THE TOPIC OF our last week's column as regards the possible elimination of cooperative and vocational courses in the public schools has been much under discussion lately, especially at the recent Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show.

There seems to be another matter dealing with the education reform bill, dealing with consolidation of schools of under 500 students.

We do not have sufficient information on this matter to make serious comment, except to say that if this is a serious proposition, a number of schools in our area could face the possibility of consolidation, with the additional hardship of bussing students to a larger school.

It appears more and more that the residents of rural areas such as ours are having their way of life threatened by legislation, and it behooves people more than ever to contact their elected officials, all the way up to the governor, to let them know how they stand on the issues.

We plan to have a listing of the elected state officials who represent local residents, along with their mailing addresses, to help our readers who wish to contact these representatives.

The state legislature is now in session, so it's important that you make such contacts immediately.

THE JUNIOR Livestock Shows are over on the local level for another year, and local students were highly successful in the recent county show.

It seemed to this observer that the premium sale at the county show was much better than last year, with animals going for much better prices in each division.

For the second year, the owner of the Grand Champion Goat in the show (Shannon Cochran in this instance), donated his animal to be auctioned off, with the proceeds going for the upkeep of the showbarn.

The animal was sold and re-sold a total of 17 times. Our tally showed that a total of \$2,840 was raised for this purpose, which is a nice gesture on behalf of the stock show people. The show facility is kept up by the City of Friona, and it, like most governmental agencies, is never overly plush with money to put into such facilities.

Those bidding on the goat, and donating to the upkeep fund included Bovina Feeders, Parmer County Implement Co., Black Grain, Diane and Carrie Tatum, A. L. Black, Herring Implement Co., and Leroy Berend.

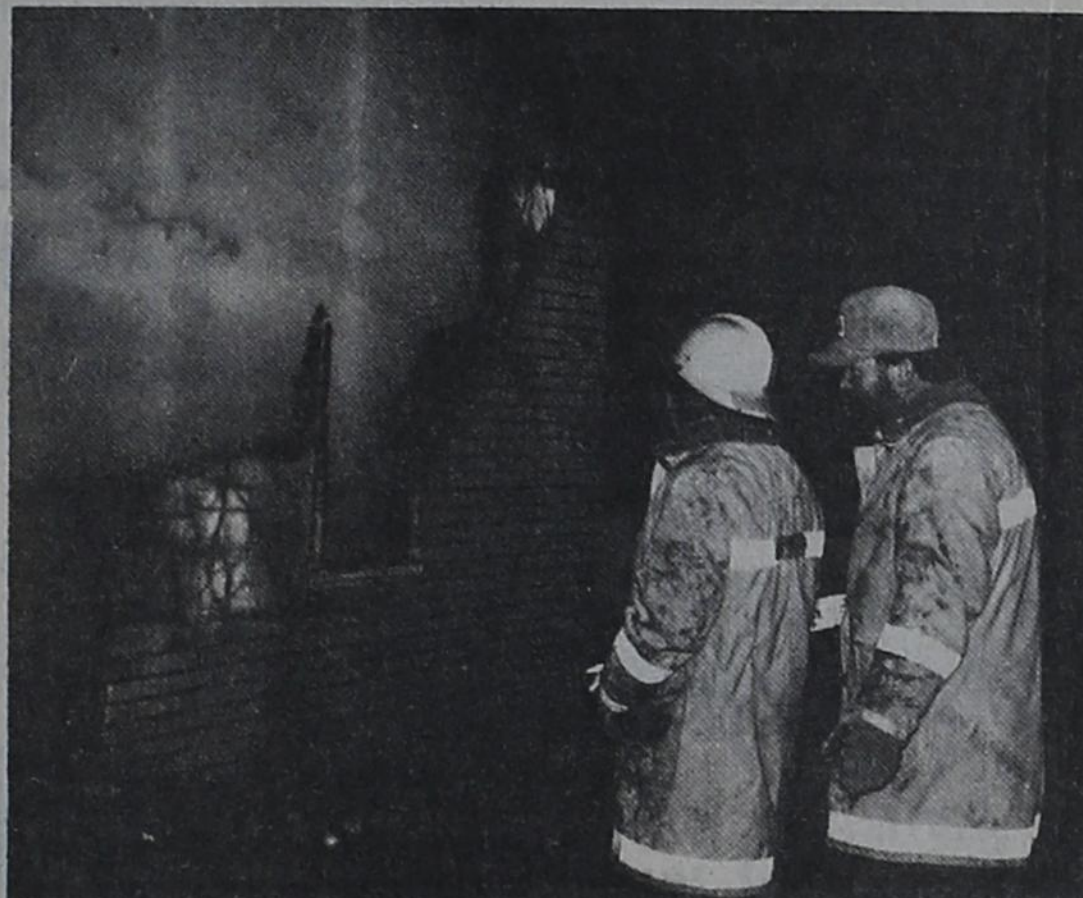
Donations will be \$5 per adult plate, and \$2.50 for children six and under. Take-out plates are \$5 per plate.

