced to retire in a hasty retreat, fighting in which the Chinese seemed to have superiority.

At the end of 24 hours of relentless fighting the Japanese claimed an advance of two miles from previous positions.

In Yangtze, Chinese defenders fought Japanese to a standstill with driving the invaders to the village outskirts.

Once the push was halted, Chinese summoned heavy reinforcements in an effort to regain their lost positions.

Casualties in the battle were the heaviest of any since Shanghai hostilities broke out.

Formal Call To Solons Is Made By Gov.

Declares Deficit Of State Is Over 15 Million Dollars

Austin, Sept. 11. (P)—Governor Allred today formally proclaimed the second extra-ordinary session of the forty fifth legislature to convene September 27 to consider revenue support of old age pensions.

The governor said the general fund was operating under a \$15,000,000 deficit; the past regular session increased appropriations; and in the general fund did not equal the outgo by at least \$4,500,000 yearly.

Of additional moneys for support of old age pensions, he said, was \$4,625,000 in debt; that on Aug. 23 the people had voted social security measures for the needy blind and dependent children which necessitated additional funds and that it was desirable the general fund deficit be retaired.

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Behind the Scenes in Washington

WHAT Congress did not accomplish in the past session, I think of what should be accomplished in the future. Indeed, considering the fundamental actions promised and the almost blank record of meeting serious issues face to face, the session of Congress recently over probably is one of the worst in history.
Now that we are free to think things out, what happened, and when we will do the things we ought to do, we are stymied. When the Supreme Court argument came in there was the greatest barrage of words and bitter denunciations in American political history. We congressmen rest of us say, staved around in our own mental places. With that confusion nothing could be done. So the important legislation was held off till the last of the session and then dropped ever-board.

The future? Argument over the court, its powers and the powers of Congress must go on. The controversy has done some good, for the American people have at least recognized that the judges are human, and the full humanization of the court must be accomplished. We must also have very clear objectives. They must be plotted out, understood, and then we or Congress go ahead and do them.


Asks Permanent Program.
AT the next session we should agree what we want to do; this must be developed into permanent program. I suggest the following:
1. Conservation of natural resources.
2. Farm legislation.
3. Establishment of the eight TVAs.
4. A developed and extended housing campaign.
5. Strengthened labor provisions for settlement of disputes, fair to both sides.
6. Human wages and maximum hours; full labor standards.
7. Government reorganizing; abolition of useless, duplicating bureaus.
8. An improved food and drug act.

The first four—conservation, farm, eight TVAs, housing—must be co-ordinated as a great national program. The last three must be done as a great job of emergency legislation in saving the country. It is not doing as good a job in establishing