## Mustangs Rebound For Cage Victory

The Bovina Mustangs scored a 57-50 win over the Hart Longhorns Friday; their third district win and eleventh win of the season.

The win culminated the team's week, which started with a 67-46 loss against Hale Center in a home game on Tuesday.

The Mustangs had to come up with a fantastic fourth quarter at Hart for the win, coming from five points behind for the seven-point win, and doing it with a six-man squad.

Tommy Hutto was the scoring machine for the team in the Hart game. He canned three baskets in the opening quarter; Mattlock Howell and Chet Hawkins sank two apiece as the Ponies took a 16-15 lead.

The second quarter was good for Bovina, as Hutto reeled off five baskets and the Mustangs outscored their foes, 16-10, to take a 32-25 lead to the dressing room.

But Hart came back for their best quarter of the game, outscoring the Mustangs, 20-8, and taking a 45-40 lead at the end of the period.

Bovina rallied, scoring some timely free throws (by Hutto, Blake Scaff and Hawkins), to come from behind. The three players mentioned hit seven of seven from the line in the final period, and that also was all the foul shot scoring for the team in the game.

In the Hale Center game, the visiting Owls came out smoking, and stayed hot most of the game. The visitors held quarter leads of 20-8, 34-15 and 52-29 enroute to the win.

Scaff scored 17 points and Howell 15 for Bovina. Howell hit nine of 14 from the free throw line.

By splitting the two games, the Mustangs' season record, going into this Tuesday's game, was 11-14.

## Two Terms Expiring On Board

Two terms will be expiring on the Bovina I.S.D. Board of Trustees this year and the filing dates and election dates have been announced.

Steve Sherrill and Don Teague have their three year terms expiring this year and their positions as trustees are up for election.

March 6, 1985 is the last date a candidate can file for the board positions. Applications are now being accepted at the Superintendent's Office at Bovina High School from 8 a.m.-12 noon and 1-4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

March 18 through April 2 will be the days for absentee voting. Absentee voters can vote at Ridgelea Elementary School from 9 a.m.-12 noon and 1-5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

April 6 is the trustee election day and voters will cast ballots at Bovina High School from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on this day.

Les McCain is the election judge and Don Murphy will be helping with the election.

## Bovina Girl Keeps Lamb String Alive

Bovina youngsters had some good results at the 38th annual Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show last weekend in Friona.

On the first day of the show, Tracy Moore made history by exhibiting the Grand Champion Lamb in the show, a 132-pound Hampshire entry which earlier had been named champion of its breed.

It marked the third straight year for the Moore family to exhibit the county's grand champion lamb, as Terry Moore had the winner in 1983 and 1984. Miss Moore's winning lamb was sold at auction on Saturday, with Friona Industries bidding \$4 per pound for the animal.

Denver Riddle made it a clean sweep for Bovina in the lamb show when his 127-pound Suffolk was named Reserve Champion. Riddle's Suffolk champion was purchased at Saturday's auction at \$3.50 by Worley Mills.

The efforts of Miss Moore and Riddle averted a clean sweep by Friona 4-H and FFA youngsters of the top awards, as they went on to win the show's other top honors.

But Bovina was well represented in Friday's barrow show, where Mendy Rhodes had the breed champion in the "Spots" division, and participated in the Grand Champion Barrow drive. Miss Rhodes' animal was bought at auction by Sherley Grain.

A first cousin of Mendy's, young Chad Rhodes, a Friona 4-H Club member, exhibited the Grand Champion Barrow, a Hampshire.

Sharlet Johnson had the Reserve Champion Berkshire, which sold at auction to Citizens Bank of Texico for \$1.20 per pound.

Miss Rhodes also had the reserve champion of the crossbred division, and her 212-pound barrow was bought by Clayton Farm Center for \$1.80 per pound.

Miss Johnson also had a first place mediumweight crossbred barrow, and this animal was bought by Worley Mills at the auction sale for \$1.20 per pound.

Other Bovina showmen having barrows make the sale included Casey Riddle, with a second place cross; Miss Johnson, with a third place Spot; Randy Redwine, with a

fourth place Yorkshire; Todd Ware, a fourth place cross, and Chad Clayton, a fifth place Hampshire.

Besides the top two lambs, other local exhibitors whose animals made the sale included Robby Dyer, a first place fine wool; Tracy Moore, a first place lightweight Hamp; Denver Riddle, first place Suffolk; Lynda Fish, a second place fine wool cross; Casey Riddle, a second place Hamp.

Also, Terry Moore, a second place Hamp; Jarrett Turner, a second place "other breeds"; Wesley Fish, a third place fine wool cross; Tracy Moore, a third place Hamp; Terry Moore, a third place Hamp; Donnell Garner, a third place Suffolk; Mendy Rhodes, a third place Southdown; Wesley Fish, a third place "other breeds"; and JoAnna Clayton, fourth place Suffolk.

In the steer show, Zed Stewart had the breed champion for the English cross division, and participated in the finals for the show's Grand Champion, won for the second straight year by Dana Berend of Friona.

Stewart's 1,000-pound steer was bought at Saturday's Auction by Dammer Diker, at a price of \$1.50 per pound.

Best showing in the goat division was by Joanna Clayton, with a fourth place animal in the heavyweight division.

In showmanship competition, where judging classes were held this year, Miss Clayton won honors in the junior division for both the sheep and goat shows. Misti Boozer won the award in the barrow show's senior division. The top showmen, as well as exhibitors of grand champion animals, received belt buckles for their efforts.

## Fillies Drop Game To H. C. Girls

The Bovina High School Fillies were hoping to avenge their first district loss when they hosted the Hale Center Owlettes last Tuesday. Instead, they suffered their fourth district setback, 51-44.

The Owlettes, meanwhile, virtually assured themselves of a playoff spot in District 3-AA. Both Hale Center and Abernathy have 7-1 district records with two games left. The Fillies, themselves defending district champions, stand at 4-4.

Hale Center found a way to shut down high-scoring Marie Pesch just long enough to clinch the win. Marie was held scoreless in the first period, during which time the Owlettes took a 17-6 lead.

Hale Center again held the Bovina girls to a single bucket from the field, and eased to a 29-15 halftime lead. At this point, Miss Pesch had scored only five free throws in the game.

The Fillies began to solve Hale Center's press and during the fourth quarter, broke Miss Pesch loose for four baskets, and Mindy Neal for seven points. Bovina outscored the Owlettes, 19-9 during this period, but the rally came too late.

# School Corner

H.B. 72 has brought about a number of changes for public schools of Texas. One change that is very important to parents and students is exit level testing in math and English language arts. Satisfactory performance on the exit level examination is required for students to receive a high school diploma.

Beginning in October 1985, the test will be administered to eleventh grade students for the first time. Students who do not perform satisfactorily on both the math and English sections of the test will have opportunities in May 1986 and in October and May of their twelfth grade year to pass both sections of the examination.

Beginning in 1987, high school diplomas must be withheld from those students who have not demonstrated satisfactory performance by the end of their twelfth grade year. Students who have been denied diplomas and who later perform in a satisfactory manner on both sections of the test will be issued a high school diploma at that time.

The objectives of the exit level test will soon be printed and provided to each student and parent who are presently in grades eight, nine, and ten.

It is very critical that the significance of this test be understood. High school seniors of the future will not be able to graduate from high school without passing this test. If you have

questions concerning the test please feel free to contact the school.

It is very important that home and school work together to provide the necessary education for our students. This has been mandated by special legislation in this past summer's reform bill which has been dubbed H.B. 72.

We are faced with a good number of changes as a result of this reform bill, but with your cooperation and understanding we will succeed in its implementation, and hopefully a good school system made better will be the end result.

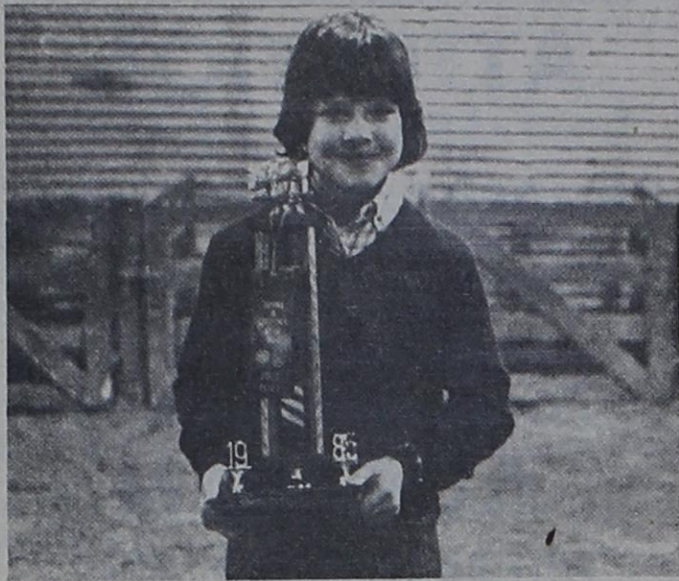
